Prices for cheese had a sharp advance in the country Saturday. The top price was paid at Belleville, where 11 5-16c, was obtained, or an advance of 9-16c on the top price paid on that board Saturday week. At Brockville the highest bid on the board was 11 1-8c., but salesmen refused to accept that figure, and the board was adjourned without any sales. Subsequently, on the curb, 11 1-8c. was accepted. On some of the boards colored brought a slight premium or white, but on other both colored and white sold at the same price. White sold on the Crysler board at 10 15-16c., but this was an exception. The general range of prices today was 11c to 11 1-4c., which is a decided rise on the ruling prices of late. While the make is reported to show a falling off in some sections, which would appear to be borne out by the recent decrease in receipts, there is little doubt that short covering 18 a good deal to do with the present.


