### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

# ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

#### CONSTITUTION.

- 1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle ASSOCIATION."
- 2. That the membership fee be \$1 per annum, and that all memberships be paid at that rate.
- 3. A donor of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as a life member of the Association.
- 4. Associations shall pay \$5 per annum for the privilege of affiliation, irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, entitling the Association to a badge, and to free entrance for Team Prizes in the Affiliated Association's Matches.
- 5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council. The Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Ontario for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
  - 6. There shall be a President.
- 7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents-one for each Military District.
  - 8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows:
  - lst. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected at the annual meeting.
  - 2nd. The ex-Presidents of the Association.
  - 3rn. The Deputy Adjutants-General of Militia for Ontario.
  - 4th. The Brigade Majors of Militia for Ontario.
  - 5th. The Presidents of local Affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association.

Five of whom shall form a quorum: and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

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18. place a 9. Members of the Council may be represented at its meetings by written proxies, containing limited or full powers as may be expressed therein.

Such proxies to be held by members of the Association only, the signature to be duly witnessed, and no member to hold more than one proxy.

- 10. The Council shall select from its members the President of the Association.
- 11. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such District, and who shall be elected by the Council.
- 12. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts or deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them; no by-law being in any way altered, nor new one proposed, without at east one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15. The annual prize meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.
- 16. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed from time to time by the Council.
- 17. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.
- 18. There shall be an annual meeting to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

18. No change shall be made in the Constitution, except at the annual meeting, notice of the proposed amendment having been sent to the Secretary three months previously, and also posted on the Bulletin Board at the opening of the annual matches.

# BY-LAWS.

The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, on the second day of the Annual Match.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

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Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meeting.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of all members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Ontario Bank of Canada, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure for sums of current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be tendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

# REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

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OF THE

# ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER, 1893.

Your Council has the honour to submit the Twenty-fifth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Ontario Rifle Association.

Owing to the fact that the Dominion Government had given possession of the garrison common ranges to the City of Toronto for Exhibition purposes in August, 1892, and that the New Rifle Ranges were not completed in October, 1892, your Council decided not to hold a match in that year.

The Annual Prize Meeting was held on Monday, 21st August, 1893 and three following days, for the first time on the new ranges (Long Branch Rifle Ranges), situated on the shore of Lake Ontario, about twelve miles west of the Union Station, Toronto. The Grand Trunk Railway provided a good railway service, viz.: six trains a day each way; the members of the Association enjoyed the advantage of a very low return rate, from the city to the ranges.

The Long Range (800 and 900 yds.) was not ready in time for the matches, and the Council decided to fire the second stage of the "Gibson" at 600 yds., 15 rounds, with same prize list as for 800 and 900 yds. This seemed to give satisfaction to the 50 competitors who were entitled to shoot in this match.

The Association is to be congratulated upon the fact that our team of eight, at Dominion Rifle Association matches at Ottawa, this year, again won the London Merchants' Cup.

The entries this year were not as large as in 1890 and 1891, but an increase may be confidently expected next year, if the matches are fired with Martini Henry Rifles only, instead of Martini Henry and Snider Rifles.

The Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and disbursements is herewith submitted.

Your Council desires to acknowledge with thanks the following grants:---

# MEETINGS OF THE ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION FOR 1893.

### MEETING OF THE COUNCIL

Held Tuesday, May 16th, 1893, at 11 o'clock, at the Canadian Military Institute, Toronto.

PRESENT.—Lieut.-Col. Jones, one of the Vice-Presidents, in the chair; Lieut. A. D. Cartwright, Mr. John Crowe, Major J. J. Mason, Major S. Hughes, M. P., Mr. A. Bell, Major Macdonald, 48th Highlanders; Lieut.-Col. White, Capt. Mercer, Mr. Albert Pain, Major Bruce, Inspector Johnston. And by Proxy:—Capt. Dennistoun, Mr. George Sleeman, Major George Hayes, Lieut.-Col. J. Macpherson, Lieut.-Col. Davis, Lieut.-Col. Starke, Capt. E. J. Zealand.

Minutes of Council meeting held December 6th, 1892, were read and confirmed.

The Secretary presented printed statement of receipts and expenditures for the year ending Dec. 31st, 1892.

The statement was considered by the meeting.

Moved by Major J. J. Mason, seconded by Major Delamere,

"That the statement as presented be adopted." Carried.

A letter was read from Col. Walker Powell, Adjutant-General, stating that a grant of \$1,800 had been made by the Dominion Government to the O.R.A. and would be available after 1st July next.

Major Mason reported on behalf of the special committee appointed October 24th, 1892, re new ranges, as follows:

TORONTO, April 26th, 1893.

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REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE APPOINTED OCTOBER 24TH, 1892, Re New Ranges.

The Committee met April 26th, 1893.

Present-Lieut.-Col. Jones, Lieut.-Col. White, Major J. J. Mason, and Major S. Hughes, M.P.

The following officers representing city corps were also present:—Lt.-Col. F. C. Denison, G.G.B.G.; Capt. Mercer, Queen's Own Rifles; Major Bruce, Royal Grenadiers; Major Macdonald, 48th Highlanders, and Capt. Irving, Toronto Field Battery.

Lt.-Col. F. C. Denison, G.G.B.G., was elected chairman of the joint meeting.

Lt.-Col. F. C. Denison took the chair.

The Secretary, Capt. Mutton, read the resolution passed at meeting of Council Oct. 24th, 1892, a copy of which appears in the minutes of the Council meeting of that date.

The meeting discussed the matter at considerable length, when the following resolution was adopted :—  $\,$ 

Moved by Major Mason, 13th Batt., seconded by Capt. Mercer, Q.O.R.,

"That in view of the fact that the new ranges are not ready and will not for some time be ready to be handed over to the Government, it is not considered advisable to make any arrangements at present for their occupancy and maintenance, as between the Ontario Rifle Association and the Toronto Corps, but that the arrangements hitherto in force shall prevail during the present year, it being understood that the negotiations alluded to in the resolution of the 24th October, 1892, shall be resumed and settled before next year." Carried.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

Moved by Major J. J. Mason, seconded by Major S. Hughes, M. P.

"That report of special committee be adopted " Carried.

Moved by Major Delamere, seconded by Inspector Johnston,

"That the Annual Matches of the Association take place on Monday, 21st August next, and following days." Carried.

Moved by Major Delamere, seconded by Inspector Johnston,

"That the following be the members of the Match Committee to prepare a programme:—Lt.-Col. Otter, Lt.-Col. Jones, Major J. J. Mason, Major S. Hughes. Major W. C. Macdonald, Major Bruce, Capt. Mercer, Mr. J. Crowe, Lieut. Elliott, 12th Battalion, and the Secretary and Treasurer. Carried.

A discussion then took place as to the best way to utilize the targets on the new ranges for the purpose of the annual matches.

Moved by Major W. C. Macdonald, seconded by Major S. Hughes, M. P.

"That all the regular matches of the Association be fired on Nos. 3 and 4 butts, numbering from the west, and that necessary firing points be built opposite these butts so as to admit of all the targets being utilized on these two ranges for the same distance at the same time—two different matches or two different distances of the same match not to be fired simultaneously; the 400 yard range to be utilized for 500 yards extra series competition."

The following addition to the above resolution was proposed by Major Mason, seconded by Capt. Mercer, viz.:—

"Provided that the Match Committee, after a personal inspection of the

ranges, consider the above arrangement expedient, having in view the question of danger, expense, and the nature of the ground, the Match Committee to report to the Council." Carried.

The mover and seconder of the original motion accepted the amendment as a rider to their motion.

The resolution as amended was declared carried.

Moved by Major Delamere, seconded by Capt. Mercer,

"That at all ranges over 500 yards any position be allowed, but no artificial support to the body external to the clothing be allowed." Carried.

Moved by Major J. J. Mason, seconded by Mr. A. Pain,

"That recommendation of Annual Meeting August 25th, 1891 (see page 26, Report 1891) be referred to the Match Committee."

Moved by M. A. Elliott, seconded by Major J. J. Mason,

"That about \$600 be added this year to the Prize List so as to leave a reserve fund of \$1,000."

This question was discussed but it was decided to leave it over until next meeting of the Council to be held May 30th, 1893.

Meeting adjourned.

### I.-AFFILIATION.

- 1. The affiliation fee is \$5 (payable by 18th August), irrespective of membership or individual entrance fees, which entitles an Association to a medal, and free entrance for team prizes in the "Walker Match."
- 2. Competitors on affiliated teams must have been members in good standing of such Association for at least thirty days previous to the match, and no competitor can enter as a member of more than one Association.

### II.-MEMBERSHIP.

The fee for membership is \$1, irrespective of entrance fees; and all competitors must be members of the Association.

#### III.-ENTRIES.

Entries, accompanied by the fees, for the first seven matches, must be made (upon forms to be obtained from the Secretary) on or before Thursday, 17th August, 1893; other matches during the first two days of the meeting.

## IV.—POST ENTRIES.

- I. Post entries (10 per cent. extra) will not be squaded until the regularentries have been provided for.
- 2. Post entries will be detailed to fire according to the number on the ticket issued, but the Council cannot hold themselves responsible

should the holders of such tickets find it impossible to shoot before the close of the competition; in such case the entrance fee will be returned.

3. No post entries will be made for any competition after the firing for such competition has commenced.

### V.-RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

- 1. Competitors who are prevented from being present at the Meeting can have two thirds the entrance fees they have paid returned after the Meeting, provided that they return their firing tickets.
- 2. Competitors who attend the Meeting, but who are prevented from competing by illness, will receive back their entrance fees on production of a medical certificate and their firing tickets.

#### VI.-TRANSIT.

By arrangement with the Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific Railways, competitors will be carried to and from the Meeting at reduced fares upon applying to the station agent at starting point for a certificate, which is to be signed by the Secretary of the Association as proof that competitors attended the meeting. These reduced fare tickets will be good from August 18th until three days after the close of the D. R. A. Matches at Ottawa.

### VII.—QUARTERS.

- 1. Competitors desirous of camping on the ranges may obtain a tent and ten blankets on payment of \$1.50, or a tent alone, \$1.
  - 2. Meals can be obtained on the ground.

#### VIII.-EFFICIENCY.

Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates competing in the "Canada Company," "Tait-Brassey," and "Gzowski" Matches will be required to produce Certificates from the Commanding Officer or Adjutant of their Corps that they are regularly enrolled and efficient members of the same.

#### IX.—RIFLES.

Rifles will be classified as follows:

#### CLASS I.

#### MILITARY BREECH-LOADERS.

1. Snider (S.) or Martini-Henry (M. H.) Rifles of bona-fide Government pattern, and bearing the Imperial Government viewer's mark.

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3. Sights must be strictly in accordance with Government pattern, and may be temporarily coloured with black or white, so long as no application of a permanent nature is used: they may also be shaded by any The sliding bar may be reversed; temporary marks or lines removable at pleasure, may be used.

4. Any pad or shoe for the heel-plate of the butt, admitting of removal, and thereby allowing of variation at pleasure in the length of the stock,

### X.-UNIFORM.

Officers, and Non-Commissioned Officers and men competing for prizes restricted to the Militia, must appear in the authorized full dress or undress uniform of their Corps, with a waist belt. Officers need not wear sword belts, nor Officers of Rifle Corps cross belt. Cap covers may be worn. Uniforms to be fastened, and the heel-plate of the rifle to rest against the outside of the uniform when firing. Waist belts must be worn except when firing. In military matches the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress are issued.

## XI.—AMMUNITION.

1. In all competitions except the revolver, the cost of ammunition will be included in the cost of entries. The register keepers will furnish competitors with the necessary number of rounds at each range. No other ammunition shall be used.

### XII.—SIGHTING SHOTS.

One Sighting Shot must be fired at each range in all the Regular Matches (Nos. 1 to 10 inclusive), but will not be allowed in the Extra Series or Revolver Matches. The cost of the Sighting Shot is included

### XIII.—POSITION.

In the "Standing Position" the whole of the left hand and wrist must be in front of the trigger guard and the left elbow clear of the body. "Kneeling Position" to be the ordinary Military Kneeling Position. Any Position-If back position is used no artificial support to the body

#### XIV.—TARGETS.

- 1. The size of the targets will be for the regular matches:-At 200 yards-
- 4 feet square; Bull's Eye, 8 inches in diameter; Inner, 16 inches in diameter; Magpie, 24 inches in diameter; Outer, remainder of the target.

At 400, 500 and 600 yards-

6 feet square; Bull's Eye, 2 feet in diameter; Inner, 3 feet in diameter; Magpie, 4 feet in diameter; Outer, remainder of the target.

At 800 and 900 yards-

6 feet high by 12 feet wide; Bull's Eye, 3 feet in diameter; Inner, 4 feet 6 inches in diameter; Magpie, 6 feet square; Outer, remainder of the target.

For the "Revolver" Match-

The O. R. A. Standard Revolver Target will be used. Diameter 12½ inches; Diameter of Bull's Eye, 1¾ inches. Remainder of Target divided into 6 rings, each ring to count from 1 to 6 points, Bull's Eye, 7 points.

#### XV.—SIGNALLING AND SCORING.

1. Hits will be signalled at the butt and entered on the firing ticket according to the following scale:—

HITS.	SIGNAL.	SCORE.
Magpie	White disc Red disc Black and White disc Black disc Black disc Black Bar.	4 "

- 2. When two shots strike the target simultaneously, both hits will be marked, and that which has the highest value will be given to the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire.
- 3. In the event of the Marker accidentally displaying more than one signal disk, he shall immediately correct the error, and the marking as finally signalled cannot be questioned; no competitor shall be allowed to claim more than the actual value of his shot by reason of such an error in signalling; but if a shot is not signalled, the competitor shall be entitled to challenge it, and the Range Officer shall telephone to the Non-Commissioned Officer at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination shall be final.
- 4. The competitor challenging a shot must deposit the sum of fifty cents, which will be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.
- 5. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal disc*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstances to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Non-Commissioned Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.
- 6. All claims for shots must be made before another shot is fired at the target in question.

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7. All alterations of the register must be initialed by the Range Officer, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first telephoned to the butt.

# XVI.-PENALTIES AND FINES.

### Disqualification.

### 1. Any competitor-

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- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own: or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money or a bribe of any kind to an employé of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or
- (e) Who, being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association, shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council or to the Executive; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Executive Committee may consider to be discreditable; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council or Executive Committee as having elsewhere been guilty of any of the aforesaid

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council or Executive Committee, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be forever disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Asso-

# Exclusion from further Competition during the Meeting.

#### 2. Any competitor--

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle within the enclosure, except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except on the firing points in use, and within the hours of shooting; or
- (d) Who shall discharge his rifle accidentally, either by his own want of care, or by reason of any defect in the rifle; or
- (e) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous; or
- (f) Who shall refuse to comply with any order that may be given by the officer in charge of the firing point to which he is detailed; shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the Meeting, and

### Disallowance of Score.

### 3. Any competitor-

(a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any

- (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the Meeting while shooting for any particular prize; or
- (c) Who when competing for an aggregate prize shall omit to enter, or enter incorrectly, his previous score or scores on the ticket provided for the purpose;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed.

#### Fines.

4. Any competitor who shall accidently fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar.

#### XVII.-TIES.

Ties will be decided as follows:-

### IN INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS.

- 1. When the firing takes place at more than one distance-
  - (a) By the range totals in inverse order.

  - (e) By the inverse order of shots.
  - (f) By division if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot at the longest distance, if for prizes in kind.
- 2. When firing takes place at one distance only-

  - (d) By the inverse order of shots.
  - (e) By division, if for money prizes, or firing shot for shot, if for prizes in value.

### IN TEAM COMPETITIONS.

- (a) If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.

- (e) By the total of each round in inverse order.
- (f). By the highest scorer in each team shooting off three rounds at the longest distance.

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### IN AGGREGATES.

1. By score at each match in inverse order.

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2. By following the rules for individual ties.

The names of competitors who have to shoot off ties will be posted updaily at 8.30 a.m. and 12.30 noon, on the Ties Notice Board.

### XVIII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

1. Winners of Prizes must apply to the Treasurer's Office on the ground for them, and on receiving the amount of such prizes sign a receipt for the same.

# XIX.-GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The meeting will be under the direction of an Executive Committee, composed of five members of the Council, three of whom shall form a quorum, whose decision shall be final and binding in all matters submitted to them for their consideration; but they may, at their discretion, refer any questions to the decision of the Council, in which case the decision of the Council on such questions shall be final.

The Executive Committee will meet each day at gun for "cease fire" noon and evening.

- 1. All competitors will be subject to the Executive Committee, Officers or Non-Commissioned Officers in charge of their respective ranges or squads, the Camp Police, and the General Regulations for the conduct of the meeting.
- 2. Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the General Regulations of the meeting, as also with the conditions attached to the prize or prizes for which they have entered, as the plea of ignorance of such regulations and conditions will not be entertained.
- They must refer to the Notice Boards daily, and ascertain whether any orders have been issued which alter or affect the original details.
- 4. They must attend at the firing point punctually at the hour detailed and deliver their tickets to the Register Keeper. Unless a competitor produces his firing ticket at the firing point, he will not be allowed to fire. Should a competitor lose his firing ticket, omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, and so by his own neglect miss the opportunity given him of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall have no claim on the Association thereunder.
- 5. The Matches will take place, if possible, at the time named. Any deviations from the rule will be posted on the Board at the Secretary's office. Temporary discontinuance on account of bad weather will be at the discretion of the Executive Committee.
- 6. The firing will begin daily at 8.30 a.m., except on Monday when it will begin at 9 a.m., and cease when the midday gun is fired. It will be resumed at 1 p.m., and cease at 6 p.m.

- 7. Two guns will be fired for the firing to commence, one, ten minutes before the named hour, to warn competitors to move to the firing points: the second being the signal that firing is to begin. Two guns also at the "Cease Fire," one ten minutes before the named hour, after which no competitor will be allowed to begin his score; the second as a signal that all the scores begun before the first gun, are completed.
- 8. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.
  - 9. No hair triggers will be allowed.
- 10. Slings may be used as an assistance at all matches; but in those restricted to the Militia the slings must be of regulation length (54\frac{1}{4} inches, not including the tongue or buckle) and pattern, and attached to the rifles, as in government arms.
- 11. "Blowing off" shall not be allowed at the firing points, or after competitors have taken their position for firing. Pits will be provided at places near the firing points where competitors can "blow off" before joining their squads on presentation of a "blow off" ticket, which will be sold for five cents each and will include the cost of one round of ammunition to be obtained from the person in charge, on delivery of the ticket.
- 12. Competitors may clean their rifles during a competition between distances only.
- 13. No two competitors shall fire with the same rifle in the same match (except in the "Martini-Henry Matches"); nor shall a competitor change his rifle during a match, unless it becomes unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Range Officer.
- 14. Every competitor must enter and shoot under his own name, and unless otherwise specified, not oftener than once for any prize.
- 15. No member of a squad or firing party shall absent himself without leave during firing. Any competitor delaying the squad will be passed by.
- 16. No competitor shall load his rifle until he has taken his position at the firing point.
- 17. In all competitions except "The Gzowski" competitors will be formed up by threes, and fire shot and shot alternately, and only competitors firing will be allowed within the firing ropes. No person except the Register Keeper, or Officers on duty will be permitted to speak or offer any advice to a competitor after he has taken his place at the firing point.
- 18. Where only one competitor is present he must fire his shots without undue delay; but the Range Officer or some one named by him must witness the shooting and countersign the Register.
- 19. Register Keepers are required to call out the value of each shot fired, and the competitors must see that their scores are correctly entered on the Score Board, so that any objection to the score recorded may be investigated before the next shot is fired. The Range Officer is required to see that each score recorded on the firing ticket corresponds with that on the Score Board.
- 20. In individual competitions, a competitor may use a binocular or telescope, not mounted on any kind of stand, provided his doing so does not delay the firing.

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21. Any competitor protesting against the ruling of a Range Officer, or feeling himself aggrieved in any way must make a statement of his grievances in writing, giving the names of two or more persons who can bear him out in his statements, and hand it to the Secretary; but the firing must not be delayed for that purpose.

22. No practice will be allowed on the ranges during the continuance of the meeting, either before or after the day's firing.

- 2. In the Skirmishing Match targets will be exposed to view for fifteen seconds for each round, and one shot only must be fired by each man.
- 3. In the Volley Firing Match targets will remain stationary until the ten rounds are fired. One to three points will be deducted for each bad volley at the discretion of the officer in command.

The Minutes of meeting of the Council held August 26th, 1891, were read and confirmed.

The Secretary read the Annual Report for the year ending December 31st, 1891; also Balance Sheet and Statement from the Treasurer, showing receipts and expenditure for year ending same time, when it was

Moved by Major Delamere, seconded by Capt. Bruce,

"That the report and statement be adopted." Carried.

A letter was read from Mr. Mulock resigning his position as President.

Moved by Major Delamere, seconded by Capt. Rennie,

"That in view of the letter of the President asking to be relieved, a committee be appointed to wait upon the President and urge him to reconsider his determination to retire, or to take into consideration the name or names of

other gentlemen to be suggested at the first meeting of the next Council, and that such Committee shall consist of Lieut.-Col. Jones, Major Delamere, Major Macdonald, Capt. Bruce and Staff-Sergt. Bell." Carried.

A letter was read from Lieut.-Col. Alger, resigning his position as Treasurer. Moved by Staff-Sergt. A. Bell, seconded by Major Delamere,

"That the Treasurer's resignation be laid over, and that Capt. Mutton, the Secretary, act for him in the meantime." Carried.

A discussion took place as to the position of the Association with regard to the ownership of the new range on the Lake Shore Road, and also with regard to the maintenance of the Range.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Gibson, seconded by Major Macdonald,

"That in view of the abandonment of the Garrison Commons Ranges and the provision made of new ranges near Port Credit it is now necessary that the manner in which these new ranges should hereafter be managed and controlled should be clearly settled and defined; that on the conveyance of the new ranges to the Dominion Government by the City of Toronto, the Militia Department should be requested not to make any disposition of the ranges in favor of either the O.R.A. or the Toronto City Corps without making due provision for both; and that before any definite action be taken it is desirable that the basis of an arrangement as between the O.R.A. and the City Corps should be negotiated by representatives to be appointed for the purpose, such arrangement to provide for the annual use of the ranges for the O.R.A. matches, for the general management of the ranges and the maintenance of the same in a proper state of repair, etc. That the City Corps of Toronto be requested to appoint a representative of each corps to meet the following committee of the Association for the purposes hereinbefore set forth, viz.: Lt.-Col. Jones, Major Mason, 13th Batt., Major White, Major Sam Hughes, and Capt. Russell; and that the conclusions arrived at be reported to another meeting of this Council for confirmation. Carried.

A discussion took place upon the question of holding a match on the new Ranges this year.

"That a rifle match be held on the new ranges as soon as possible this year."
