GOLD IN FRANCE.

The Bank of France Is Pouring Out Gold for the First Time in Ten Years.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13.—Mr. Laessle, director of the Mint, has received a cablegram from Paris stating that the Bank of France is discharging gold heavily for the reason that the limit of the lawful note issue has been reached, and also because of the recent large withdrawal of notes by banks and others for the purpose of increasing their reserves.

It is believed that the Treasury Department that the large disbursements of gold by the Bank of France, which is directly contrary to the policy as pursued during the past ten years, will have the effect of sensibly reducing the export of gold from the United States.
