NEWS CONDENSED.

Canada. Hanson & Wormald's woollen mills at Dewsbury, Eng., were burned Tuesday, loss \$200,000.

Fire destroyed the business portion of Newburgh, Ont., yesterday. Thirty families were rendered homeless.

The railway commission, consisting of Sir Alex. Galt, Messrs. Schreiber, Burpee and Mahony, met at Ottawa Tuesday.

The Governor General formerly opened the combined Dominion and industrial exhibition at Toronto, yesterday.

Resolutions favoring commercial union were unanimously passed by a meeting at Orono, Ont., which Wynnan addressed.

A special cablegram to the Toronto Mail says the Imperial government will, without doubt, insist upon both the Atlantic and Pacific disputes being referred to the fishery commission.

The New Brunswick detachment of artillery accompanied by the Yarmouth and Digby detachments left the Quebec citadel yesterday and went into camp at the island of Orleans. Three English, and two French men-of-war are in Quebec harbor.
