Sessional Statement.

A review of our congregational work during the year just closed presents many causes of thanksgiving to God. The Sabbath and week day services have been largely attended. The reports of the various organizations show faithful service and encouraging results in each department. There is evidence of increasing liberality towards the schemes of the Church, resulting, let us trust, from a deepening interest in the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom.

We feel thankful that the Lord has blessed us with so many, and with such faithful workers, but in a congregation as large as ours we need more men and women consecrated to service. The Session, in consequence of removals by death and change of residence, has been so reduced in numbers as to render an adequate addition thereto an immediate duty. Let every member pray the Lord to raise up men willing to serve in the Eldership who will be worthy successors of those that are gone, and are going from us, and who, when sent to us, will be a rich blessing to the congregation.

The list of deaths for the year is remarkable for its length, and the names of prominent men it contains among whom we notice as worthy of special reference:

- (a) The Rev. Duncan McMillan, a man of God, venerable for his long and faithful service in the ministry, beloved and respected by all who had the honor of his acquaintance for his nobility of character, and his many sterling qualities of heart and mind.
- (b) The Rev. A. W. McConechy, who in consequence of declining health resigned his charge or Port Stanley and came

to reside in this city. Mr. McConechy was a minister of superior abilities and great promise. Beloved and faithful unto death, God has rewarded him in the morning of his days with the crown of life.

- (c) Mr. David Duff, one of our most respected and useful Elders. He was an honest man, a faithful friend, a wise counsellor, a christian gentleman, liberal and enlightened beyond his times. It is very trying to bear the loss of so excellent a man, and office bearer. Our loss is his eternal gain.
- (d) Mr. A. D. Cameron, for some time an active member of the Board of Management. Mr. Cameron's many excellencies fitted him for much usefulness, and endeared him to a large circle of admiring friends.

To the relatives and friends of the foregoing, and of all others who are mourning their separation from loved ones, we extend our tenderest sympathy. The addition to the membership during the year was 65, the withdrawals by death and removals to other places, 46; the number of baptisms, 32.

In order to secure an accurate roll of the membership of the congregation, the Session, some two years ago, introduced the Card System of admission to each Communion, and having now compiled a new membership roll, it is deemed advisable to print the names for the benefit of the congregation.

After deducting removals by death and change of residence during the last two years, the list of 658 (commencing on page 40) comprises the names of all members in full communion with the congregation. Should there be an omission of any member's name through any cause, it is requested that the name of such member be given to the Moderator or any member of Session.

THIRTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

---OF THE----

Board of Managers of St. Andrew's Church

BEING FOR THE YEAR 1889.

1. In presenting the Annual Report for 1889, the Board of Managers have much pleasure in congratulating the congregation on the uniform measure of prosperity which has attended its temporal affairs during the year.

Although many respected and beloved friends have been removed from amongst us by death, and many others having from various causes, either left the city or removed beyond the bounds of the Church, yet we have the gratification to report that every vacancy has been filled up, and that there is a greater demand for sittings (especially in the body of the Church) than we can supply.

- 2. With the view of encouraging those who are contributing to the ordinary revenue of the Church by means of envelopes, we obtained permission at the last Annual Meeting to issue printed Quarterly Statements, showing the names, sittings and amount contributed by each, instead of Monthly Receipts as formerly, and we find that those Quarterly Statements have given general satisfaction, because they have not only served the purpose of an acknowledgment of their liberality, but show a complete list of all the contributors, and also a summary of the result at the end of each quarter.
- 3. From the Treasurer's Financial Statement it will be observed that the sum of \$5,237.70 has been contributed for

the ordinary revenue of the Church by means of envelopes, and the sum of \$504.25 by open collections, making in all a total of \$5,741.95, or an average per Sunday of \$110.00. For some reason the collections have fallen off in comparison with the previous year, but the increase in the amount received through the envelope system will fully compensate for that loss.

- 4. The Church debt which amounted to \$3,200.00 at the last Annual Meeting has been reduced to \$2,400.00, and the Managers are desirous that the same policy in regard to the Church debt should be continued until it is all paid off. They also recommend that two hundred dollars per annum be added to the Rev. Mr. Murray's stipend, from the 1st of January, 1890, and they would respectfully ask that no other motion be made at this meeting involving an expenditure of money, unless provision is first made to provide funds from some other source, as all available funds from the ordinary revenue will be required to meet the monthly current expenses of the congregation, and the gradual liquidation of the Church debt.
- 5. Although the operations of the year have been fairly prosperous, the Managers have reason to believe that a large number of persons who are attending St. Andrew's Church are contributing little or nothing towards the support of gospel ordinances, (that such is the case is quite evident from the small amount cast upon the collection plates on Sunday.) An earnest appeal is herewith made to those who have not yet adopted the Envelope System, to begin now. It matters little that the amount in some cases must be small, but it should be presented with regularity, and regarded as a gift to God.
- 6. The Treasurer's books have been examined by Messrs. T. H. Purdom and C. R. Somerville, the Auditors, duly appointed by the congregation, and their certificate will be found attached to the Financial Statement of the funds of the Church.

- 7. The thanks of the congregation are due to Mr. S. W. Wilson, Organist, and the members of the Choir, for the efficient manner in which the musical services of the Church have been conducted by them during the year, and also to the Auditors and Ushers for their valuable services to the congregation.
- 8. The following members of the Board of Managers whose term of office now expires by rotation are: Messrs. C. McCallum, James Mills, Dr. J. McArthur, James McSween, Thomas Bryan and Dr. Thos. Irvine, but they are all eligible for re-election.

Owing to their imperfect knowledge of our language, it requires a teacher for each. Misses Davis, B. Muir and M. Purdom undertook to teach them, and their efforts have proved acceptable to their pupils.

Besides the above, one class (boys) contributed \$5 00 for the China Inland Mission. This sum was over and above their regular Sabbath collections, and makes the aggregate collected for missions during the year \$321.21.

The second Sabbath of September having been set apart by the General Assembly as Children's Day, appropriate services were held in the Church morning and evening. A public meeting was held in the Church in the afternoon, and was addressed by Rev. Mr. Courtice, Rev. Dr. Waters and our pastor. The collection on this occasion was given to Knox College Missionary Association.

On the fourth Sabbath of October, instead of holding the usual session, the members of the School, the Bible Class and a number of friends met in the auditorium of the Church, and were addressed by Rev. Mr. Laird, of Fort Pelly. The collection on that occasion, amounting to \$13.34, went toward defraying Mr. Laird's travelling expenses.

During the year two of our scholars were removed by the hand of death—George McCadden, of the Boys' Bible Class, and King Meek, of the Infant Class. The bereaved families have our sympathy and prayers in their sore affliction.

We have had a good deal of difficulty in getting a sufficient number of teachers; in fact, two of the classes were without regular teachers for several months. This is a state of things which should not exist in so large and intelligent a congregation as ours.

On 17th July we joined forces with Park Avenue Sabbath School, and spent a very enjoyable day at Port Stanley.

REPORT FOR 1880.

The very first note of this report must be one of profound thankfulness to God for the restoration to health and active duty of our dear President, Mrs. Murray, after four months of illness at close of last and early part of the present year.

Also for the spared life and return to our midst of our beloved Secretary, Mrs. Blair, after an absence at the Pacific Coast of about a year in search of health.

We are glad to report a very pleasant, rather progressive year in point of interest and profit, partly due to the individual proving from scripture of selected subjects, and the reading of choice articles bearing chiefly upon the objects of our work—Missions. Added to this we have twenty-six subscribers to the Monthly Letter Leaflet, only one cent a month, containing letters directly from our Missionaries in all parts of the world, including our own Northwest, which contains information always of the most interesting character to the members of our now wide-spread Society. Our membership, however, remains much about the same. During the year three valued members left for other centres of usefulness, while five others have joined us, making our number at this date 45.

The money results of the year are purely voluntary contributions and membership fees, together with a Thanks offering with which we concluded our Annual Meeting in December. These sum up to a total of \$119.71.

Besides we sent to Stoney Lake Reserve, N. W. T., for use of the Indians, and Mr. and Mrs. Anderson in charge, a bale of

clothing, new and second hand to the value of \$114.88, freigh paid extra. In October we had the pleasure of a visit from Rev. Jas. and Mrs Laird, of Fort Pelly Mission, N. W. T., which added very much to the interest and profit of our Society. All of which is respectfully submitted.
