By steady work, spite of many vicissitudes, that gathering grew and prospered until it became known as The People's Church (Methdist Connexion),

The present pastor is Rev. J. McDonald Kerr, one of the most earnest and hard-working pastors in Toronto. When he took charge of the little church the membership was quite small. Mr. Kerr does not allow the grass to grow under his ministerial heels, and in a short time the little building was crowded to ever-flowing every Sunday. The seat rents were abolished and the voluntary contributions became more than doubled. The same may be said of the Sunday school attendance under the experimendancy of Mr. George White. A

In this summer the pastor, surrounded by an earnest hand of workers, took possession of the Riverside Park band-stand, and there every Sunday large crowds of eages listeners gathered to hear the "glad tidings." It may be mentioned in connection with this open air secretly that not one solizary case of interruption or armoyance has occurred.

The membership having increased to more than 150, the edifice being constantly crowded, there was a cry for more room. The attendance is almost exclusively of the working class, and they decided to enlarge the church so that it would seat from 900 to 1000, just double its present capacity. For that purpose what has the appearance of another church is being built across the north end of the present building. 
