## A PAIR OF BOOTS

Just after the war broke out a Canadian bootmaking firm got an order from the Canadian Government to make 40,000 palrs of boots for the army. The manager of the company, making a speeeh to the employees, gave some good advice to show what every worker might do to make sure that every boot that went on a Canadian soldier's foot in Europe was as good as any other part of his equipment. He showed that a poorly filled sole, a rotten counter in the heel, a badly-sewn seam, or a defective arch might spoil a soldier's effic-
iency in the field. In view of the fact that the war is teaching iency in the fieldi. In view of the fact that the war is teaching us all to be soldiers one way or another, suppose we apply a little of this bootmaking philosophy to the boots we wear
in everyday life. A man is known by the boots he wears. Looking over the honor roll of your boots past and present-probabiy made in Canada-
