This city being the railway, commercial and educational centre of the Province of Ontario, and also the centre of navigation, it is, in the opinion of the council, fitting that the head quarters of the weather bureau should also be located here. It is the only non-revenue producing Dominion institution located in this city, the local branches of the council large revenue for the Dominion exchequer, while Ottawa, to which city it is proposed to remove this institution, already has the benefit of the Federal Departments, without contributing to the general revenue so large assum annually as Toronto. The council desires to direct the attention of the Dominion Government to the fact that this city, by making a grant in the year 1882 towards the purchase of a transit instrument, gave substantial proof of its interest in the Observatory, and assisted to equip. it for doing astronomical as well as magnetic and meteorological work, this additional work being an advantage to the whole country, and not to Toronto alone.
