Ottawa, July 17.-Canada is to have a general election. There will be no extension of parliament; and union government will be defeated. These three probabilities stand out like mountain peaks in a pariamentary day in which
statesmanship, patriotism, impassioned oratory, intrigue and political chicanery, marched in rapid procession through an poitical chicanery, marcuse.

The government. Graham had been one of the compulsory ser vice Liberals who were already in actual negotiations with the ministry in an effort to form a union government. And here, without warning, he was moving an amendment ex pressing lack of confidence in and practically calling for par-
liamentary censure upon the government with which he was hegotiating.
