ful of any patronage from an elder sister. Perhaps Columbia, on the other hand, is just a little jealous, if not apprehensive, of the blooming charms of the little sister suddenly come to womanhood.

Curiously enough in the house of commons it is generally the undesirable things done by the United States which are held up as worthy of imitation under the guise of enlightened self-interest or "retaliation."

For years the United States, while secretly admitting, continually pointed at the United Kingdom. The British people put up with petulance that often approached impertinence. The result is evidenced by the different and better feeling now everywhere prevailing in the United States towards Great Britain.

Just now there is undoubtedly in the press and among many people of Canada a sense of irritation towards the United States, all the more regrettable because not phrased into any formal indictment. Between individuals, it often happens that this sort of coldness or aversion springs up and it may grow by what it feeds on unless one man frankly goes to the other and says:

"Look here, old man, you and I are drifting apart. What are we angry about? Let's sit down and talk it over."

It might be interesting for some newspaper in Canada to invite contributions from the people upon the subject: "Do we dislike the United States and why?"

A big world's fair in Toronto to appropriately celebrate the centennial of peace between the United States and the United Kingdom, in which Canada is so deeply and immediately interested, might impress our big sister with the fact that Canada is no longer a mere child in short dresses.

Now that the government has put its hand to the plow, there must be no turning back. The enquiry must be full and free. Every suggested line of undue influence must be followed up to the last knot. Without fear and without favor, the whole truth must be brought out, and if there are wrongdoers they must be named and punished.

Something desperate has to be done soon about these lines you have written about, because trust capitalists and watered stock jobbers begin now to see and see well that public opinion and public rights are beginning to assert themselves, and I am certain that by day and by night, at present, they are working and scheming to strengthen their position.

I would offer as an idea that you call a public meeting and have, say, for the first hour and a half, speakers who are not at present known much to the general public. This will take away the idea from your opponents and enemies (and you have many) that you are working in the interests of a certain political party.
