





KING'S COLLEGE REPORT

The Church of England Synod conclud d its business last evening.

In the afternoon the question of a mis-In the afternoon the question of a missionary chaplain for the deanery of St. John was brought before the members. The synod admitted the need of such an official, and adopted the recommendation that steps in that direction be taken. His Lordship pointed out that the growth of St. John required some preparation in advance and he recommended that instead of waiting until the time be ripe they should be prepared before hand, and even now it might not be inadvisable to secure a lot at Courtenay Bay, where the ministrations would undoubtedly be needed within the next five years.

The King's College report evoked warm praise of that institution and the report showed the progress that had been made in recent years. The synod called for more hearty co-operation on the port of the clergy and laity in support of the work of the college.
