When Mr. Gladstone's bill was introduced, the Irish members pointed out several defects in it and sought to have them removed. For this they were denounced as obstructionists. The House of Lords made changes in the bill calculated to diminish its usefulness very greatly. The experience of the country in carrying the measure into effect proves that the objections taken to it by Mr. Parnell and his friends were but too well founded and have exposed defects which escaped discovery while the bill was under consideration.
