MONTREAL'S OPINION

Is to Make the City a National Government Port.

THE CITY'S GREATEST FRIEND.

Res. Mr. Tarte, the Minister of Public Works, So Recognized by the Corn Exchange—The City Wants Terminal and Loading Facilities Provided by the Government.

Montreal, May 23.—That the Government should provide not only elevator but also terminal and loading facilities at Montreal as the necessary complement to the expenditure in deepening the canal and extending the Intercolonial was the opinion of the Corn Exchange expressed at a special meeting of navigationists upon the Government to construct these works before the opening of navigation next season. It was pointed out that there must be every facility here for the prompt discharge of vessels, or the big freighters would not come, and so the money spent on the canals would be wasted. Several speakers expressed their gratification at the way in which the subject has been taken up recently in Parliament, and especially at the speeches made by the members for Quebec to the effect that Montreal is a national port and should be equipped as such. Reference was made to their recent interview with the Ministers at Ottawa and their friendly disposition. Mr. D. G. Thompson said: "Mr. Tarte is the greatest friend to Montreal that any Government at Ottawa ever had, and Mr. Thomas Hays is just as good a friend to Montreal as any Government at Ottawa ever had. I am much pleased by these remarks about a much-maligned Montreal, who was called down on the floor of the House of Commons."

A BERLIN ARREST.
