WHAT A FANTASY! HALL-MARKET PORTER HAS SAID ABOUT THEM.

A story is told of an Irishman who while strolling through the Fenian Hall market, saw two live ones on exhibition in a poultry dealer's stall.

"What'll you take for your cross-eyed turkeys?" he inquired of the dealer, who, while smiling, said that he had a pair of 'em.

"I don't care how cross-eyed they are," said the Irishman, "I'll take the pair of 'em."

"Turkeys—not the cross-eyed variety—are already beginning to make their appearance in the market. They are mostly young ones, though a few old ones, killed last January and frozen, are sold at a slight cheaper rate.

"The best brown eggs are 35 cents a dozen," said the poultry man, who had light colored eggs, equally fresh at 27 cents.

"Let me have the brown ones," replied the customer. "I don't mind paying the difference if you're sure they're fresh. My wife has been buying eggs at the corner grocery, where they sold her three bad eggs in one good one."

"I'll guarantee these fresh," said the dealer. "They come from the South shore, and were laid in the week ago. Shall I put you up a complete dozen?"

"I guess so," replied the old gentleman and laying down 70 cents upon the counter, he walked away with his prize.

"Why do the dark eggs cost more than the light ones?" queried the reporter. "Because they're better," said the poultry man. "They have a richer flavor, and always command a higher price, the white just in thicker and the cook says that light eggs will go for about half the price of fresh ones."

"Where do the eggs we get in Boston come from?" "The fancy eggs that bring the highest price come chiefly from Cape Cod and the South shore. Some are sent in from New Hampshire and Vermont. Those which come from other parts of the country—Maine, Illinois, Michigan, Iowa, New York and Nova Scotia—are called 'stock' eggs, and only sell for about half the price of fresh ones."

The best eggs are all carefully examined by the wholesale dealers through whose hands they pass, and all doubtful ones are thrown out. It is a safe rule to buy in a dark room, with the aid of a candle or lamp. A practical hand can examine more than three dozen a minute in this way without difficulty.

Each egg is held for an instant between the eye and the light. If it does not appear clearly illuminated in every part and perfectly translucent, it is not fresh and it is thrown aside. A really bad egg is opaque as a piece of rock.

The state ones are sold to Hebrews of the lower class, who rather like taste eggs than otherwise.

"Do the poultry farmers make much use of incubators?" "Yes, indeed! The incubators are particularly profitable for the raising of early broilers for the market. The first week in April chickens are very young, and broilers fetch as high as 50 cents a pound in the market."

FRUIT COOKIES.—Two cups of sugar one cup of butter, two cups of chopped raisins, two eggs, two tablespoons of milk, two tablespoons of cinnamon, one teaspoonful of nutmeg, cloves and soda. Bake same as other cookies.

GRAPES.—Boll your grapes and put through the colander, and then through a sieve, to get out all the seeds and grape skins. To four quarts of the juice take one half pint of vinegar, a little more if you think it not tart enough, about an ounce each of cloves, cinnamon and allspice, and sugar to taste.

APPLE CAKE.—Make a custard of four beaten eggs, three pints of milk, one cup of sugar and a little salt. Into this stir one pint of stewed, sweetened and strained apples, and bake in an hour in a quick oven. Or, take five eggs, keeping out the whites of two, with which frost the top and brown in the oven. No yeast required.

BEAN PASTRY.—Best fritters are nice for breakfast; chop pieces of steak or cold roast beef very fine. Make a batter of milk, four and an egg, and mix the meat with it. Put a lump of butter into a saucepan, let it melt, then drop the batter into it from a large spoon. Fry until brown; season with pepper and salt and a little parsley.

PRUNE PUDDING.—A delicious prune pudding is made by stewing a pound of prunes till they are soft, remove the stones and sugar to your taste, and add three eggs beaten to a stiff froth. Make a puff paste for the bottom of pudding dish. After beating the eggs and prunes together till they are thoroughly mixed, spread them on the crust. Bake for half an hour or until you are sure the crust is done.

APPLE PIE.—May be made very delicious by taking the parings and cores and placing them over the fire, with sufficient water to cover them, and add a little cinnamon and nutmeg, and letting them stew until very soft. When taken from the fire let the syrup drain from them, and stir in a half glass of rum. Have a deep dish lined with a nice paste, and plenty of tart apples, with a liberal allowance of sugar and grated lemon peel, then pour over the syrup, cover with an upper paste, and bake slowly.

LARD PIE.—Cover two large pie plates with rich paste, making small holes with a large fork over the paste to hinder its blistering and bake. Prepare two loaves by taking the pulp from one loaf, and add a spoonful of essence of lemon, over the top, turning it to the oven to brown.

FOR CAULIFLOWERS.—It is well to have a netted or crocheted bag to put the plants in when boiling. Parboil in milk and water salted. Take one ounce of fresh butter, one ounce of sifted flour and one pint of cream. Melt the butter, stirring in the flour, and add the milk, with a seasoning of salt and pepper. When the sauce thickens add three or four ounces of grated parmesan cheese. Fry the cauliflower in a towel and place in a baking dish, pour over the sauce, putting in a little more cheese. Bake until brown.

PLAIN CHEESE SAUSAGE CAKES.—When children have a long distance to school and cannot come home to dinner these cakes are very satisfying and far better than any other food. Make the dough as follows: Take half a pound of butter, half a pound of lard, one pound of well-picked, clean currants, three-fourths pound of sugar, and if you can afford some sardine peel finely sliced and some capelin on your dough; pour over the whole a breakfast cup of boiling water, then mix with the paste and knead until the whole is well incorporated; if you have not sufficient water add more as it must not be stiff or it will turn out heavy; then divide it; stand each in separate baking tin; put before the fire to rise; when that is done, sufficiently bake with good brick oven as for bread two hours, or drive into iron school cakes, by greasing small tins or saucers and bake from twenty to thirty minutes. Send cake made as above but without currants in very good.

TARON CRACK.—2 tablespoons tapioca dissolved very soft, 3 yolks of egg beaten and sweetened to the taste; boil 1 quart milk, when cool stir in the tapioca and flour, beat the whites very light and mix all together, set both ten minutes, pour into moulds.

The test of a good cook is not in the cake she can make, nor the sauce she can concoct, nor the rich pudding she can produce, but in the neatness of her boiled potatoes, her mutton chops, her roasted joint. Such things require personal care and judgment, and are the basis of a good meal.
