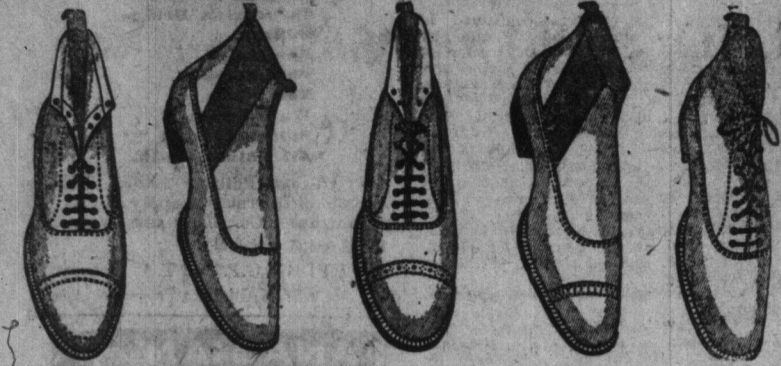

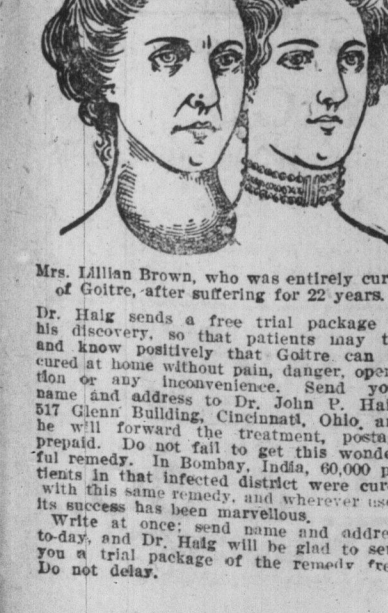
How John G. Woolley at Massey Hall

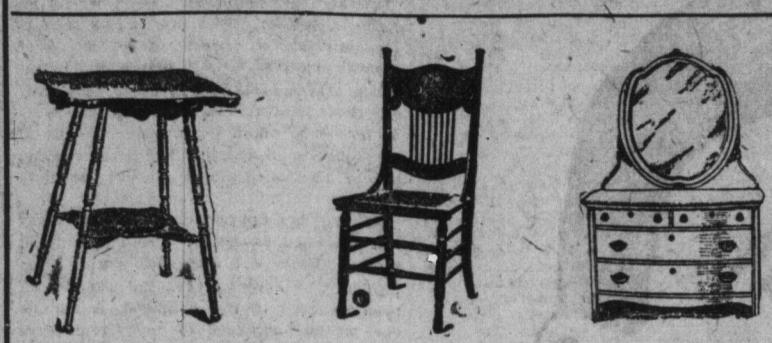

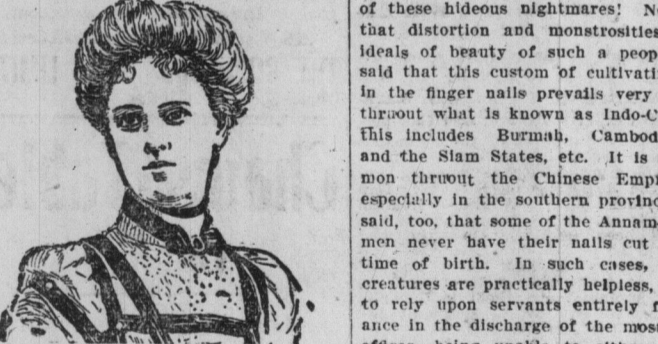
