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## Pastoral Letter.

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS OF

THE ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

My dear brethren,

Reviewing the past year, I feel profoundly moved by its events and experiences The Lord's hand lay heavily upon us as a congregation. Many homes were saddened by the departure of loved ones from them. Not a few of those who have been taken away were of my own age, and had been long associated with me in the anxieties and labours of my pastorate. I cannot but feel keenly their loss. But I must not murmur, since it is the Lord that hath done it. Rather am I bound to give thanks to God for sparing them so long, and enabling them to take so active a part with me in christian service.


Apart from the heavy losses by death sustained by the congregation, the past year has been one in which I have had much encouragement in my work. The very sorrows of our people have helped to beget a spirit of earnestness in church circles, which has been a wonderful help to me; for every influence prevailing in the pews reacts upon the pulpit. I have been very sensible of an eager desire on the part of many of our people to come more fully under the powers of the world to come, and I have been borne up in my work by this consciousness. I count the year, therefore, as one of the most fruitful in my ministry. The closing months of 1899 will be hereafter probably cited as having witnessed a new departure in the character of the pastoral visiting of the congregation, and this has been one of the telling influences which have helped on the unusually satisfactory situation to which I have referred.

But it is to the circumstances which surround us in the new year upon which we have entered, that I wish specially to call attention. It ought to be regarded in every sense by us as "a red letter year." It is a privilege we enjoy whom God has called upon the stage of activity in the last year of the nineteenth century that we must not

lightly esteem. We are the heirs of all the past, and should be deeply grateful that our time has been cast in this best age of the world. Another fact calling for thankfulness is that we have been privileged to belong to the great Presbyterian Church of Canada, the semi-jubilee of which we hope to live to see on the 15th of June next. In the twenty-five years of its history, it has been greatly blessed and honoured of the Lord. Its membership as well as its income has nearly trebled. In 1875 we had only ten ordained missionaries labouring among the heathen,—now we have forty three. And there has been a corresponding increase in the Home fields.

#### THE CENTURY FUND.

In view of God's mercies to us as a people, the last General Assembly, after mature deliberation, deemed that there was a special call to us to attempt to signalise the close of the nineteenth century, and the inauguration of the twentieth, by raising a thank-offering of A MILLION DOLLARS. We have warrant for this special effort in the marking of time by the Hebrews at the command of God, every fifty years. Here we have two fifties to commemorate, and our endeavours should be proportionately strenuous and high-aiming. Those who have enjoyed the blessings which the closing part of the century has yielded may be expected to respond liberally to the call, "for value received." Our older people cannot leave a better inheritance to those who are to come after them than a well equipped church. The proposed application of \$400,000 to relieve the burden of debts weighing down congregations is an admirable feature of the scheme. Those charged with upholding and extending the Redeemer's Kingdom in the new century will thus be rid of a heavy handicap. And the remaining \$600,000 will furnish a most suitable apparatus for commencing the spiritual campaigns of the new age about to dawn upon the church. These are the considerations that ought to weigh with the the old. The young, on the other hand, ought to welcome and encourage the effort, since it is conceived specially in their interests. The work of the twentieth century which it is to be theirs to carry on is that which is to profit by it. Hence, the appeal is not without reason made to young and old, rich and poor. Every family and each member of the family; the children and young people, as well as those who are older are expected to contribute. The rich will give of their



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abundance; the poor as they are able,—all as stewards of the bounty of *Him who giveth to all*. Let us each one put a stone on this cairn which is to be a great monument to us who are alive and privileged to take part in Christ's cause in this year of grace 1900.

But while we endeavour to do our part in the larger undertaking, let us see to it that our efforts do not flag in the smaller sphere of our own congregation. The recent visitation of the people afforded an opportunity to the authorities of the church to confer with all our families on the subject of the congregational finances and the result has been to obtain several additions to the list of weekly offerers. But there are a great many who have not yet responded, I am informed. I trust all will see it to be their bounden duty to help in this work as God has prospered them.

Then do not forget that to be without a daily recognition of God is not good. Remember that the family is a divine institution, and that no home is happy where God is not taken into account. Remember also that public worship on the Lord's day is a divine ordinance, and see that you do not forsake the assembling of yourselves together. Parents are entreated to bring their children with them to the House of God, as well as come themselves.

Looking for a fresh baptism of the Spirit, to enable us to rise to the greatness of the occasion, and to remember that "we must work while it is day" and that "the night cometh when no man can work," I leave this appeal with you, confident that it will receive your earnest consideration.

Montreal, January 10th, 1900

The Annual Meeting of the Congregation, in terms of the Constitution and By-Laws, was held this evening, Rev. Dr. Campbell, the pastor, in the chair. Mr. Archibald McAllister was requested to act as Secretary.

On motion of Mr. William Foulis, seconded by Mr. John Loughead, it was resolved that the meeting stand adjourned until the evening of Wednesday, the 17th instant at 8 o'clock.

St. Gabriel Church,

Montreal January, 17th, 1900

The adjourned Annual Meeting of the Congregation took place this evening.

The Meeting was opened with devotional exercises by the pastor. Rev. Dr. Campbell was called to the Chair, and Mr. D. McLaren Brophy was appointed Secretary.

The minutes of the last annual meeting being printed and in the hands of the people were held as read.

Mr. D. M. Brophy, Secretary, read the report of the Board of Trustees; and Mr. A. E. Taylor submitted the financial statement of the receipts and disbursements for the year 1899. Mr. Farquhar, Secretary-Treasurer of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee, also read a statement of the transactions of that committee for the year.

Brief abstracts of the reports of the session, of the Missionary Society, the Sabbath School, the Ladies' Aid Society, the Young People's Association, the Woman's Missionary Society, the Christian Endeavour Societies, senior and junior, were also submitted.

It was thereupon moved by Mr. Darling, seconded by Mr. William Clelland, Jr., and carried:—

"That a review of the past year shows that the Lord's blessing has fallen abundantly upon all the departments of the church's life; but at the same time that the congregation suffered heavy losses by death, and we who survive feel that these considerations call on us to redouble our zeal and activity in the cause of our Master, as represented in the work carried on in the St. Gabriel Church."

It was moved by Mr. A. E. Taylor, seconded by Mr. C. Byrd, and carried:—

"That the reports and financial statements as now read be received and adopted, and that the same shall be printed and distributed among the members and adherents of the congregation."

Moved by Mr W. J. Mundell, seconded by Mr. T. McRobie, and carried:—

"That this meeting has pleasure in knowing that the Ladies' Aid Society devote much time and thought to the laudable work of providing seasonable aid and comfort to those in adversity and visiting the sick. Therefore a cordial vote of thanks is now accorded to the ladies for their disinterested attention to these Christian duties during the past year."

Moved by Mr. John MacTavish, seconded by Mr. D. McLaren Brophy, and carried:—

"That as the assistance of the Choir in leading the praise service of the congregation is of great value and involves much training and sacrifice on the part of the members, this meeting desires to express its approbation and thanks to Mr. J. R. Bain and all the members of the Choir for their services during the past year,"

It was moved by Mr. Farquhar, seconded by Mr. Bickerstaff, and carried:—

"That as the Sabbath School is a very important part of the church's work, imparting instruction to the children and inducing the young people to walk in the Master's steps and value the privilege of religion, this meeting would encourage the Superintendent and teachers by a hearty vote of thanks for their valuable services during the past year; and the Board of Trustees are hereby requested to provide for the usual financial expenses of the Sabbath School."

Moved by Mr. T. Sonne, seconded by Mr. C. Byrd, and carried:-

"That this meeting records its appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the Treasurer and the Secretary, and now tenders a cordial vote of thanks to the Treasurer, Mr A. E. Taylor, and the Secretary, Mr. D. McL. Brophy, for the efficient fulfillment of their respective duties during the year 1899."

Moved by Mr. Geo. F. Barker, seconded by Mr. R. S. Weir, and carried:—

"That in accordance with Article III. of the By-Laws, this meeting does now elect Messers. Charles Byrd, A. E. Taylor, W. Clelland, Jr., and Jas. Harper to be members of the Board of Trustees of this church to fill the vacancies occurring by rotation at this time, and also elects Mr. W. Foulis to fill the vacancy created by the death of the late William Arnott."

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Harper ccurring created Moved by Mr. J. Loughead, seconded by Mr. J. C. Bennett, and carried:—

"That this meeting approves of the management of the Purchase and Interest Fund Committee, and in view of the special calls of the Century Fund anew commemds the Purchase and Interest Fund to the liberal support of all desirous of aiding in liquidating the obligations resting on our church edifice; and reappoints the Committee for the present year, with power to add to their number."

Moved by Mr. G. D. Weightman, seconded by Mr. R. S. Weir, and carried:—

"That Mr. Alex. C. Abernethy and Mr. Geo. F. Barker be re-appointed Auditors for the present year."

Moved by Mr. A. E. Taylor, and seconded, that Dr. Campbell vacate the Chair and Mr. Byrd occupy it.

It was then moved by Mr. W. Clelland, Jr., seconded by Mr. John MacTavish, and carried:—

"That a vote of thanks be tendered to Dr. Campbell for the efficient manner in which he had discharged the duties of Chairman of this meeting."

The Long Metre Doxology was then sung, and the meeting was closed with the Benediction, after which those present were served with refreshments provided by the Ladies' Committee, and an hour was spent in social converse.

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ST. GABRIEL CHURCH.

For the year ending December 31st, 1899.

The Board of Trustees of St. Gabriel Church wish again to place before the congregation the annual report on the financial and temporal affairs of the church for the past year.

We deeply regret having to report that death has this year also visited our Board and stricken down two of our most able and highly esteemed co-workers, Mr. William Arnott and Assistant-Chief John Beckingham, whose loss has been greatly felt by the Board.

We invite the attention of the congregation to the statement which will be presented in detail by the Treasurer of the church and also that of the Purchase and Interest Fund accounts.

As you are probably aware, at the beginning of the year there was a deficit of \$430.00 which added to the ordinary expenses made an amount of about \$700.00 above the ordinary revenue.

The Board was greatly gratified on making a special appeal to the members to be able to report that this large deficit has been made up, so that the coming year will be started with a clean sheet. In this connection we would ask that the contributions to the funds be increased, and feel confident that, if it is made a matter of conscience by every one, a sufficient number of new subscribers can be obtained to place the finances on a sound basis. Every member of the church is expected to assist in this matter, as it is the intention of the Board not to ask for any special donations at the end of the coming year.

The contributions this year in the way of weekly offerings have been regularly kept up, and we are pleased to report an increase of \$222.47 but regret a decrease of \$8.91 in the open plate collections.

The Trustees have given their best attention to the church building and property and are pleased to be able to report that everything is in first-class order and condition.
