

THOMAS McILVEEN MAY HAVE BEEN MURDERED

Clinton is Excited Over a Startling Story of the Man's Disappearance Three Years Ago—Did Tramps Kill Him?

Clinton, March 8.—(Special.)—Considerable excitement prevails here just now over a startling story that is being told, and which revives the strange disappearance three years ago of Thomas McIlveen, a highly respected farmer, who resided three and a half miles north of this place.

There Will Be No More Luxuries in the Shape of Band Concerts, the Mayor Says—Technical School Board Objects to Proposed New Quarters.

Charges Are Denied. With reference to the complaint made by H. E. Sheppard, this is no time to start explaining matters, when the motion has been declared carried.

Works Estimates. The work of going over the Board of Control estimates was continued, the amount asked for the Technical School, first taken up, but it was only reduced by \$120, which leaves the grant this year \$12,902, as compared with \$13,037 last year.

No More Band Concerts. In the Parks and Exhibition estimates \$10,000 was asked for 1900. This includes \$4,612 for maintenance, \$7,388 for permanent improvements, \$15,185 for miscellaneous work and \$4,000 for boilers in the Machinery Hall.

St. Lawrence Market Difficulty. The St. Lawrence Market difficulty was next debated. The City Solicitor reported that the Council's amendment to the Board of Control's report, appointing Beaumont, Ltd., as the agreement was struck out.

Waterworks Coal Supply. The contract for the supply of 100 tons of coal for the main pumping station expires in a few weeks, and the committee is advised to advertise for 200 tons more, which will carry them over until June next, when the present supply can be renewed at a much lower figure than at present.

VALUABLE WORK ACKNOWLEDGED. Lord Salisbury and the Earl of Kimberley Agree in Tributes to the Ambassador.

London, March 8.—In the House of Lords today Lord Newton moved the resolution to address to the British Ambassador at Washington, and asked whether, in view of the valuable services of Lord Pauncefote, the advisability of prolonging his tenure of office should be considered, adding: "The task of maintaining our relations on their present happy footing is not likely to prove less difficult in the immediate future. In addition to the questions that look forward to the Presidential election, which is a productive of political eccentricities, I think that he has been doing his work in a most satisfactory manner."

Lord Salisbury said Lord Newton had done what he had to do, and that he was glad to see the present moment was not a happy one for a change.

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
