History of St. Paul's Parish

.....

THE HISTORY of St. Paul's Parish, Toronto, for the first half of the present century comprises the struggles of the early Catholic settlers of Toronto. St. Paul's was the only organized parish in Toronto before the dedication of St. Michael's Cathedral, Sept. 20th, 1848. Owing to the missionary nature of the Church in Upper Canada in the first and second decade of the century it is difficult to find definite records of the priests, who from time to time on their missionary tours visited the settlers of York and afforded them the ministrations of our holy religion. With the appointment of Alexander McDonell to the newly erected bishopric of Kingston in 1819 a permanent pastor was stationed in York (Toronto). Through the efforts of Mgr. McDonell the Church had acquired a block of land from the Parliament of Upper Canada in 1805, and on it St. Paul's Church was built in 1826. The pastor at that time was Rev. James Crowley; he was the first resident priest of St. Paul's Parish that we can find any record of. He labored successfully among the pioneers of Catholicity in Toronto for about ten years. Not much information as to the architect, contractors or benefactors in the erection of the old Church can be obtained. It was an imposing edifice for those early days, and a most solid and substantial building. It stands to-day after the lapse of 73 years without crack or flaw, and is now used as a parochial hall. It is described in the books of travel written by Englishmen who visited York about the time of its erection. Dr. Scadding gives an amusing sketch of the old Church in which he says that "the material of the north and south

walls was worked into a kind of tessellated pattern, which was considered something very extraordinary. The spire was originally surmounted by the bird that admonished St. Peter and not by a cross. It was not a flat, moveable weathercock, but a fixed, solid figure covered with tin." Bishop McDonell visited St. Paul's in 1827, and about that time he was appointed a member of the Legislative Council of Upper Canada, took up his residence on the south-east corner of Jarvis and Duchess streets. During the Bishop's stay in Toronto, he officiated in St. Paul's Church.

About the beginning of the year 1829 Father Crowley was removed to Peterborough, where there was a large settlement of Irish Catholics, and Father O'Grady was appointed pastor of St. Paul's and made Vicar-General. Father O'Grady was a man of great activity and energy; he set about liquidating the debt of the Church, and on March 1st, 1829, he raised a subscription of £55 8s. 6d. Father O'Grady estranged himself from the Bishop by his undue meddling in politics, and was removed in 1832. He was succeeded in the following year by Rev. W. P. McDonogh, a priest of the Diocese of Tuam, Ireland. He paid a visit to this country at the instance of his Bishop, Most Rev. Dr. O'Kelly, to report upon the condition of the Irish settlers. He was prevailed upon by Mgr. McDonell to remain in Canada. He had for his assistant at St. Paul's the Rev. Murth Lawlor, who was afterwards transferred to Picton in 1838.

Toronto was erected into a diocese Dec. 17th, 1841. The Rev. Michael Power, Vicar-General of Montreal, was appointed its first Bishop on the same date. He was consecrated May 8th, 1842, in the Parish Church at Laprairie, P. Q., and arrived in Toronto on the 26th of June, accompanied by Bishop Goulin, of Kingston, who installed him as Bishop of the Diocese in St. Paul's Church, which became his Cathedral.

The installation sermon was preached by Father Wilson, a Dominican priest from Zanesville, Ohio. The Bishop immediately set about the proper organization of the Diocese, and in October, 1842, held the first synod of Toronto in St. Paul's Church. The synod was preceded by a five days' retreat preached by Rev. Peter Chazelle, S.J., Kentucky, U.S. Sixteen priests assisted at the retreat. The Diocese of Toronto at that time comprised Hamilton, London, and the greater portion of the Diocese of Peterborough. During the synod the Bishop consecrated the Diocese to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On November 22nd, 1842, the Stations of the Cross for the first time were erected in St. Paul's Church. In 1844 Father McDonogh was removed from St. Paul's to St. Catharines, Welland County. He was succeeded by Rev. T. T. Kirwin, who had for his assistants Rev. J. J. Hay and T. D. Ryan. Owing to the growth of the Catholic population and the need of more Church accommodation Bishop Power purchased the property upon which St. Michael's Cathedral, Palace, and Loretto Convent now stand, in 1845, at the cost of £1,800. A weekly collection was taken up at St. Paul's for some years as a nucleus of a building fund for the erection of the new Cathedral. To this fund the good people of St. Paul's contributed generously. The excavation for the new cathedral was begun April 7th, 1845, and though the work was prosecuted with untiring energy the Bishop did not live to see its completion. He died a martyr to duty, from an attack of typhus fever contracted from attending the stricken immigrants, October 1st, 1847. On the 5th his sad and lonely requiem was sung in St. Paul's Church, and his remains conveyed mid the tears and sorrow of a heart broken clergy and people, to their last resting place beneath the new cathedral, which was not then roofed in. During the interregnum desolation and disease made havoc among the little flock of Catholics in Toronto. The cemetery in the rear of the old church of St. Paul was thickly planted by those who had fallen from typhus and cholera.

Father Kirwin, wasted by work and sorrow was forced to abandon his charge in 1849. He was succeeded by Father Harkin, who discharged the duties of pastor for a couple of years. The next incumbent of St. Paul's was Rev. Thos Fitzhenry. He administered the affairs of the parish for a period of eight years. His first entry in the Baptismal Register is dated May 31st, 1852. The incidents of his pastorate and kindly qualities of character are well remembered by the old people of St. Paul's. They were much attached to him and deeply regretted his loss. They resented his removal in a strong manner and his immediate successor, the Rev. Father Walsh, late Archbishop of Toronto, remained only a few months in charge of St. Paul's. Rev. Father Rooney, late Vicar General of the Archdiocese succeeded Father Walsh, and after a time reached the hearts of the people and ruled successfully over them for a period of 11 years. He was appointed to St. Mary's in 1870. Rev. Father Conway, the present parish priest of Norwood, Ont, took charge after Father Rooney, and continued at intervals in control of affairs until the appointment of His Lordship, Dr. O'Mahony, Bishop of Endocia, and Auxiliary of the Archbishop of Toronto, in 1880. Bishop O'Mahony was a most zealous and vigorous pastor. He made a thorough organization of the parish and stirred up by his visitations and eloquence, the indifferent and dormant members of the flock. The old building was entirely inadequate to the needs of the vast concourse of people that flocked to hear the burning eloquence and pious exhortations of Mgr. O'Mahony. It was therefore a necessity to enlarge the old building or erect a new one and Bishop O'Mahony wisely decided on the latter course. In 1887 the excavating for the foundations of the new church was begun. The corner stone was laid on October the 9th of the same year by His Eminence Cardinal Taschereau, assisted by His Grace Archbishop Lynch, their Lordships Bishops Walsh and O'Mahony and the Papal Ablegate Mgr. O'Bryan. On

December 22nd, 1889, the new temple was solemnly dedicated to the worship of God by His Grace Archbishop Cleary, the life-long friend of Bishop O'Mahony. The labor and worry entailed upon the bishop in erecting the costly edifice shattered his health. He fought bravely against the disease which was gradually, but surely, destroying his magnificent constitution. After a most painful illness lasting over two years, the good bishop succumbed to death, Sept. 8th. 1892. His remains were laid to rest at the south west corner of the noble building which his indomitable energy, in the face of great difficulties, erected. A becoming memorial tablet is erected to his memory on the south west end of St. Paul's Church.

The present pastor, Rev. J. L. Hand, was appointed to the charge of St. Paul's parish October 14th, 1892. Since that time the matters of interest to the congregation are fresh in the memory of all.

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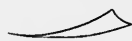

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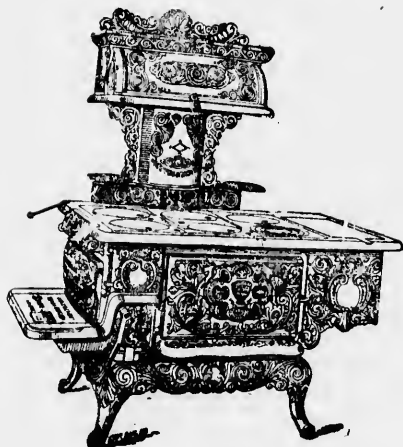
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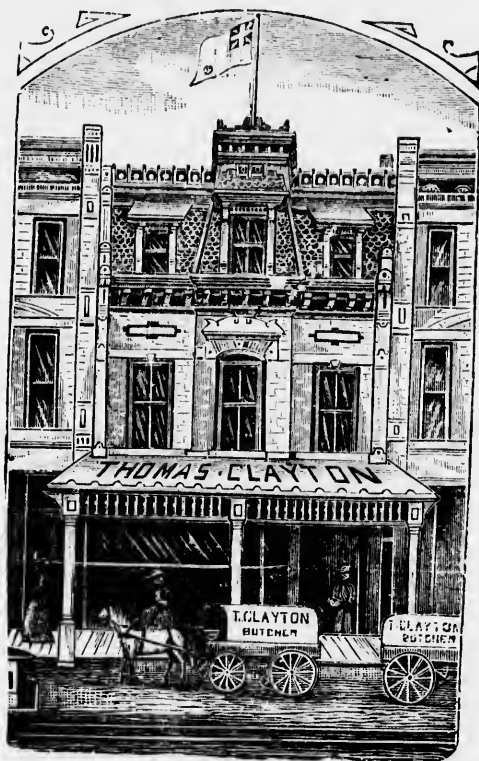
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
