THE RATE OF PAY．For Private $\$ 1$ per day，alo 10 cents field pay for seven days a week，equal to $\$ 33$ per month and found；for Corporal $\$ 1.10$ per day，also 10 cents field pay；for Sergeant $\$ 1.35$ per day，also 10 cents per day；and addi－ tional pay for special employment as cooks，etc．
A SEPARATION ALLOWANCE．w20 per monh the wife of every soldier or to his widowed mother if he is her sole support．
ASSIGNED PAY．Every oddere whose wile ot mother receives the separation allowance must assign one－half his pay which will be paid direct to his wife or mother．More than one－half may be assigned．
PENSIONS．If rendered＂totally incapable，＂$\$ 264$ a year；；if＂incap－ year；if＂in a small deeme， will be increased to $\$ 336, \$ 252, \$ 168, \$ 100$ respectively．To widows of privates $\$ 22$ per month and $\$ 5$ per month for each child．To widows of ser－ geants $\$ 28$ per month and $\$ 5$ per month for each child．Widowed mothers whose son was sole support，on same basis．For orphans the rate may be doubled．
