

SQUELCHED BY HIS CHIEF.

JOHN CHARLTON CALLED DOWN BY THE OPPOSITION LEADER.

His Bill-Timed Prohibition Motion Does Not Meet With Approval at Queen's Birthday. The Redistribution Bill Not to Come Up To-Day.

OTTAWA, May 16.—The divorce bill granting relief to James Albert Manning Adams and Ada Margaret Manning Adams today without dissent, these being the first instances in my memory when a divorce bill has passed the House of Commons without the years and days being recorded. The House could not, however, stand such an innovation as a matter of succession, and when the bill for the relief of Herbert Remington Mead came up the years and days were asked for and the bill was carried, 55 to 21 against it.

Mr. Charlton and Prohibition. The greater part of the afternoon was taken up discussing Mr. Charlton's motion. "That the state of public opinion upon the question of the prohibition of the manufacturing, importation and sale of intoxicating liquors should be ascertained by a reference to the question to the electors of Canada at the polls." Mr. Charlton did not address any new or striking arguments in favor of his resolution and was rather set off by Hon. Mr. Laurier, who told him plainly that the wisest thing he could do would be to ask the House to allow him to withdraw the motion. This Mr. Charlton finally did, but not before Sir John Thompson had pointed out the absurdity of the motion in view of the appointment of the Royal Commission to investigate the whole question of the liquor traffic, and Mr. Foster had called attention to the fact that the House had already always the most satisfactory way of arriving at a conclusion on a question requiring grave deliberation.

Next week's adjournment. The question having been raised as to what the length of the adjournment over the Queen's Birthday will be, Mr. Laurier has taken some pains to ascertain the intention of the Government and finds that there is no intention of adjourning Friday next to the following Wednesday, as has been suggested, but that the adjournment will only be from Monday to Wednesday.

The Redistribution Bill. The debate on the Redistribution Bill will probably commence on Wednesday and promises to be not only long but very vigorous. The objections to the bill do not all come from the Opposition. Conservative members, especially those from the Province of Quebec, are complaining that the bill does not go far enough. The bill now now goes on the Government that further changes should be made in the bill. The Opposition, however, have all we can do to keep Conservative knives out of the map of Quebec, and they do it very well.

Northwest Police. The whole of the evening was taken up discussing Mr. Macdonald's motion for the Northwest Mounted Police force should be reduced annually and resulted in the motion being carried by a large majority. Mr. Armstrong at 11.30 without reaching Mr. Armstrong's separate school resolution or Mr. Devlin's Home rule motion.

Just previous to adjournment Sir John Thompson said, in reply to Hon. Mr. Laurier, that the criminal law bill would be taken up for a while to-morrow and after that, so that redistribution will not be on the order for to-morrow. Dr. McEachern, two representatives of the Waldron Repeal Company, and a number of other members were here and will have an interview with members of the ministry to-morrow on the old question of granting liquor licenses.

The Pages of the House of Commons have organized a croquet club and have received permission from Hon. Mr. O'Brien, Minister of Public Works, to use the lawn opposite the eastern block. They had their first practice to-night and were very successful in challenging the Toronto and Montreal clubs.

PARIS HAS ANOTHER MYSTERY.

Two Men Deceased to Death by a Woman in a Closed Carriage.

PARIS, May 16.—Paris is excited over another mysterious tragedy. Last Wednesday, M. Delanion, one of the officials of the Hotel des Monnaies, was summoned to an enclosed carriage in the street by an announcement that a woman wished to see him. On his return he was evidently much annoyed and requested a commissionaire, in his service, to accompany him on his mission, the nature of which he did not mention.

Neither in the men returned and the first chapter of the mystery was solved to-day by the finding of two bodies in the Seine, which, subsequently, were identified as those of the missing official of the Hotel des Monnaies and his companion.

The theory of the authorities is that M. Delanion and the commissionaire were deceived by this locality, murdered and their bodies thrown into the river. However, no motive known for the crime.
