#### Abstract

London, Aug. 3--Sir Edward Grey in the House of Commons this afternoon announced that orders for the mobilization of the army as well as the navy have been Issued. "At last," he said, "the suspense is at an end. "We believe every Briton with any sort of manhood in him, will hear the news with relief. "Since Germany will have it, she shall have it in full measure. "No nation ever went into war with better heart or clearer conscience than Great Britian does now."


Brussels, Aug. 3-Belgium today cast her lot with France, against Germany. The government received from Berlin the proffer of an understanding provided Belgium would facilitate movement of German troops.
An answer was requested by 7 a. m.; the cabinet met in special session immediately upon receipt of Germany's proposal. The ministry refused to accept it.
