Costigan regretted that Anglin should have so far forgotten himself as to make such outrageous statements. Anglin had enumerated him as one of the libeled men from New Brunswicd. He had worked with Anglin in parties, and would challenge that gentleman to name any instance where he had acted as a perjurer or a criminal. [Cheering.] Smith, of Westmoreland, was also enumerated among the 107 bribed men. He (Costigan) referred to the act of Anglin's sitting in the New Brunswick Government with Mr. Smith, and never having found him to be a dishonest man. Smith had been offered a Judgeship but refused. It did not come well from his old colleague to charge him with being a perjured man or a criminal in a dock. He (Costigan) would take an independent course on questions affecting the interests of his constituents, but when he considered it his duty to vote with the Government he did not want to be charged with being a perjurer or criminal. (Great cheering.)


