REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

1. In this, the Fourth Annual Report of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, it will be observed that the number of Affiliated Associations for the year were six, against twelve in 1870.

2. The Government again aided the Dominion and Provincial Associations with liberal grants as shewn below :

To the Dominion Association.....	\$4,000
“ Ontario Provincial Association....	1,800
“ Quebec do.	1,700

and the usual grants in aid of County and other Rifle Associations, for the year ending 30th June 1871, in the above Provinces, were granted through the Militia Department.

3. As will be seen by the Report of the Secretary, the Fourth Annual Prize Meeting of the Association was brought to a satisfactory termination at the Bedford Ranges, near Halifax, commencing on the 8th September. The number of entries were less than on previous occasions, and a considerable reduction in the number of competitors for the prizes has taken place. The principal causes of the falling off in the attendance was from the fact of Halifax being so far distant from the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, and the expense and time required deterred many of the Volunteers and marksmen of these Provinces from being present.

4. The sum of \$3,385 was distributed in money prizes, exclusive of the MACDOUGALL Challenge Cup, competed for, for the fourth time; His Excellency the GOVERNOR GENERAL'S Annual Gift of a Silver Cup and Ten Sovereigns; and Badges of the Association to the value of \$296 10.

5. The Time Match was a competition of great interest, to which 151 entries were made, being considerably in excess of the number at Fredericton in 1870.

6. In accordance with arrangements with the Managing Committee at Halifax, the local expenses attending the preparation of the Ranges, and the conducting of the Matches, was borne exclusively by contributions in the locality. A statement of these expenses is embodied in the Treasurer's accounts.

7. The Council allude with pleasure to the satisfactory manner in which the Rifle Competition at Bedford was conducted, under the management of the Local Committee at Halifax, (of which Colonel J. W. LAURIE, Brigade Major, was President, and Captain J. N. RITCHIE, of the 63rd Batt. Active Militia, was Secretary,) their arrangements, and the judicious distribution of targets, enabled the Matches to be completed in the short period of four days.

8. The Council have again much pleasure in recording the fact that no accident occurred at this Meeting.

9. The Council refer to the Secretary's Report, and the detailed Returns of the various Matches will be found in the Appendix.

10. The liberality of the Railway and Steamboat Companies, in conveying competitors to and from their homes at reduced rates, deserve the thanks of the Association.

11. The Council gratefully acknowledge the continued liberal support of the Government of the Dominion, through the HONOURABLE THE MINISTER OF MILITIA AND DEFENCE, in aiding the funds of the Association.

12. The continued support received by the Association, from His Excellency the GOVERNOR GENERAL, evidences the

great interest taken by His Excellency in the progress of rifle shooting in the Dominion. The liberality extended by His Excellency is thankfully acknowledged.

13. It is worthy of note, as an event in the annals of rifle shooting in the Dominion, the attendance at Wimbledon of a team of twenty competitors, sent under the auspices of the Ontario Provincial Association, and the Council feel much pleasure in congratulating that Association upon the success which attended its representatives at the National competition in England.

14. The Council beg to submit for the consideration of the Association, a Memorandum addressed to the HONORABLE THE MINISTER OF MILITIA AND DEFENCE by the President of the Association, MR. GZOWSKI, embodying certain recommendations as to the future of the Association.

15. The Council have to acknowledge the very important services rendered to the Association by the Treasurer and Secretary.

FINANCE.

For a full account of the Finances of the Association, the Council refer to the Statement of the Treasurer; to which is attached the Auditors' Report.

The Balance Sheet, which includes Money Prizes, as well as the value of Prizes in kind, shows the total Income from all sources to have been \$6,965 34, giving an excess of Income over Expenditure of \$827 53. It will be observed, however, that the sum of \$820 60 was paid for claims of 1870; expenses incurred on account of the competition at Fredericton;—N. B.—also the sum of \$25 50 old claims, outstanding for the year 1869.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY

OF THE

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

In accordance with notices issued, the Prize Meeting of the Association for the year 1871, took place at the Bedford Ranges, near Halifax, on the 5th September and three following days.

All the local arrangements for the Meeting were placed under the Management and Control of a Local Committee, of whom LT.-COLONEL LAURIE, Vice-President of the Association for Nova Scotia, was Chairman. The Ranges at Bedford were selected, as affording the requisites considered essential in order to ensure the successful and speedy competition for the Prizes, Lists of which were fully distributed throughout the Provinces.

The sum of \$4,000 was presented in aid of the Funds of the Association by the Government, through the representation of the HONORABLE THE MINISTER OF MILITIA AND DEFENCE, and His Excellency THE GOVERNOR GENERAL presented for competition a Silver Cup, with Ten Sovereigns.

The MACDOUGALL Challenge Cup, valued at \$200, was competed for under the prescribed conditions, for the fourth time. On this occasion Ensign JOHNSON, 71st Battallion, A. Militia of New Brunswick, was the successful Winner.

The Bedford Ranges having been in use for a considerable time, afforded every facility for competition, and enabled the Meeting to be carried out and completed in four days. There were Twelve Ranges available.

Very few competitors were present from the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, but amongst those from the former Province were several who had formed part of "The Wimbledon Team," and returned from England *via* Halifax, to be present at the Meeting, and Ontario was represented by 6 competitors.

Tents, in a Camp pitched near the Ranges, were occupied by some of the Competitors, but the greater number preferred the accommodation afforded by the Hotels and Boarding Houses at and near Bedford.

The weather on the first day was unfavourable, on account of fog, which was partially the case on the second day. The remaining days were fine, with occasional high wind.

The marking in the butts was well carried out by men of the 69th and 78th Regiments of the Imperial Army.

No accidents occurred during the Meeting.

The Prizes and Badges were presented by Sir W. YOUNG, to the successful competitors, on the evening of the last day of the Meeting, at the Drill Shed at Halifax, upon which occasion the whole of the Volunteer Militia of Halifax were present on parade, and a large number of ladies and gentlemen, friends of the competitors, witnessed the proceedings.

SPECIAL REPORT
OF THE
PRESIDENT OF THE DOMINION RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

—:—

The undersigned, President of the Dominion Rifle Association, begs to submit for the consideration of the Honorable the Minister of Militia and Defence a suggestion regarding the future working of that association.

The object in the formation of the Dominion Rifle Association was to encourage the use of the Rifle as a means towards the defence of the country. Towards that end Annual Prize Meetings were to be held in different localities of the Dominion, which would afford practical evidence of the popular interest and growing skill in the use of the weapon.

To carry out this object the Dominion Government have made to the Association an annual grant of money, and the late Adjutant General, now Major General Macdougall, has presented a valuable Challenge Cup, which still remains the property of the Association. Prize Meetings have now been held in the following Provinces:—First at the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec; next at Toronto, in the Province of Ontario; third at Fredericton, in the Province of New Brunswick; and the last at Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia. The working of the present system has therefore been thoroughly tried. The results show that at the first two Prize Meetings, in Montreal and Toronto, large numbers of competitors were assembled from all parts of the Dominion, whilst the last two, at Fredericton and Halifax, were confined almost exclusively to local competitors. The number of entries and the receipts were correspondingly diminished.

The largest number of entries for any one match, which may be taken as shewing the number of competitors attending the meetings at each place, was—at Montreal 424, at Toronto 247, at Fredericton 197, at Halifax 158.

The cause of this diminution in attendance must not be attributed to any lack of interest in Rifle Shooting, or want of desire to participate in the proceedings, but the great distances between the several Provincial Capitals prevented the attendance of many Riflemen willing and anxious to go, but unable to spare from their daily avocations the time necessary to make so long a journey. The novelty of the first two meetings and other favoring circumstances combined to make them more successful than the latter have been; but the great expense attendant on such long journeys, and the loss of time making them, necessitates, in my opinion, a change in the future working of the Association, in order fully and satisfactorily to carry out the objects for which the Association was organized.

There are, in my opinion, only two methods. First—by so enlarging the Prize List as to make it a pecuniary object to Riflemen to attend, with the view of reimbursing themselves for the outlay of time and money expended in so doing; or, secondly, by centralizing the Association at Ottawa, and limiting its operations chiefly to the selection of a competent team to represent annually Canadian Riflemen at Wimbledon. The first method I am far from wishing to advocate, on the contrary I fear such a system would develop a class of men who would calculate on the earnings of their rifles as on any other means of support, and thus defeat the objects of the Association.

The other is the plan which I beg most respectfully to bring to your notice, with the hope that it will be favorably considered. There are already organized in Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, Provincial Associations of growing importance, largely attended and successfully managed. They are supplied with ranges and all other necessary machinery for carrying out their Prize Meetings.

I would suggest that each of the Associations annually select, by a designated competition, from amongst their marksmen ten representatives to attend the Dominion Rifle Association at Ottawa. Let each Provincial Association defray the

travelling expenses of their representatives to and from the Capital. When there, let these representatives be taken charge of by the Officers of the Dominion Rifle Association, resident in the Capital and connected with the Militia Department, and in a match, under the auspices of the Association and the Department of Militia and Defence, select twenty competitors to be taken as representatives of the Dominion at the next Wimbledon Meeting. Such representatives, authorized by the Department of Militia and under the command of an officer appointed by the Department, to be sent to Wimbledon at the expense of the Dominion Rifle Association. To carry out this scheme no additional grant of money from the Government to that hitherto made to the Association would be required, while the advantages accruing from the annual representation of Canada at Wimbledon would far exceed those gained by an Annual Itinerant Prize Meeting, if such representation were under the combined auspices of the Dominion Association and of the Department of Militia and Defence.

The Ontario Rifle Association having taken the initiative in sending her marksmen to compete with those of the Mother Country, I can with some pride point to the example set by her.

The interest evoked by the appearance of the first Colonial Team at Wimbledon; the marked attention they received from all, including Members of the Royal Family; and the hearty and cordial welcome of the National Rifle Association, assure us that the visit was not lost, and that should it be followed up by the Dominion, that the interest and friendly feeling will be productive of material good to our country.

With this view I beg to submit the above scheme for your consideration, and I venture to hope that your approval will enable the Provincial Associations at once to take such steps as to secure a proper representation at the next Prize Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association under your own auspices, at the Capital of Canada.

The above suggestions have received the unanimous approval of the Council of the Association.

RULES.

1.—That this Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00 per annum shall become a Member of the Association.

3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association.

4.—Any Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$40.00 annually to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships in the proportion of one to every Dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such Memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, to be registered by him one month previous to the Match.

5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6.—There shall be a President.

7.—There shall be Vice-Presidents.

8.—There shall be a Council of Forty-two Members, who shall be elected in the following proportions:

Sixteen, [16] from Ontario.

Twelve, [12] " Quebec.

Seven, [7] " New Brunswick.

Seven, [7] " Nova Scotia.

of whom four shall form a quorum, and who shall be elected, primarily by the delegates now assembled at Ottawa, and hereafter at the Annual Meeting,—and the General Meetings of the Council shall be held at the Capital of the Dominion.

9.—The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.

- 10.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, selected from among the Members of the Association, and who shall be elected by the Council.
- 11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Militia Staff-Officers in charge of the several Militia Districts of the Dominion, being members thereof, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.
- 12.—There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a paid Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13.—The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting,—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14.—The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such By-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them;—no By-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held alternately in the several Provinces of the Dominion, at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.
- 16.—The Prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such Regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.
- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing the audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the Prize Meeting as may be found practicable.
- 18.—There shall be an Annual Meeting, to be held at such time as shall be selected by the Council.

BY-LAWS.

Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Ottawa on the Third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of the Parliament of the Dominion.

Meetings of Council. There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual Meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary if required by any six of the members of the Council, —notification being sent to each member of Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting, —and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.

The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings. The Council shall keep minutes of its proceeding at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, —and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.

Finance Committee. There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank. The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditures of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual accounts. A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditure shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.


