The Clearing House System.

Under the old system of banking each bank was managed as an institution antagonistic to every other. In all large cities in which four or five banks existed, each kept a special messenger or runner, whose daily business it was to sort out each morning the checks and claims which in the course of business during the preceding day had come into its possession against the other banks in the city, and to present them to the bank against which they were drawn. To do this sometimes took all day.
