RECIPROcity SINCE 1865.

Sir John's efforts to negotiate.

In view of the fact that Sir John Macdonald's efforts to negotiate reciprocity with the United States, the following statement will be interesting, as showing that Sir John's efforts were not without success.

The first offer was made in 1865 by Sir John Macdonald, then Premier of the Province. During the two consecutive sessions of the Canadian Ministers of the Crown, Mr. Macdonald and the Hon. George Brown were engaged in negotiations with the United States, and it is recorded that Sir John's Government had the weight of their influence, and Sir John's representative in Washington was successful in securing as well to prevent its termination as subsequently to effect its renewal.

The British Lord John Russell, expressed his desire to Mr. Adams, the American minister in London, that the treaty should be renewed "as it has been generally approved upon," but Mr. Adams replied that he was not authorized to be so general in his subject, and the offer fell through on the 10th of February, 1869; Annual Report, 1869.

1869-Still desirous of renewing reciprocity, the Canadian Government, in 1869, sent four delegates, Messrs. Howland, Galt, Henry and Smith to Washington, and they laid before the various committees of the House of Representatives a new offer for an extension of the treaty. Mr. Howland, the chairman of the committee, though opposed to reciprocity, professed to treat with the delegates, and suggested a basis for negotiations. The terms which involved the increase of Canadian excise duties and restricted free trade in both natural products and manufactures, did not differ materially from the present grant of duty on commercial goods, and the offer of course failed to accept such a plan. They saw it was futile to hope for a fair arrangement, and the American proposition had been created in the country, and the Globe declaring that the scheme was of a such character, that no Government would approve it to parliament (Canadian Sessional Papers, No. 101, 1865).

1869-In 1869 the third offer was made, the rights treaty having been meanwhile renewed. In 1869, the Hon. Sir John Macdonald, then Premier of the Province, introduced a bill into the Canadian Parliament to amend the schedule of natural products, such as animals, metals, fish, furs, poultry, bees, honey, wax, tallow, timber, lumber, etc., at the same time proposing, in substance, that "any or all of the articles mentioned in the schedule of the United States, may be imported into Canada free of duty, or a duty not exceeding the rate of duty then provided in the said schedule upon production of the invoice in conformity with the United States regulations, and for the importation of similar articles from Canada into that country free of duty or at a lower rate of duty than is now provided." (Statutes of Canada, 1869, page 106.)

1869-In 1869 two members of the Government, Messrs. Cartier and Macdonald, were in England, and one more urged the British Government to try and obtain reciprocity for Canada, and Sir Edward Thornton, by instruction, brought the subject before the Washington Conference. The American agents proposed to the Canadian Finance Minister, was sent to Washington in July of that year. To move his representative to Canada, the American commissioners decided to assent to a renewal of the former treaty, and positively objected to negotiate on a different basis. (Canada Sessional Papers, No. 18, 1872.)

1873-In this year what amounted practically to another offer was made. The attention of the Canadian Government was called to resolutions introduced in the United States National Board of Trade and the Dominion Board of Trade. The American organization suggested the appointment of a commission by Congress to frame a treaty, and the report of the Canadian Cabinet was to effect that the subject would be considered in accordance with the previous policy of Canada whenever the United States accepted the Board of Trade's request. Needless to say, the offer was never carried out. (Canada Sessional Papers, No. 40, 1873.)

1874-The Mackenzie Government sent Hon. George Brown to Washington to negotiate a treaty, and after many efforts the private correspondence of Mr. Brown throws light upon the trouble he took to even get that length in his task, for he was met with attendance upon the Washington authorities, expending their expense and evasions and finally forcing them either to accept or reject some definite scheme. When the difficulties at the state department had overcome there was the Senate to deal with, and this body finally refused to ratify the treaty, which had included natural products and certain lines of manufactures, the latter, however, being added on the distinct understanding that the same products from Britain would also be admitted free into Canada. In fact, no distribution was intended. (Canada Sessional Papers, No. 51, 1875.)

1878-In adopting the National Policy the Canadian Government placed on the statute book a standing offer for reciprocity to natural products whenever the United States declared for a similar reciprocity. This offer was never wholly taken up by the Americans, consequently nothing came of it. (49 Vict., chap. 53.)

1888-When the fisheries dispute was under discussion at Washington, Sir Charles Tupper desired to settle in on the basis of a reciprocal trade arrangement "providing for greater freedom of commerce between the United States and Canada and Newfoundland." But the American plenipotentiaries refused to accept such a "suitable basis of negotiation." Nay, more, they declined even to "talk free" the Dominion authorities, and the offer was never carried out. (Canada Sessional Papers, No. 30, 1888.)

1891-This is the offer last made by Sir John Macdonald, which, like the preceding ones, designs to secure a mutually advantageous arrangement compatible with the honor and independence of this country. No other sort will ever be maintained by a Conservative Government. No other was favored by the Liberal Ministry in 1874. No true Liberal favors a different kind now-only the grit leaders and the trump of a great party.

OUR PROSPECTS.

(From last week's edition)

The Patriot, in common with the Opposition press and speakers in general, would wish its readers to believe that it is, just now, ended with prophetic powers, and dashes up for the public the most ridiculous statements relative to the Grit prospects in the elections. This is nothing new. Invariably on the eve of a general election, the spirit of prophecy would appear to brood over the Grit camp; but it only takes a few days to prove that it is a spirit of false prophecy. Our Opposition friends would find it much safer to prophesy after the event.

As our readers can readily see from the information contained in our news columns, the prospects of the Liberal-Conservative Party all over the Dominion, were never brighter than they are at present. It must not be forgotten that between 1867 and 1891 the Government won forty-three bye-elections and the Opposition won only two. On the other hand during the time Mr. McKenzie was in power, of the twenty-five bye-elections held, the Government won only two, the Conservatives winning the other twenty-three.

From all parts of the Dominion the indications point to large Liberal-Conservative gains. Wherever Sir John Macdonald makes his appearance in the great Province of Ontario he is received with unbounded enthusiasm, and in every constituency in that Province the Government candidates are meeting with greater success than ever before.

In Quebec the three ministers of the Crown, Langens, Chaplain and Caron, have their organizations perfected, and the prospects of a big majority for the Province never looked so bright. Some idea of the desperation to which the Grits are reduced in this Province may be had from the fact that a number of their wayward Sir Hector Langens, while travelling in his sleigh on the ice, and laid violent hands on him, and had it not been for timely assistance he would surely have been seriously injured. Such arguments as these are not likely to have much weight with intelligent electors.

So strong are the Liberal Conservatives in British Columbia, that no Grit need seek election there. The Pacific Provinces will send a solid six to support Sir John Macdonald and the Territories are as Conservative as ever, and may be depended upon to do so as usual. Nova Scotia has made considerable gains since 1867, and may be expected to elect a greater number than ever before. In New Brunswick several prominent supporters of Mr. Blair and two or three members of his Government have turned Conservative, and have taken the field in support of the Conservative Candidates.

So far as this Province is concerned, everything looks splendid for the Government Candidate, and there is now very little doubt that on the 5th of March it will reverse its action of 1867, and send to Parliament supporters of Sir John Macdonald. The reports from the three counties indicate large Conservative gains. Messrs. Ferguson and Blake are cutting into the Grits in such a way as to cause their opponents no little uneasiness. Messrs. Howland and Hunt have thrown consternation into the Grit camp in Prince County. In King's County Messrs. McDonald and McLean are everywhere meeting with splendid successes. Defections from the Grits are numerous; and there is now no doubt that King's will, on the 5th of March, prove itself the banner county in Dominion as well as Local politics.

Elsewhere in this issue we publish the names of a number of prominent men, as well as journal, hitherto Grit, who are now supporters of Sir John Macdonald. This list is daily increasing, which plainly shows the trend of the public mind throughout Canada, regarding the issues in the present contest.
