**The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Huron.**

TWENTIETH SESSION,

*(Being the Third under the Act of Incorporation of 1874.)*

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened in London, on Tuesday, June 19th, 1877.

Divine Service was held in the Chapter House, at 11 a. m., when the Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to the Clergy and Lay Representatives assembled.

The sermon was preached by the Rev. Dr. Potter, Rector of Grace Church, New York, from Acts xv. 6.

The Synod assembled in the Chapter House at half-past 2 o'clock p. m.

The Bishop in the Chair.

The customary prayer having been offered by the Bishop, the rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were called by the respective Secretaries, when 83 Clergymen and 72 Lay Delegates answered to their names. The latter handed in their certificates.

The Bishop named the Rev. Rural Dean Smith and Mr. Henry Crotty to act in conjunction with the Secretaries as a Committee to examine the certificates of the Lay Representatives.

V. *Resolved*—That whereas the Minutes of the Synod have been printed and distributed, the reading thereof be dispensed with; and the authenticated, corrected printed copy be signed by the Bishop. *Carried*.

The minutes were then signed by the Chairman.

#### Admission to Seats in Synod.

The Lord Bishop then introduced to the Synod the Rev. Dr. Riley, Bishop Elect of Mexico, and Rev. Dr. Potter, Rector of Grace Church, New York. His Lordship explained to the Synod the remarkable work which is going on in Mexico, where no less than 71 congregations of the reformed Church of Jesus have been gathered out from the long and deeply benighted Romish population of that State—many eminent, learned and eloquent priests of the Roman Communion having been led from an earnest study of the Scriptures to throw themselves heartily into the movement, and the Republican Government having placed at the disposal of these reformed congregations some of the most splendid Church edifices which had for centuries been the witnesses of Romish worship. He alluded to the imminent personal perils, as well as sacrifice, to which Dr. Riley had subjected himself in undertaking the conduct of this wondrous movement which he characterized as the grandest and most important that had stirred the Church since the Reformation.

Both of the visitors from the Sister Church were welcomed with the utmost cordiality to seats in the Synod, and made brief acknowledgments of the courtesy extended to them.

#### Suspension of Rules of Order.

#### The Bishop's Address.

His Lordship the Bishop then delivered his Annual Charge to the Synod as follows:—

BELOVED BRETHREN,—

Most cordially do I welcome you once more to this our annual Council, in the name of our Lord, and meet you in the fullness of the blessing of the Gospel of Christ. May God the Holy Ghost be present in our midst, to bless and sanctify us in all our deliberations; may He further us with His continual help, that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Him

we may glorify His holy name, and finally, by His mercy, obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### DIOCESAN MISSIONS.

The missionary work of the Diocese has ever engaged my most anxious thoughts and care, and while deeply regretting to learn that we have fallen short of our income this year—with some \$300—I feel truly thankful that, by the judicious and careful management of our Standing Committee, we have been enabled not only to maintain our existing missionary staff, without diminishing their income, but we have a small surplus in hand to meet somewhat the growing demands of our mission field.

There are, however, as you are aware from previous statements made in my former addresses to you, large portions of our Diocesan territories where very many thousands of our scattered settlers are still deprived of the services of our beloved Church. If we are successfully to meet all the requirements of our mission field, greater, more strenuous and more systematic efforts must be made in every Parish throughout the Diocese to replenish and increase the Lord's Treasury. If every Parish did its duty in this respect we should not have had a deficiency to record. It is but right, however, to recognize the fact, with gratitude to God, that of the many Parishes whose contributions unite to form our Mission Fund, the clergy and laity



generally give gratifying evidence that their heart's sympathy is with us in this and in every other department of the Church's work, and that in all their doings they are actuated by the highest principles of Christian love.

#### PAROCHIAL EFFORTS.

There are happy considerations connected with local parochial efforts, which have of late been put forth in almost every Parish and Mission throughout the Diocese, unparalleled in our previous history, for which we ought to thank God and take courage. Handsome churches have been, and are being, built; expensive organs have replaced poor ones; old churches and parsonages have been renewed or improved; new parsonages have been erected or purchased; debts on church property have been reduced or entirely liquidated, and last, though not least, Missionary Parishes have been erected into Synodical Rectories. All these things tell their own tale—give incontrovertible evidence of a living, active ministry—and demonstrate that our clergy and laity do not suffer the "hard times" to impede them in their zeal for God's work. The statistics also show a healthy increase in the number of communicants.

#### THE CLERGY.

I feel truly thankful to God that none have been removed by death during the past year. Our numbers on our clerical roll have increased.

In reviewing our Diocesan work since we last met in Synod, we shall, no doubt, find much cause for deep humiliation before God that we have done so little for that gracious Master, who gave His own precious life for us. Still, it would be very ungrateful were we not to acknowledge here, with adoring gratitude, the signal proofs of His favor to us as a Church and a Diocese. The Diocese has sensibly advanced in material strength, and, I can truly say, also, in spiritual vigor, health and life, as I have had, from time to time, abundant opportunity of observing in my visitations. I hail with profound thankfulness every symptom of a livelier apprehension by our people of God's truth and love, as manifested in Christ Jesus our Lord, and I pray for a still larger increase of "faith, hope and charity" among all our people, that will redound to God's glory, the extension of Christ's Kingdom, and the well-being of our fellow-men.

## OUR WESTERN UNIVERSITY.

Another and a very important matter to which I would draw your attention is that of education—the intellectual and spiritual training of the younger members of the community, that they may become fitted hereafter to worthily fill important positions in the Church or State, and successfully and faithfully to discharge the different duties to which in God's providence they may be called. It must be confessed that in whatever respects the Church, as a body, may have been successful in this Dominion, she has done very little—and in this Diocese, as such, positively nothing—in establishing suitable educational institutions to imprint her Protestant and Evangelical principles upon the growing intelligence of the population.

When we call to mind the immense influence exerted in the mother country in England in moulding the growth of the country, and note the eagerness with which all other leading denominations around us are entering upon the work of education, and the admirable institutions they have established, we cannot but experience a certain sense of humiliation that the Church of England, who was wont elsewhere to be in the van of every such enterprise, should in this important and rapidly-developing Diocese be content to leave the field to others. I think, brethren, that such of you, who have given the subject of education your careful and prayerful considerations, will agree with me that there is no time to be lost in connexion with this all-important subject. Every year that is lost is simply affording an additional opportunity to others more active than ourselves to take possession of the field we ought to occupy. In this sense delay is indeed dangerous, for we are letting another generation slip from us, which, trained in accordance with the pure uncompromising principles of our martyred reformers, would be of material assistance to us in the prosecution of every good work.

It should be a matter of deep and special concern to us as a Church and Diocese, to be in a position to send forth not only sound and faithful ministers of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, but men of high culture and training, able intellectually to cope with error in all its varied forms; to go forth like Masters in Israel and powerful champions of "the truth as it is in Jesus."

Nor can I feel that there is anything unsuitable, brethren, in my taking advantage of this place and occasion to press

these matters upon your earnest consideration. If ever work fell within the category of Church work, surely it is just such as that to which I have referred; whilst with respect to myself, the fact that I have now for more than a quarter of a century been identified, more or less, with educational efforts, may be regarded at least as a guarantee that I feel the full importance of the subject for which I claim your sympathy and consideration.

Most of you are no doubt aware that I have been waited upon by the Very Rev. the Principal of Huron College, by Professor Halpin and by the Alumni of Huron College; and in an earnest loyal address which reflects the greatest credit upon those who presented it, have been solicited to place myself at the head of a movement for establishing in this city a first-class University, to which the Huron College shall become affiliated, and in which the young men of this section of the country shall find that sound religious and high intellectual training which shall qualify for professional life, and in connexion with which they should receive that public imprimatur and scholarship which are usually considered to attend the conferring of a degree. The very fact that this movement has been inaugurated by the Professors and Alumni of Huron College is in itself full of significance and encouragement. At its inception by the late revered Bishop the enterprise to establish Huron College was, as many of us well remember, contemptuously spoken of by some, ridiculed by others and discouraged by not a few as a futile undertaking that will utterly fail and come to naught; yet, mark the result of the effort. We have acquired the Huron College property, worth now about \$40,000; the Divinity and Classical chairs well and securely endowed, besides a few scholarships, and within the short period of fourteen years the College has furnished the Diocese with not less than fifty efficient and faithful ministers of the Gospel—men who by this very act in which they are engaged, and by their generous self-denying liberality, are proving themselves abreast of the times, and fully alive to the spiritual and educational requirements of the country in which their lot is cast. And here I may reiterate what I said in my reply to the address presented to me by the professorial staff and the alumni of Huron College:—"That during the period of fourteen years which have elapsed since the opening of Huron College, the progress of this portion of the Province has been very remarkable"—more so than in any other portion of Ontario. In

the year 1861 the population of the Diocese of Huron amounted to 472,745; in 1871, to 600,500; and, calculating the increase at the same ratio during the last six years, we may fairly compute the present population of our Diocese to be about 700,000! The district constituting the Diocese comprises 13 counties, 148 townships of 12,000 square miles, with numerous flourishing towns and villages, and a population larger than that of the present Diocese of Toronto.

The population of the city of London now is larger than that of Toronto when the Provincial University was first established there.

Our body, as a church, feels the necessity there is in the progressive increase of its work of developing the facilities of our local institutions for adequately meeting the demand for more laborers in Christ's vineyard. Encouraging as has been the work of Huron College, yet with its present limited professorial staff, it is imperfect to meet the requirements of our young men, who are aspiring to obtain that high literary training, coupled with a sound theological course, which will enable them successfully to combat the dangerous tendencies of "a philosophy, falsely so called." I am confident that the people, generally, of this part of the Province, irrespective of denominational differences, would aid us in efforts of this kind, which would place within the reach of their sons the like advantages which other parts of the Province—especially Toronto—so favorably enjoy. It is a mere question of money after all. If the means are afforded us, of establishing a University in this Diocese, presided over by godly and learned men from the Universities of the mother country, you would have, in a few years, men coming from such a seat of learning, well and soundly trained in theology and science, who would supply the very want so much felt among us. If we want godly and scholarly men to train our young men, we must adopt the proper and best means for that end. I know we shall be met with the usual argument, by such whose contributions generally consist of throwing difficulties in the way—and that without grudging—"The times are too hard, and the members of the Church of England too poor to contribute to such a work, &c., &c." I unhesitatingly say that I am not of that opinion. While I am ready to admit that there are occasional periods when every country is suffering more or less from financial stringency; yet when I look around me and consider the



marvellous resources of the country and the prosperity of our people generally, I can see no sign of the justice of such remarks, so long as I see the splendid structures which are being reared, and the corresponding way they are furnished, in every part of the country. I feel sure that our people are as well off and as willing to aid as other denominations that stand beside us, and who have made provision for the higher training of their ministers. I would put it to the common sense of our people; I would not speak of the higher aspect of the question—I would not say a word more about our common duty to labor for the glory of God and for the extension of Christ's Kingdom in its purity—but I would put it upon the question of self-interest, and I would say boldly and fearlessly, that there is no form of expenditure which we could indulge in that would yield us as good a return to the Church as giving our clergy a sound Scriptural and a high literary education.

I am quite conscious of many difficulties in our way to consummate this undertaking.

Has there ever been any great and noble enterprise that had not had its difficulties to meet and to overcome?

Difficulties should never deter us from doing a work which we trust will redound to God's glory, and for the extension of Christ's Kingdom.

We thank God for the manifestation of the intense earnestness already evinced in the cause by many, and we have no fear for the issue in view of such an array of noble, earnest-working and self-denying friends. Once more, I feel my spirit stirred within me to resume, and if spared, God willing, to complete the work which I have been enabled, by God's help, to advance up to the present position. Nor do I doubt that I shall be ably supported, or that I shall fail in securing the needed assistance in our efforts to establish a great and good University.

When I think of our many friends on both sides the Atlantic, some of whom have already promised to aid us in our undertaking, I feel I can go forth with a good courage to the work before us, in the name of the Lord.

Beloved brethren of the clergy and laity, we look to you for sympathy; we need your prayers, your influence and your substantial sympathy, and we feel sure you will not withhold these when the occasion calls, and that before long, with God's blessing, the "Western University" will be an accomplished



fact, over which we may be able to rejoice and heartily give thanks to God.

A few days ago I received the following letter from the Secretary of the Alumni of Huron College:—

LONDON, ONT., June 16, 1877.

MY DEAR LORD BISHOP,—I feel sure that your Lordship will be gratified to learn that very cheering progress is being made in the work of obtaining subscriptions towards the Western University. Our Sec.-Treasurer, Rev. Rural Dean Logan, reports having obtained since commencing his canvass upwards of \$30,000. Of this amount London has already contributed the sum of \$13,000, and considering that the work is only fairly commenced, we are encouraged to hope that London will double the amount already subscribed. Mr. Logan also reports having met with the utmost kindness and encouragement from those upon whom he has called.

We feel confident that, with God's blessing, success will speedily crown our efforts.

The Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Huron.

I need hardly say how greatly I am cheered and encouraged by this report. Let us thank God and take courage.

In conclusion, beloved brethren, let me say that it is to me an occasion of great joy to be permitted once more to greet you as fellow-laborers in the best of causes. Accept the assurance of my hearty sympathy with you in all your labors and efforts for the good of souls. As we have met here to do what in us lies to maintain and extend the Kingdom of our God, so I trust that the fruit of our united deliberations will be seen and felt, that when we separate to our respective spheres of duty each will carry with him the feeling that some fresh spring of spiritual power has been opened up in his heart, and some new ground discovered of attachment and loyalty to our Scriptural, Protestant and Evangelical branch of the Church of Christ.

Let us understand that we have met here, not merely to legislate for the good government of the Church—making or altering canons, as circumstances may require—but for the great end and purpose how best to promote God's glory and the salvation of our fellow-men. Every other object, however excellent, every other result of our synodical gatherings is insignificant compared with this great aim.

I beseech you, then, beloved brethren, "let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus." Let us strive and pray for that spirit of heavenly aspirations in all our doings. Such a spirit—under God—will more than all else save us from error

and ignorance, pride and prejudice, and knit us together in unity of spirit, in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life.

"Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy to the only wise God our Saviour be glory and majesty, dominion and power both now and ever. Amen."

The Synod having resumed business,

#### Presenting Reports.

Mr. John Beard presented the Report of the Committee on the Superannuation of Rectors, and gave notice that he would move its adoption on the next day.

The Committee appointed to prepare a canon on the superannuation, when necessary, of the incumbents of what are known as Government rectories, beg to report their recommendation that in future appointments to these, as well as other endowed parishes, it is desirable that the incumbents shall be subject to the provisions for superannuation which may be in force in the Diocese, such additional provision being made out of the rectorial income of the parish of which the clergyman in question may have been incumbent at the time of his superannuation as the Synod shall think proper.

As this latter provision cannot be effected without an act of Parliament, your Committee recommend that authority be given for an application for an act to enable this to be done.

#### Sunday School Committee.

The Rev. W. H. Tilley presented the Report\* of the Committee on Sunday Schools, with notice that he would move, tomorrow, that it be adopted.

The Sunday School Committee desires to report that through the continued generosity of the S. P. C. K. and R. T. S. it has been able materially to assist in furnishing libraries for the S. Schools in the Diocese. Since the visit of the Bishop to England, last season, and by means of his representations to the Secretaries of the Societies even more favorable terms than those of last year have been granted, and we feel that the renewed thanks of the Synod are due for valuable aid.

The purchase money expended by the Depository amounted to \$696.76, which will represent a free grant to the schools of even a larger sum. On the books already imported, the S. P. C. K. have made a discount of 50 per cent. and the R. T. S. a discount of 62½ per cent.

Acting on the authority granted at the last session of Synod, a remnant of stock from former years, none of which was available for library purposes, has been disposed of for \$50.

The Committee is about to open negotiations with the Church of England Sunday School Institute for the purpose of securing samples of their Liturgic publications and all Sunday School requisites, and we hope thereby to induce greater uniformity in the conduct of our schools. The Rev. W. F. Campbell still continues to discharge the duties connected with the management of the Depository, and the Committee feels that the thanks of the Synod are due for his painstaking and faithful aid.

The balloting papers were then distributed to the Clerical and Lay members of the Synod.

The Bishop adjourned the Synod at 5 o'clock to meet tomorrow, and pronounced the benediction.

## SECOND DAY.

Wednesday, June 20, 1877.

The Litany was said in the Chapter House at 9 o'clock.

The Synod assembled in the same place at a quarter to 10 o'clock.

The Bishop in the Chair.

The minutes of yesterday's proceedings were read by the

Clerical Secretary, and being approved by the Synod, were signed by the Chairman.

#### Presenting Memorials and Petitions.

The Clerical Secretary read a memorial addressed to the Synod by the Dominion Alliance for the total suppression of the Liquor Traffic. (*See Appendix H.*)

The Bishop briefly addressed the Synod on this subject of Temperance. He thought that the Church should not merely encourage the efforts of those who are seeking to combat the evils of intemperance, but should set a prominent example in dealing with this vital question. He avowed himself a total abstainer, and acknowledged the benefit he had experienced from the practice. Referring to the bold and active part taken by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York in advocating the Temperance cause, he expressed the conviction that the Church of England had by this espousal and avowal of abstaining principles commended herself to the working people of England, the operatives and navvies, and the dissenting bodies more powerfully than by any other measure she could have adopted. He earnestly trusted that a strong resolution would be passed by the Synod endorsing the action of the Dominion Alliance.

The Lay Secretary read a letter received from a member of the Vestry of St. John's Church, Brussels, objecting to the validity of the election of the Lay Representative for that congregation.

The Bishop referred this communication to the Committee on Lay Certificates to report upon.

IX. *Resolved*—That whereas we, the members of the Synod of Huron, having learned that the authorities of the G. W. R. Company have commenced the running of a Sunday Excursion train on their road from London to Port Stanley, desire to place on record our expression of surprise and of deep regret that such should have been done by the manager of the road; and we hereby direct that the Secretaries of this Synod do convey our remonstrance on the subject to Mr. Broughton, the General Manager at Hamilton, urging him to command that it be at once discontinued, because of its pernicious effects upon the community generally. And we hereby also give utterance to our sympathy

with the citizens of London on this question, and our cordial support of the measures taken by them in the City Hall, at the mass meeting held on Monday evening of the present week, and presided over by his Worship the Mayor of London. *Carried.*

**Address to the Bishop.**

The following address to the Lord Bishop was read to his Lordship by Judge Kingsmill on behalf of the members of the Synod whose names are attached:—

*To the Right Rev. I. Hellmuth, D. D., D. C. L., Lord Bishop of Huron:—*

MY LORD,—We, the undersigned members of the Synod, desire most heartily to congratulate your Lordship on the prosperous condition of the Diocese; as set forth in your annual address. We rejoice that you have again enunciated those Protestant and Evangelical principles for which the fathers of our Reformed Church suffered martyrdom, and which, since your Lordship's advent to this country—more than 30 years ago—you have ever maintained and set forth, in public and in private, and through good and evil report. We are thankful that God has put it into your Lordship's heart to give your strength to what we will regard, when consummated, as the crowning act of your life—the establishment of a University and University College, for the instruction in evangelical truth of the future Clergy of the Diocese, as well as providing for the educational wants of Western Canada. Those of us who have been connected with Huron College can bear testimony to the zeal with which your Lordship ever sought to teach and have taught these same precious truths, and to drive out all contrary doctrines from those honored halls, and we have every confidence that such will be the case with the teaching of the Western University College. He regarded as very providential his meeting with Bishop Lee, of Delaware, in New Orleans, on his return from witnessing the work carried on by Dr. Riley, which was the means of bringing him into contact with this grand and blessed movement going on in Mexico.

Dr. Riley having been invited into the house, the Bishop presented him, in behalf of the Synod, with the whole amount of the Foreign Mission Fund at their disposal.

Rev. Dr. Riley in thanking the Synod most heartily for their warm sympathy with his work and the generous aid they had granted to the struggling and persecuted Church of Jesus in Mexico, said "what you have done to-day will greatly move the Anglican Church."

The Rev. Canon Townley, D. D. being about to leave the Diocese, after a ministry in it of upwards of 22 years, addressed the Synod in a few words of affectionate farewell.

#### COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

The Rev. W. H. Tilley presented the following :—

The Committee appointed to give expression to the views of the Synod upon the subject of temperance, in connexion with the Memorial of the Dominion Alliance, beg to report as follows :—

That this Synod fully agrees with the Memorial of the Dominion Alliance as to the deplorable amount of drunkenness in the country, and the advisability of resorting to some feasible method for the suppression of the excessive use of intoxicating liquors ;

That it heartily sympathizes with the Alliance in its efforts towards procuring a better state of things, and fully endorses the utterances of his Lordship as to the position which the Church of England should assume upon this important question.

We beg therefore to recommend the organization, in the several parishes of the Diocese, of Associations formed after the model of the "Church of England Temperance Societies" in the mother Church—societies including all who are anxious to co-operate in the temperance movement, whether total abstainers or not.

In adjourning the Synod the Bishop remarked, with deep thankfulness to God, upon the Christian spirit of unity which had pervaded the whole proceedings of the session—those members who had taken an active part had shown that they were actuated by the highest motive. He acknowledged the liberality which had been extended towards the Church, in spite of

the commercial depression of the times—a liberality which was evidenced in the large number of Churches—some of them very costly structures, which had been recently erected or were in course of erection throughout the Diocese. On all sides there were evidences of the prosperous condition of the Diocese, which should act as an encouraging stimulus to our efforts.

Commending the activity, energy, and earnestness displayed by both Clergy and Laity in forwarding the work of Church, he dismissed them from their labours with the prayer that the blessing of God the Holy Spirit might accompany them to their respective fields of duty and abide with them, their families and their charges.

The Clerical Secretary's notes of the day's business having been read and approved, were signed by the Chairman.

The Bishop pronounced the benediction and adjourned the Synod at 1 p. m.

## Annual Diocesan Missionary Meeting.

The annual missionary meeting in connexion with the Synod of the Diocese of Huron was held in St. Paul's Church, London, on Tuesday evening, June 19, 1877. The Lord Bishop of Huron in the chair.

Prayer having been offered up by Ven. Archdeacon Sweatman, the opening hymn—"The Church's One Foundation"—was sung.

The Chairman briefly referred to the object which had brought them together, and commended missionary effort to their sympathy and support. He promised them interesting addresses from the speakers of the evening.

The Bishop further stated that he had met the Right Rev. Dr. Lee, Bishop of Delaware, in New Orleans, when he was returning from a visit of observation and inquiry to the infant Church of Mexico. His Lordship said he was so delighted and excited by the account of Bishop Lee, that were he a young man, he would at once have offered himself to aid in the perilous, but glorious work of preaching to the persecuted followers of Jesus in Mexico. He considered the mission now prospering in that part of the world, the greatest in connexion with the Church of Christ since the reformation of the 16th Century, and that it was of even greater value and importance than that of the old Catholics in Germany.

Rev. Dr. Riley, Bishop elect of Mexico, then gave an address on "The Church's Work in Mexico."

Rev. Dr. Riley, who is a native of South America, and speaks with a strong Spanish accent, although wonderfully distinct, is about 50 years of age. He has since early in life been engaged in missionary work, and has often been in great danger of losing his life through his outspoken advocacy of purity of Gospel preaching.

The reverend gentleman spoke for a short time on the grand opportunities which at present are afforded to the Church to Christianize the millions who are yet ignorant of the Gospel in its purity. The land of which he was to speak inherited not the open Bible, but the Inquisition. Therefore, the facts which he was to state should be known throughout the Anglican communion. Fourteen years ago, a large quantity of Spanish Bibles were sent across the Atlantic from England to Mexico. These Bibles had a strange welcome. One of them fell into the hands of a Roman Catholic Priest, a very learned man of the Order of the Franciscan Monks. A spirit of inquiry was aroused in his heart, and he asked, "Why is the Bible kept from my ignorant fellow countrymen?" The great truth of God came with all power upon him. He felt he belonged to a Church which had wandered far away from the simple primitive Church. What was that priest to do with such a burning conviction on his soul? He left the body, and energetically set to work and distributed the Bibles sent out, and through his agency thousands of Bibles were circulated throughout the length and breadth of Mexico. Speedily a little band of Christians, resolved to worship God in simplicity, were got together; but what could they do in a land so over-run with idolatry and superstition? They had not one church building in which to worship. Still, the former Roman Catholic priest got together a number of earnest students of the Word, although they met at the risk of their lives. Time wore on, and the former priest, after ministering to his flock faithfully for several years, went where the wicked cease from troubling and the weary are at rest. What was the little band of Christians to do? They sent a messenger to the United States, and the touching cry was heard by the Episcopal body of that Republic. It was resolved to extend a helping hand to the persecuted but persevering band. The delegate nominated to go to Mexico to see what could be done for the Church went to

Washington and conferred with Secretary Seward to see whether it would be safe to go, as if personal safety ought to be considered when the Master calls! Secretary Seward gave it as his opinion that it would be dangerous to attempt any such work. He (Dr. Riley) being born and educated in South America, and Spanish being his native tongue, was prepared to sympathise with the work, knowing the circumstances of his countrymen in Mexico. He knew a great work could be done there; and so, in 1869, he found himself on the shores of that beautiful tropical country, with its palm trees and luxuriant vegetation; its table lands, 7,000 feet above the level of the sea, on which is perpetual spring, and snow-capped mountains, towering high above them. On these table lands stands the beautiful city of Mexico. Many are the magnificent buildings in this city, which has so chequered a history; but towering high above them all stands the majestic Cathedral of Mexico, the grandest church in the world. He was heartily welcomed by the Christians of Mexico, and shortly after his arrival he received a message from the then President, Benito Juarez, that he would give him (Dr. Riley) all the assistance he required to prosecute his work, stating that he took a deep interest in it, and adding that the necessary protection would be given to the missionary. Ere many months had elapsed, he had placed at his services a magnificent stone building, formerly used as a Convent Church of the Dominican friars. There are now about three hundred of these buildings standing empty, throughout Mexico, in consequence of their being rendered vacant by the suppression of the Jesuits, and the government offer them for sale at a very moderate rate. A society was formed to try and get the Church suppressed, but with no avail. Going home one evening, he found a letter under his door, announcing that six men had been appointed to assassinate him, if he persisted in his work. He resolved to persevere, notwithstanding the threat, and shortly thereafter published a pamphlet, stating the position which the Church occupied, and the grounds on which it claimed the sympathy of all. A very gifted Dominican friar, who had been denouncing the Protestants in the cathedral with all the marked eloquence and vigor which his great learning enabled him to do, took home the pamphlet, read it, and felt convinced he was in error. The friar resolved to search the Scriptures thoroughly before taking final action. He employed himself in this manner for many months. He met him (Dr. Riley) in the Protestant Church, and said, "Like Paul, I am persuaded I have been persecuting the Church of Christ." The result was that when the chapel attached to the building first given over to the Protestants was opened, the church being crowded in every portion, the former Dominican friar was the preacher of the day. When this became known, the body to which the friar formerly belonged forgot their threats in their fears. The influence of their Church had spread far and wide throughout that great Republic, thousands of Bibles had been circulated, and little congregations had sprung up all over the land, until there are now no fewer than 71 Liberal congregations thoroughly recognized in Mexico, in which the Gospel is faithfully preached in its simplicity. But a work like this, accomplished in such a land, could not be done without much suffering. He gave numerous instances in which the adherents of the doctrines of the Church had suffered death in consequence of their standing true to their principles. No less than thirteen graves can be shown throughout Mexico in which rest the ashes of martyrs who had died for the sake of their Christian faith. But at this hour the open Bible had triumphed, so that the victory was great. He spoke of the great persecution with which the Church in Mexico had met, stating that under such circumstances the ministers and members there needed the sympathy of the Anglican Church in England, the United States, and in Canada. He read an urgent petition which had been sent him from members of the Church in Pueblo City since he came to New York, urgently requesting help to have public divine worship again organized in that city. He had not been able to answer this petition, owing

to lack of funds. He concluded with an earnest appeal for help to make the open Bible triumphant. He knew the work which the Church of England had done for the world; it had met him when a boy in his far distant home in Chili, and he knew if the facts he had now detailed were known throughout the British Empire, they would have abundant assistance for the Spanish Church, which desired to act with the Church of England in spreading the Gospel in its purity.

In conclusion, Dr Riley spoke of the hopeful prospects of the Church in Mexico. Many church buildings had been offered to them; and young men are coming forward, and offering their services as missionaries. Here is a splendid opportunity for the spread of the Gospel, and he trusted that the struggle for Christianity and an open Bible in that land of revolutions—a struggle which might completely change the character of the populace—would be successful, and that thereby they might be enabled to extend the Bible to other Spanish countries. With that object in view, he commended the work to their sympathy, their prayers and their aid.

The anthem—"Remember now thy Creator"—was then sung by the Choir of St. Paul's.

The Chairman then introduced Rev. Dr. H. C. Potter, Rector of Grace Church, New York. His subject was "Mission Work," and his address was a powerful and eloquent appeal for support of missionary endeavor. He began by referring to the antecedents of the previous speaker. His father was an American merchant, who went to Chili, and stayed for fourteen or fifteen years, thus rendering his son (the previous speaker) more a Spanish citizen than an American; thus Providence had prepared him for the great work which he was now accomplishing. He praised the work of Dr. Riley, and would much like to strengthen his hands by proposing a resolution to the meeting, viz:—

*Resolved*, That this meeting hereby commissions the Bishop of Huron to represent the interests of the Church in Mexico, during his approaching visit to England, to attend the Pan-Anglican Synod.

A hearty chorus of "ayes" greeted the resolution, when it was put. The speaker then proceeded, in an illustrative way, to speak of the difficulties which the Church had to encounter in her domestic missions in the endeavor to Christianize the Germans, Negroes, Indians and Chinamen in the United States. He thought the latter had been brought to the United States, so that they might be Christianized, and many of their number sent back with the Gospel to their benighted brethren in China. He spoke of the beautiful Liturgy of the Church of England, and its adaptation to the wants of humanity. Still, they needed a higher power than that to insure success.

The speaker concluded by entreating the prayers and earnest sympathies of his hearers for all true missionary work for the cause of Christ.

The Bishop expressed his hearty assent to the improvised resolution of Dr. Potter, and said further that he would bring the subject of the Church in Mexico before the approaching Provincial Synod.

Hymn No. 92—"Hills of the North Rejoice"—was then sung, after which a collection was made in aid of the Mission Fund of the Diocese.

The Doxology was then sung and the Lord Bishop pronounced the benediction.

THE FINANCIAL REPORT

OF THE

Standing Committee of the Diocese of Huron

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1877.

[Being the third under the Act of Incorporation.]

---

At the close of another Financial year the Standing Committee in presenting their Annual Report desire to acknowledge with grateful thanks the continued blessings of their Heavenly Father upon the labours of the Church in this Diocese.

In common with almost all other Religious and Benevolent Societies both in Canada and the mother country, the Synod has had to experience the effects of the long continued depression in trade and commerce. In Canada also we have had to contend against what always affects most seriously our work in this country—a harvest considerably below the average.

In the face of these difficulties it is pleasing to know that we have been able, by God's help, to hold on our way without incurring a fresh debt, and the Committee feel that grateful acknowledgements are due to those members of our beloved Church who have helped her so generously during the past year in the midst of their own financial difficulties.

The Committee are convinced that it must be a source of deep thankfulness to those friends of the cause of Christ to know that their efforts are crowned with success and that the Church of England in the Diocese of Huron has been able to carry on such a great and blessed work. It is an evidence to all that she will always be ready in the future, as in the past, "earnestly to

c

contend for the faith once delivered to the Saints" and to promote the extension of God's Kingdom in all its purity and in accordance with those principles of the Reformation for which so many of her martyrs shed their blood.

#### THE MISSION FUND.

Notwithstanding that the income of this Fund for the past year was some \$767 less than that of the previous year, the Committee by judicious management of the expenditure have not exceeded the annual income.

The estimated amount required to be expended from this Fund for the coming year is about \$13,900.

The Committee would urge upon the Synod the importance of having an annual revision of the Mission Fund Pay List, so that a proper economy and an equitable distribution of the Fund may always be maintained.

#### SUPERANNUATION.

Under the provisions of the recent Canon on the surplus Commutation Fund, the Committee have been able to provide for the support of six of our Superannuated Clergy, involving an expenditure of \$2,516.69.

The estimated claim on this Fund for this purpose during the present year will be \$2,748.

It is gratifying to know that the Diocese of Huron has taken the foremost place in our Canadian Church in making suitable provision for those of her ministers whose age or infirmity entitles them to her sympathy and protecting care.

#### THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The number of widows on the Pension List is now eleven, one having been recently removed by death.

The stated collections for this Fund during the year amounted to \$1,261.63, being \$104.15 less than last year. The condition, however, of this important Fund should afford great satisfaction to the Diocese at large. Since 1871 the capital has been steadily increasing from \$34,000 until it has now reached the large amount of \$50,000, and the Committee have every confidence, under God, in its future success and prosperity.

Some amendments, to facilitate the working of the existing Canon of this Fund have been prepared and recommended by the Standing Committee, and will be presented to the Synod in due course.

#### ANNUAL MISSIONARY MEETINGS.

The Committee regret that the amount of collections made at these meetings has fallen short of last year's efforts by \$69.70.

One hundred and sixty-two meetings were held.



The Committee earnestly recommend that every effort be put forth to keep up the interest of these meetings, believing as they do that by God's blessing they can be made the means of creating and stirring up a more lively zeal and sympathy for the noble cause of mission work so successfully carried on by our beloved Church.

In these days of activity it is especially desirable that our members should be made acquainted with the mission work in foreign lands, and the evidence of the last two years shows that our people gladly avail themselves of the opportunity afforded of acquiring information on these subjects.

## DAY OF THANKSGIVING.

The collections made on this day have been applied as directed by the Synod, to defray the amount guaranteed by this Diocese towards the annual stipend of the Missionary Bishop of Algoma.

One hundred and twenty-two congregations contributed \$679.33 to this collection, being \$150.73 less than the previous year.

## FOREIGN MISSIONS.

In accordance with the vote of last Synod the balance then on hand, \$508.01, was distributed equally between the missionary Dioceses of Rupert's Land and Algoma.

The collections on the Day of Intercessory Prayer appointed by the House of Bishops to be held in November, 1876, was in accordance with their Pastoral given to the Diocese of Algoma. The total amount collected was \$241.25, being an increase for this year of \$123.04.

A special collection of \$48.67 was also contributed to the African Mission Work by the Hellmuth Ladies' College Missionary Association.

## THE DEPOSITORY.

Owing to the liberal arrangements made by the S. P. C. K. and the Religious Tract Society the Committee have been enabled to greatly facilitate the purchase of books for Sunday School libraries and prizes at prices considerably less than ever before offered to the Diocese.

Some \$696 has been expended in this way through the agency of the Synod, and a goodly number of schools supplied with excellent books.

Your Committee cordially recommend the different Parishes that may require books to avail themselves of the privileges afforded them by these Societies.

## FIRST MEETING OF STANDING COMMITTEE.

Your Committee would suggest that it be made an order of business for the Synod to convene the newly elected Standing Committee at an appointed time



during the session of Synod for the purpose of organizing and appointing any necessary sub-committees, that may be required to take action before the first regular quarterly meeting in September.

## ACCOUNTS.

The audited accounts, published as usual, show the position of the various Funds and the amount of invested capital.

The Secretary-Treasurer having applied for an increase of his salary, the Standing Committee recommend that his application be granted and that his salary be \$1,600 per annum from the 1st of April, 1877.

## DOMINION ALLIANCE

FOR THE

### TOTAL SUPPRESSION OF THE LIQUOR TRAFFIC.

OTTAWA, June 1st, 1877.

*To the Presiding Officer and Members of the Synod of the Diocese of Huron  
in Annual Session convened,—*

In the name and by authority of the Dominion Alliance for the total suppression of the Liquor Traffic, we desire respectfully to bring anew under the attention of the religious bodies of this Dominion those great interests in which we feel a common concern, and with which the truest welfare alike of the Church and country is intimately wrapt up.

We doubt not but that during your present session you will renew the testimony which for a succession of years have been borne against the enormous evils of intemperance. We feel assured that every year gives increasing force to your conviction, as it does to our own, that it is the chief cause of poverty, crime, disease and premature death throughout the land; that it is the principal occasion of discipline throughout the churches; and that there exists no more formidable obstacle to the spread of the gospel amongst us.

We are convinced that you will hail with satisfaction every well designed and well directed effort to arrest the progress of intemperance; that you will counsel the employment of moral suasion, and the exhibition of consistent example with this view on the part of the office-bearers and members of your churches; that you deplore equally with ourselves the sanction given by the public authorities to a traffic fraught with effects so disastrous, and will be prepared to co-operate with us in endeavoring to secure its abridgment and, as soon as it can be attained, its utter abolition.

The principles on which this Alliance is founded are these:—

1. That it is neither right nor politic for the Government to afford legal protection and sanction to any traffic or system that tends to increase crime, to waste the resources of the Dominion, to corrupt the social habits, and to destroy the health and lives of the people.
2. That the traffic in intoxicating liquors as common beverages is inimical to the true interest of individuals, and destructive of the order and welfare of society and ought therefore to be prohibited.
3. That the history and results of all legislation in regard to the liquor traffic abundantly prove that it is impossible satisfactorily to limit or regulate a system so essentially mischievous in its tendencies.
4. That no consideration of private gain or public revenue can justify the upholding of a system so utterly wrong in principle, suicidal in policy, and disastrous in results, as the Traffic in Intoxicating Liquors.

5. That the Legislative Prohibition of the Liquor Traffic is perfectly compatible with national liberty, and with the claims of justice and legitimate commerce.
6. That the Legislative Prohibition of the Liquor Traffic would be highly conducive to the development of a progressive civilization.
7. That, rising above sectarian and party considerations, all good citizens should combine to procure an enactment, prohibiting the manufacture and sale of intoxicating beverages, as affording most efficient aid in removing the appalling evils of intemperance.

We trust that these principles may commend themselves to your enlightened judgment.

Our Alliance is not designed to supplant, but rather to supplement the efforts of temperance organizations, and to unify and systematize their efforts especially in the direction of wholesome legislation.

We are endeavoring by conferences, by public meetings, by the diffusion of a sound literature, and otherwise, to form and to foster a healthy public sentiment on the subject, while keeping steadily before us the bringing that sentiment to bear in the most direct and forcible manner upon our Legislature.

We have many grounds for encouragement, the tide of opinion is setting in more steadily than ever in the direction of our aims and aspirations, yet the necessity for patient and persistent agitation increases in proportion. We are therefore particularly anxious to secure the sympathy and support of all churches.

Praying that the Master of assemblies may bless your deliberations and establish the work of our hands,

The said incorporated Synod shall consist of the Bishop of the said Diocese who shall be the head of the Synod, and any Suffragan or Coadjutor Bishop thereof, the Priests and Deacons of the same licensed by the Bishop or Suffragan, and of the lay delegates or representatives elected or to be elected according to the constitution of the said Synod, as the same existed at the time of the passing of the Act of incorporation, or as it may from time to time be altered by the said Synod after the passing of the Act; and so far as the financial affairs of the Synod are concerned, the following shall also be members thereof, that is to say, the life members of the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron, and each other member of the said Society who prior to the passing of the Act appeared on the books of the said Society as having contributed in annual subscriptions to the said Society the aggregate of fifty dollars: Provided always, that each and every of said life and other members of the Church Society seeking admission to any meeting of the Synod under the authority of this section shall, before being admitted thereto, deposit with the Secretary of the Synod, a certificate from the incumbent of the parish where such member for the time being resides, that he is eligible to be elected a lay member of the said Synod.

2. Clergymen who have been members of the Synod, but who have become superannuated, or invalidated, with the Bishop's consent, shall retain all their privileges as members of the Synod.

3. The Lay Representatives shall be communicants of at least one year's standing; and shall be elected annually, during Easter week, by each duly organized congregation, from among their own number, at a meeting legally convened; and it shall be the duty of the wardens of each congregation to provide a book in which each member of the congregation, of the full age of twenty-one years, shall subscribe his name as being a member of the United Church of England and Ireland, and as belonging to no other religious denomination; and such, and no others, shall be entitled to vote at the election of Lay Representatives. Each representative shall continue in office until his successor is appointed.

4. The Incumbent, or his assistant, shall preside at the election; and in their absence a chairman, elected by a majority of those present.

5. The number of Representatives shall be as follows:—For every congregation, *one*; when the registered voters exceed fifty, *two*; and when they exceed one hundred and fifty, *three*; and at each meeting it shall be the duty of the chairman to have the list read over, and the names of all those who have died, or who have become disqualified, shall be erased previous to the election.

6. It shall be the duty of the Secretaries to forward to each Clergyman, before Easter in each year, a copy of the Form of Certificate printed below for each Parish or Mission under his charge, and in case of a Parish or Mission being vacant, the Certificate shall be forwarded to the address of the Churchwarden.

7. If a vacancy occur by the death, removal or resignation of any Representative, the Clergyman shall proceed to hold a new election within one month, due notice being given by him during divine service, on some Sunday preceding the meeting, provided that no such election shall take place between the time that the See becomes vacant and the election of a Bishop, saving and except when a vacancy occurs by death, removal or resignation during the above interval, or within one month previous to the vacancy of the See.

8. It shall be the duty of the chairman, within six days after the election of Representatives, to send to the Secretaries of the Synod the certificate above referred to, taking care, when more than one is elected, to give the number of Registered voters. A Committee of two shall be appointed by the Bishop to act, in conjunction with the Secretaries, in the examination, some day before the meeting of Synod, of the Certificates as to election of Lay Representatives, said Committee to report on the first day of session of Synod, immediately after the election of Secretaries.

9. That the Synod shall meet annually, on the third Tuesday in June, or oftener, at the option of the Bishop.

10. Each clergyman within the Diocese shall send to the Bishop, through the Secretary-Treasurer, the name of any congregation hereafter established under his charge; describing its locality, in order that it may be recorded in the book in which a list of the congregations is kept.

11. When the Bishop is not present, he shall appoint his deputy to preside in his place. A quorum of the Synod shall consist of the Bishop, or his deputy, and not less than one-fourth of the whole number of both Clergy and Lay representatives respectively, except in case of the Synod assembling for the election of its Bishop, when the quorum shall consist of at least one-half of the Clergy and Lay Representatives respectively.

12. A Clerical and Lay Secretary shall be chosen annually by the Synod from among the members thereof, who shall remain in office until the next annual meeting of the Synod. Their duty shall be to take minutes of the proceedings of the Synod, to preserve its journals and records, to attest the public acts of the body, and faithfully to deliver into the hands of their successors all books and papers relative to the concerns of the Synod, which may be in their possession; and in case of a vacancy in the See, to summon the Synod for the election of a Bishop.

13. A Secretary-Treasurer shall be appointed by vote of Synod, whose duty it shall be to attend to all the business of the Synod when not in session, including the receipt and taking charge of all moneys belonging to the Synod under the direction of the Bishop, the Standing Committee and the officers of the Synod.

14. That the paid officers of the Synod shall be the Secretary-Treasurer and an assistant, if required, also the Auditors; and that the Secretary-Treasurer shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Bishop and the Standing Committee.

15. There shall be annually elected by the Synod, immediately after the election of the Secretaries, two Auditors, whose duties shall be to examine all accounts of the *Secretary-Treasurer*, and to report on them to the Standing Committee.

16. There shall be a Standing Committee, presided over by the Bishop, ten of whom shall form a quorum, consisting of 30 clergymen and 30 laymen, who shall be elected annually by ballot out of the members of the Synod, by each order respectively. Immediately after the election of the Standing Committee the Bishop shall appoint a time during the session of Synod at which a meeting of the Committee shall be held for the purpose of organizing and appointing any necessary sub-committees that may be required, to take action before the first regular quarterly meeting in September. It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to manage all the funds which were held by the Church Society, and administer the same in accordance with the Canons of the Synod. It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to prepare in due form all such matters as the Bishop may desire to have brought before the Synod, and all such other matters as may be forwarded to them, through the Secretary, by any member of the Synod, previous to the first day of May in each year, and to have such portions printed as may appear to them expedient; and a circular containing a statement of such business to be submitted to the Synod shall be forwarded to each Clergyman and Representative, two weeks before the meeting of the Synod, which business shall stand first in the order of the day.

17. That before the Synod shall enter upon any business at any of its meetings, the following prayers shall be said :—

PREVENT US, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favor, and further us with Thy continual help ; that in all our works begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally, by Thy mercy, obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.—AMEN.

O GOD, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we humbly beseech Thee to prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Synod, and to comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Visit with Thy favor our Sovereign QUEEN VICTORIA, and all in authority under her ; and so rule their hearts that they may in all things seek Thy honor and glory. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy ; the endeavors of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labors of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. Inspire continually the Universal Church with a spirit of truth, unity and concord ; and because it cannot continue in safety without Thy succor, preserve it evermore by Thy help and goodness ; and may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord.—AMEN.

OUR FATHER, which art in Heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation ; but deliver us from evil ; for Thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, forever and ever.—AMEN.

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED.

ALMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, we, Thine unworthy servants, do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving kindness to us and to all men ; more particularly for the providential support by which this Synod has been enabled to extend the knowledge of Thy sacred Truth. But, above all, for Thy inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son ; for the means of grace and the hope of glory which

Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end.—  
AMEN.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore.—AMEN.

18. That if any vacancy occur by death, removal or resignation of any officer, notice of such vacancy shall be given to the Standing Committee, and the Bishop shall appoint a successor until the next meeting of the Synod.

19. That the Standing Committee shall meet in London on the first Wednesday in the months of March, September and December, and in the month of June, on some day during the week in which the Synod meets; provided, however that the Bishop shall have the power of changing the time of meeting in any of the said months, if he should see good cause. A public Missionary meeting shall take place on some evening during the week in June in which the Synod meets. The Standing Committee, in case of the incapacity of the Bishop, shall have power to call a special meeting of the Synod at any time.

20. That in order more fully to promote the objects of the Synod, annual subscriptions and donations shall be collected from each congregation in such manner as shall be deemed most effective, and every endeavor made to augment the resources of the Synod. All moneys raised shall be transmitted to the Sec.-Treas.

That six collections be made annually, the proceeds of two of which shall be devoted to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and that of the other four to Missionary purposes, and at such other times and for such purposes as the Bishop may direct. The collections to be forwarded to the Sec.-Treas. of the Synod. It shall be the duty of every clergyman to give notice of these collections, and to call the attention of his congregations to the importance of the objects, and their claims for liberal support.

21. That all money shall be paid by cheques, signed by the Bishop (and in his absence, or during the vacancy of the See, by the person administering the Diocese) and countersigned by the Sec.-Treas.

22. No act or resolution shall become law without the concurrence of the Bishop, and a majority of the clergy and laity present; provided that, ordinarily, the votes of the whole Synod shall be taken collectively, but that at the desire of the Bishop, or at the request of five clergymen, or of five laymen, the votes of each of the above-named orders shall be taken separately.

23. In case of a vacancy in the See, it shall be the duty of the Secretaries of the Synod, within ten days from their knowledge of such vacancy, to give notice thereof to every Clergyman and Lay Representative; and at the same time to summon a meeting of such Clergymen and Lay Representatives, to be held at London, within six weeks, for the election of a Bishop, and to give at least one month's notice thereof. At such meeting for the election of a Bishop, the Senior Dignitary present shall take the chair, and shall vote whether there be an equality of votes or not. The Clergy and Lay Representatives present shall vote separately by ballot, and a majority of the votes of each order present shall determine the choice, provided always, that it shall be competent for such meeting to postpone the election to such further period as to them shall seem expedient.

24. Every proposition for an alteration in the Constitution of Canons of the Synod must be sent to the Standing Committee, to be forwarded to the members of the Synod, and no alteration shall take place unless agreed to by majorities of two-thirds of the Clergy and Laity respectively.

25. Each clergyman shall make an annual statistical report to the Bishop, according to the form to be supplied by the Secretary, under the Bishop's direction; which report shall be forwarded to the Bishop within one month after Easter.



26. The following objects for which the Church Society was incorporated, shall be included amongst the objects for which the Synod is incorporated:—
- FIRST.—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Huron, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.
- SECONDLY.—For the encouragement of education, and for the support of Day Schools and Sunday Schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.
- THIRDLY.—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.
- FOURTHLY.—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the Standing Committee.
- FIFTHLY.—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment and maintenance of Churches according to the establishment of the said Church in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage Houses; the setting apart of Burial Grounds and Church Yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

## APPENDIX L (2).

## ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

1. Each meeting of the Synod shall be preceded by public morning prayer; and on the first day the Holy Communion shall be administered.
2. The business of every day shall be commenced by special prayer for the Divine guidance and blessing, according to a form authorized by the Bishop.
3. After prayer, the Clerical Secretary shall call over the roll of the Clergy, as furnished by the Bishop, and mark the names of those in attendance; and the Lay Secretary shall then call over the names of the Representatives, and those present shall answer to their names.
4. The Secretaries and Auditors shall then be elected by the Synod, and they shall continue in office until their successors are appointed.
5. The Order of Business on each day shall be as follows:
  - (1) Calling the Rolls.
  - (2) Reading, correcting and approving the minutes of the previous meeting.
  - (3) Appointing Committees.
  - (4) Presenting, reading and referring memorials and petitions.
  - (5) Presenting reports of committees.
  - (6) Giving notice of motions.
  - (7) Taking up unfinished business.
  - (8) Consideration of motions.
6. An address from the Bishop shall be in order at any time.
7. The Synod shall meet each day immediately after divine service, and adjourn at one o'clock p. m.; meet again at three o'clock p. m., and adjourn at six o'clock p. m.; meet again at half-past seven o'clock p. m., and adjourn at ten o'clock p. m., unless otherwise ordered by the Bishop; and every member attending the Synod shall be in his place, and remain during each session of the Synod, and shall not leave until the final adjournment, except by permission of the Bishop or Chairman.



---

**RULES FOR THE PRESERVATION OF ORDER.**

---

1. When the Bishop or other person presiding has taken the chair, no member shall continue standing.
2. When any member is about to speak for the information of the Synod, he shall rise and address the chair.
3. No motion or amendment shall be considered as before the Synod (excepting such as may be proposed by the Bishop or Committees), unless seconded and reduced to writing; and no motion except in course, shall be considered till the succeeding day of meeting.
4. (A) No member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same subject, except by permission of the chair, save the mover of a resolution or amendment. (B) If two or more gentlemen rise to speak on a motion, the second gentleman rising, or so ruled by the Chair, shall be the next speaker on the floor of the Synod. (C) The mover of a resolution or amendment shall have the privilege of speaking a second time, after every member of the Synod who desires to speak has spoken on such motion or amendment. This shall close the debate.
5. When a question is under consideration, no other motion shall be received, unless to adjourn, to lay it on the table, to postpone it to a certain time, to postpone it indefinitely, to commit it, to amend it, or to divide on it; and motions for any of these purposes shall have precedence in the order here named.
6. Motions to adjourn, or to lay on the table, shall be decided without debate.
7. When a motion has been read to the Synod by the Secretary, it cannot be withdrawn by the mover without the consent of the chair.
8. Each member shall have the right to require, at any period of the debate, that a question in discussion be read for his information.
9. A member called to order, while speaking, shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.
- 10.—All questions of order shall be decided by the Chair.
11. When a proposed amendment is under consideration, a motion to amend the same may be made; but no further amendment to such second amendment shall be in order, until such second amendment shall have been disposed of.
12. All amendments to any question or amendment shall be decided on before the question or motion on which they rise is proposed for decision.
13. Whilst any question is being put from the Chair, the members shall continue in their seats, and shall not hold any private discourse; and when a motion is so put, no member shall retire until such motion is disposed of.

14. In voting, those who vote in the affirmative shall first rise, and then those who vote in the negative; and if required, the Yeas and Nays shall be recorded.

15. A question once determined, shall not again be drawn into discussion in the same session, without the special sanction of the Chair.

16. When the Synod is about to adjourn, every member shall keep his seat until the Bishop, or other person presiding, has left the Chair.

APPENDIX L (4).

**RULES REGARDING COMMITTEES.**

1. All Committees shall be appointed by the Chair, unless named by the Synod, and the names shall be publicly announced while the Synod is in session. At the time of appointment it shall be stated whose duty it is to convene the Committee, and in the event of this being overlooked, it shall be the duty of the first-named member to convene.

2. The Reports of Committees shall be in writing, signed by their Chairman, and shall be received in course, unless a motion be made for their recomittal.

3. The Chairman of the Committee, or some member deputed by him, shall explain to the Synod the bearing of any portion of the report, if requested by any member of the Synod.

4. All Reports of Committees, recommending any action or expression of opinion, shall be accompanied by a resolution for the action of the Synod thereon.

## CANONS OF SYNOD.

---

*Only such Canons are printed as were passed or amended at the last Session, it being intended shortly to print in pamphlet form all the Canons and the various Acts of Parliament affecting the Synod.*

### IX.—Of the Discipline of the Clergy.

SECTION I.—Every Clergyman holding any charge under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of the Diocese, shall be amenable to the Bishop for offences committed by him in the manner and according to the provisions set forth in this Canon of discipline.

SECTION II.—There shall be a standing committee of discipline appointed every third year at the annual meeting of the Synod, consisting of the Dean and Archdeacons, *ex-officio*, and of twelve Clergymen of at least ten years' standing in Priest's orders, six of whom shall be appointed by the Bishop, and six elected by ballot, with four substitutes by the Clergy, and from this committee the Board of Triers, as hereinafter provided, shall be taken; such election shall take place at the same time as the election of delegates to the Provincial Synod; provided, always, that whenever a vacancy occurs such vacancy shall be filled up by the Bishop, or in order, from the list of substitutes elected by the Clergy, as the case may be.

SECTION III.—Every Clergyman shall be liable to trial for any crime or immorality, or for any scandalous or disorderly conduct, for teaching or maintaining doctrines contrary to the teaching of Holy Scripture, as set forth in the Liturgy and Articles of the Church of England, such teaching or maintaining being by way of writing, or printing, or preaching, or teaching, or circulating



books containing such unsound doctrine; for holding service in any other Clergyman's Church or Parish without his consent; for irregularity or indecorum in the performance of divine offices; for contumacy or disrespectful conduct towards the Bishop; for the introduction of innovations and novelties in the performance of divine worship; for schism or separating himself from the communion of the Church; for discontinuing the exercise of the ministry without lawful cause; for exercising any lay profession or occupation inconsistent with his sacred calling; for living in the habitual disuse of public worship, or of the Holy Communion, or for the violation of the constitution or Canons of this Diocese.

SECTION IV.—When the Bishop shall be informed by three members of the Church or by three Presbyters, that a Clergyman is liable to trial under Section III, or whenever he shall think that the interests of the Church require it, he shall give a commission under his hand and seal, directed to three members of the Committee of Discipline, for the purpose of making enquiry as to the grounds of such charge or report; and, if possible, the accuser and the accused shall be brought face to face; but the preliminary investigation need not be in public.

The accused shall have not less than six days' notification of the time and place of such preliminary investigation, with a copy of the information laid before the Bishop.

SECTION V.—When it is decided that a trial shall be held, the presentment shall be in writing, framed by the Chancellor, addressed to the Bishop, upon the report of the Commissioners appointed for the preliminary investigation, hereinbefore provided for, specifying the offences of which the accused is alleged to be guilty, with reasonable certainty, as to time, place and circumstances.

But no proceeding shall be instituted, or complaint entertained under this Canon after one year from the time of the alleged commission of the offence. Nevertheless, when proceedings are taken under this Canon, in respect of any matter which has been the subject of inquiry and adjudication in a court of justice, the proceedings under this Canon may be commenced against a Clergyman in respect of the same matter, or of any matter arising out of the same or connected therewith, within three months of the period when the knowledge thereof shall have reached the Bishop, or the person or persons complaining to him.

SECTION VI.—The Bishop shall cause a copy of the charges to be served on the accused, who shall, within seven days after such service, have the privilege of nominating five members of the Committee of Discipline and shall notify their names to the Bishop in writing; (if the accused should fail to nominate, the Bishop shall then choose five members of the said Committee.) The said five Clergymen shall form a Board for the trial of the accused, and shall meet at such time and place as the Bishop shall direct, and shall have power to adjourn from time to time (not extending over more than six months in all) and from place to place, (but always within the Diocese,) as they shall think necessary.

SECTION VII.—A written notice of the time and place of the first meeting of the Board shall be served by the Chancellor, under the direction of the Bishop, at least fourteen days before such meeting, on the accused, on one of the prosecutors, and on each member of the Board of Triers. All notices and papers contemplated in this Canon may be served by a summoner or summoners, to be appointed for the purpose by the Bishop, and whose certificate of such service shall be evidence thereof. In case of service by any other person, the facts shall be proved by such person. A written notice or paper delivered to a party, or left at his place of residence, shall be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or paper.



SECTION VIII.—If, before a trial commences, or during its progress, it shall be deemed desirable to amend, add to, or strike out any allegations in the complaint or presentment, it shall be competent to the Board of Triers to do so, taking legal advice if they should deem it necessary, and the trial on such amended complaint or presentment shall thenceforth proceed as if it had been the original complaint or presentment.

SECTION IX.—If, before the appointment of a Board of Triers, the Clergyman presented shall confess the truth of the allegations contained in the presentment, the Bishop shall proceed to pass sentence; but if he shall not confess them as before mentioned, he shall be considered as denying them.

SECTION X.—If a Clergyman presented, after having had due notice, shall not appear before the Board appointed for his trial, the Board may, nevertheless, proceed as if he were present, unless for good cause they shall see fit to adjourn till another day.

SECTION XI.—If, at the time appointed for the first meeting of the Board of Triers, the whole number of five shall not attend, then those who do attend, being not less than three, shall proceed to the trial, and a majority of those attending shall decide all questions. They shall appoint a Secretary, who may be one of their own number, whose duty it shall be to keep a record of all proceedings had before the Board.

SECTION XII.—When the Board proceeds to the trial, they shall hear such evidence as shall be produced, which evidence shall be reduced to writing and signed by the witnesses respectively. If, on or during the trial, the accused shall confess the truth of the charges as stated in the presentment, the Board may dispense with hearing further evidence, and may proceed at once to state their opinion to the Bishop as to the sentence that ought to be pronounced.

SECTION XIII.—Upon the application of either party to the Board of Triers, and it being made satisfactorily to appear to them that the attendance of any material witness cannot be procured upon the trial, they may appoint a commissioner to take the testimony of any such witness; and both parties may attend and examine the witness. The examination, being reduced to writing, shall be, as nearly as possible, in the words of the witness and signed by said witness.

The testimony thus taken shall be transmitted to the Board, certified by the commissioner, under his seal, and shall be received by them as evidence.

SECTION XIV.—Advocates or Proctors who may be either Clergymen or Laymen, shall be allowed, on either side, and if any difference of opinion shall arise as to the propriety of any question put, or on any point of order, the Board of Triers shall decide all such matters, taking legal opinion if they deem it desirable.

SECTION XV.—In every case in which, from the nature of the offence, it shall appear to the Bishop, after due inquiry, that great scandal is likely to arise from the Clergyman accused continuing to perform the services of the Church while such charge is under investigation, the Bishop shall cause a notice to be served on the accused at the same time with the service of the copy of the charge, or at any time pending the proceedings, inhibiting the accused from performing any services in the Church until the matter shall have been finally decided; and the Bishop may make provision for the service of the Church during the period of suspension, which suspension shall not exceed three months.

SECTION XVI.—The Triers to whom the examination or trial of any accused person shall be committed, shall be bound not to divulge the sentence

recommended, until such time as it has been approved and confirmed by the Bishop; and further, that they will at no time whatsoever disclose the vote of any particular member of the Board.

SECTION XVII.—Every witness, before examination, shall be asked to make a declaration in the following form of words, or in such other words as he or she shall consider or declare to be most binding upon his or her conscience :

"I, [A. B.] a witness at the trial of [C. D.] do most solemnly declare in the presence of Almighty God, and as I shall answer to God at the great day of judgment, that the evidence I am about to give shall be truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth."

SECTION XVIII.—The proceedings upon a trial shall be open to the members of the Church, unless, in the opinion of the Board, the circumstances of the case require that the trial should be private.

SECTION XIX.—The Board having deliberately considered the evidence, shall declare in writing by them, or a majority of them, their decision on the charges contained in the presentment, rendering their verdict of guilty, not guilty, or not proven, on the several counts presented; also stating the sentence which, in their opinion, shall be pronounced; and their decision, together with the evidence, shall be delivered to the Bishop, who shall pronounce such Canonical sentence as shall appear to him to be proper provided the same shall not exceed in severity the sentence recommended by the Board.

SECTION XX.—Every Clergyman, whose case may have been disposed of and decided adversely to him, and who shall think himself aggrieved by such decision, or who shall make it appear that new evidence, having an important bearing on the case, has been discovered since the trial, of the existence of which he was not aware at the time of the trial, may within six months petition the Bishop for a new trial, or a rehearing of the case, either upon objections to be taken to the decision upon the facts, or because the judgment is not sustained by the laws and Canons of this Ecclesiastical Province, or of the Diocese, or for other cause or causes; or he may apply by petition to the Bishop for an arrest of sentence or judgment, upon causes to be shown; and in either case the Bishop shall, upon receiving such petition, refer the same and the whole subject, together with the evidence and the report made by the Board of Triers, to the Committee of Discipline, and their decision on the above questions, being approved by the Bishop, shall be final in so far as this Diocese is concerned.

In the event that a rehearing or new trial be granted, the case shall be transmitted to a Board of Triers, appointed as provided in Section VI, who shall proceed to hold a new trial, according to the rules hereinbefore set forth, within one month of the notice of such new trial being given to them by the Bishop.

SECTION XXI.—Before pronouncing sentence, the Bishop shall summon the accused, and any three or more of the Clergy, to meet him at such time as may in his opinion be most convenient, in some church of the Diocese, which shall for that purpose be open at the time to all persons who may choose to attend, and the sentence shall then and there be publicly pronounced by the Bishop, or by some person commissioned by him.

SECTION XXII.—The following sentences may be pronounced, and punishments imposed upon offending Clergymen, viz :—Admonition; suspension from the exercise of his office; withdrawal of license; removal from his charge in the Church; deposition or degradation from his sacred office.

SECTION XXIII.—For the offences set forth in the first column hereinafter written, the sentences set forth opposite to the same in the second column, and none others shall be passed by the Bishop or person commissioned by him, upon any Clergyman found guilty thereof.

## FIRST COLUMN.

## UPON TRIAL AND CONVICTION.

- 1.—For crime or immorality.
- 2.—Scandalous or disorderly conduct.
- 3.—For irregularities in the performance of Divine offices, or for the introduction of innovations or novelties in the performance of Divine Worship; for holding service in any other Clergymen's Church or Parish, without his consent; or for permitting unauthorized persons to officiate in the Church.
- 4.—For schism, or separating himself from the Communion of the Church.
- 5.—For contumacy; for disrespectful and disobedient conduct towards the Bishop.
- 6.—For discontinuing the exercise of the Ministry without sufficient cause or leave of the Bishop.
- 7.—For exercising any lay profession or occupation inconsistent with the performance of the duties of his sacred calling, excepting in cases which are provided for by the Canons of the Diocese with regard to disabled Clergymen.
- 8.—For living in the habitual disuse of Public Worship, or of the Holy Communion, or for the violation of the constitution or Canons of the Church in Canada, or of this Diocese.
- 9.—Habitually and advisedly maintaining or affirming doctrine contrary or repugnant to the Word of God, set forth in the Formularies and Articles of Religion in the Book of Common Prayer.

## SECOND COLUMN.

- 1.—Suspension, withdrawal of license, removal; deposition.
- 2.—Admonition, suspension ab officio for not more than one year, nor less than three months, withdrawal of license, removal, deposition.
- 3.—Same as No. 2, except deposition.
- 4.—Suspension for one year, withdrawal of license; removal, deposition.
- 5.—Admonition; suspension ab officio for not more than one year.
- 6.—Admonition, suspension, withdrawal of license or removal.
- 7.—Same as No. 6.
- 8.—Admonition; suspension ab officio for not more than one year; withdrawal of license; removal; deposition.
- 9.—Admonition; inhibition from the performance of clerical functions; withdrawal of license; removal; deposition.

SECTION XXIV.—When sentence is pronounced in accordance with the above Schedule, it shall also be specified upon what terms, if any, the disability



shall cease. When the penalty of suspension is inflicted the Clergyman shall not exercise the functions of his Ministry in his own congregation or elsewhere, on pain of deprivation or deposition by the Bishop, he being satisfied that the suspended Clergyman has so transgressed; and during such suspension the Bishop may appoint another Clergyman to supply the place of the suspended Clergyman, and may apply a part of the income or emoluments of the parish, mission or cure to the payment of such substitute.

SECTION XXV.—When a verdict of not proven is rendered, it shall be in the power of the Board of Triers to say whether, in their judgment, it is desirable for the interests of the Church that the accused should be removed to some other charge; and it shall be in the discretion of the Bishop to carry out this recommendation.

SECTION XXVI.—When the sentence of removal or deposition is pronounced, the connection between the minister so removed or deposed and his parish or congregation shall be *ipso facto* severed, and all offices, rents, issues, profits and emoluments which he may have held by virtue of such office or ministry from which he has been removed shall wholly cease and determine.

SECTION XXVII.—Whenever a Clergyman is deposed or degraded from the Holy Ministry, the Bishop who pronounces the sentence shall, without delay, give notice of such sentence to the ministers and churchwardens of the several congregations of the Diocese, and also to all the Bishops of the Anglican Communion.

SECTION XXVIII.—It shall be the duty of the Chairman of the Board of Triers to see that all the proceedings of the Triers, as well as the sentence in each case, and the Bishop's action thereon are duly recorded by the Secretary to the Board in a book to be provided for that purpose; which book shall be kept in the custody of the Secretaries of the Synod.

SECTION XXIX.—All the expenses necessarily incurred by the Commissioners or Board of Triers, in any investigation or trial under the Canon, and in the event of a verdict of not guilty or not proven being returned, the legitimate costs of the accused shall be paid out of the Synod Assessment.

#### X.—On Repairs and Dilapidations.

XI.—For Settling Boundaries of Missions and Parishes, and the Subdivision and Union of the Same.

#### XII.—On Parochial Registers.

There shall be kept in every Parish and Mission a Parochial Register and Preachers' Book, as at present set forth by the authority of the Bishop, for use in the Diocese.

#### XV.—On the License to Clergymen.

#### XVI.—Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

Canon to make provision for the due administering and improving of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund of the Synod of the Diocese of Huron.

1.—That all rents, issues and profits of lands or tenements held by the Synod for the relief of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen, and all moneys

given or granted for the same purpose by individuals, or appropriated to the Fund by the Synod, shall be put to the credit of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

2.—That the Synod shall and will put to the credit of the Widows and Orphans yearly and every year on the thirty-first day of March, a sum of money equal to ten dollars for every Clergyman in the Diocese, which sum shall be considered as part of the income of the said Fund.

3.—That in order to entitle Widows and Orphans of any Clergyman to enjoy the annuity hereafter provided, he must from his ordination or entrance into the Diocese have become and continued to be an annual subscriber of at least five dollars to the funds of the Synod, or have become a life member of the said former Church Society of the said Diocese, and have made all the collections and subscriptions called for, for the Synod, unless excused therefrom by a written dispensation from the Lord Bishop, giving the reason for such dispensation being granted, which dispensation shall be forwarded by the Clergyman holding the same to the Secretary-Treasurer, who shall record it in a book to be kept for that purpose, which book shall be submitted to the Standing Committee for inspection at the meeting in June. That the sums required by this Section to be paid by Clergymen, be paid on or before the first day of March, in each year, to the Secretary-Treasurer, to be entered by him in a book to be kept for this purpose; and it shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer to lay before the Standing Committee, at the meeting in the month of June in each year, a list of the names of those Clergymen who have not complied with the requirements of this Section.

4.—That every Clergyman entering the Diocese and receiving written license, and every person ordained in the Diocese under thirty years of age, shall receive all the benefits of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, on complying with the conditions of this Canon. But all others shall pay in addition to the requirements of Article 3 of this Canon an entrance fee according to the following scale: When over 30 years and under 35 years, a fee of \$20; when over 35 years and under 40, a fee of \$30; when over 40 years and under 45, a fee of \$40; when over 45 years, a fee of \$50; to be paid within six months of such entrance into the Diocese, in one payment, or, under the sanction of the Bishop, by annual instalments of five dollars; and in case such Clergyman shall decease before such instalments be paid, that then such instalments as they become due shall be deducted from the annuity payable to his Widow and Orphans. The same scale of payments according to the ages specified, to apply to every Clergyman who re-marries and is desirous of availing himself of the provisions of this Canon; said payment to be made within six months after such re-marriage.

5.—If a clergyman is ordained within three months previous to the close of a financial year (now March 31), he shall be exempt from any annual subscription for that financial year, but this shall not be held to affect his liability to pay an entrance fee.

6.—Every leave of absence of a clergyman must be in writing, signed by the Bishop, and must be forwarded by the recipient to the Sec.-Treasurer of the Synod for registration within one month from its date.

7.—The absence of a clergyman from the Diocese for over two years shall be deemed a forfeiture of all claims upon the fund.

8.—In case of decease of any clergyman all payments of annual subscriptions then in arrear by him shall be considered due to the end of the financial year previous to said decease.

9.—That the Secretary-Treasurer shall lay before the Synod, at its meeting in June, in each year, a statement of all the lands belonging to this Fund, and of all the moneys invested or in his hands on the 31st day of March preceding, belonging to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, and of all moneys received and paid on account.

10.—That from and after the passing of this Canon, the Synod will pay to the Widow of every Clergyman of this Diocese who, from the passing of this Canon, or from the time of his appointment in this Diocese, shall have been a subscriber of five dollars per annum to the funds of the Synod, or shall have become a life member of the former Church Society, and who shall have complied with the requirements of this Canon, such annuity not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars, as the income of the Fund will permit, payable in four equal annual payments on the first days of January, April, July and October in each year, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on the day above mentioned, next following the death of her husband, except in the case of the Widows and Orphans of those Clergymen who are on the Commutation Fund, or who are paid by any other Society, whose annuity shall commence from the time that their payment from the Commutation Fund or said Society ceases, such payments to be continued during her natural life, or so long as she shall remain a widow; and when more than two children, a further annuity not exceeding Forty Dollars, as the income of the Fund will admit, for each child over the number of two children of said widow, under eighteen years of age, provided that no more than one hundred dollars a year be paid for orphans in one family, except when orphans alone are left, and then a pension of Sixty Dollars for each child shall be paid up to two hundred dollars in one family. In case of the death or the re-marriage of any widow, the annuity of Sixty Dollars for each, up to two hundred dollars a year, shall be paid to the guardians of such children. All annuities to the orphans of Clergymen shall cease upon their attaining the age of eighteen years or upon their marriage. All annuities under this Fund shall, in case the income of the Fund prove insufficient to meet them in full, be paid in such equal proportions as the income will allow, unless steps shall be taken by the Synod to pay them according to the above scale, and all annuities paid from this Fund shall be subject to such changes and alterations of this Canon as the Synod shall from time to time deem necessary to be made.

11.—Any clergyman marrying while he is on the superannuation list of the Diocese shall forfeit all claim whatever upon the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, saving and excepting the rights of children by a former marriage. Nevertheless the Synod may make a grant for a limited number of years to the Widow of any Superannuated Clergyman.

12.—That all moneys to the credit of this Fund that may not be required to meet the annuities payable to the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy, shall be from time to time invested in some good and efficient security, upon the recommendation of the Standing Committee.

13.—Every Widow or Guardian of any of the orphans of Clergymen desiring annuities from the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, shall apply by memorial to the Synod for such annuity, setting forth the time of decease of such Clergyman, the name of his widow and the names and ages of each of the children, as the case may be.

14.—Every annuitant on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund shall annually, on the first day of January, make one of the following declarations in the presence of a Clergyman or Magistrate, which declaration shall be attested by the Clergyman or Magistrate before whom it is made.

DECLARATION TO BE MADE BY A WIDOW.

15.—That should any doubt hereafter arise as to the interpretation of the Canon, or the construction which should be put upon it or any of its clauses, such doubts shall be referred to the Standing Committee, who shall make a report thereupon to the Synod, and their decision upon such doubt, when sanctioned and confirmed by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, shall be final.

16.—That this Canon shall take effect from January 1st, 1874.

Amendment passed at Synod June, 1875, and confirmed June, 1876.

That clause number 2 of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund Canon relating to the annual grant from the General Purposes Fund be suspended for five years from March 31, 1874; and

That the amount payable each year under said Section No. 2 be placed to the credit of the Mission Fund Debt Account, unless otherwise ordered by the Synod.

**XVII.—On the Election of Delegates.**

TO THE PROVINCIAL SYNOD AND OF ANY COMMITTEES OF THE SYNOD WHICH ARE ELECTED BY BALLOT.

1. The election shall take place first in the order of business on the second day of the annual session of the Synod.

2. Two Clergymen and two Laymen shall be named by the chair to act, in conjunction with the honorary secretaries, as scrutineers of the vote of each ballot for delegates to the Provincial Synod, and two of either order out of which members are to be elected, as scrutineers for each committee that it may be necessary to elect.

3. Printed lists shall be prepared, alphabetically arranged, of the clerical and lay members of the Synod, including the names of all lay delegates whose election has been certified to the Secretaries in accordance with the constitution, for delegates to the Provincial Synod, and each committee on which members are to be elected, specifying in each case the number to be elected. In case of the election of Committee on Discipline, the lists shall only contain the names of those clergymen who are eligible for election. The list for each



several committee being distinguished by being printed on paper of ~~different~~ colour.

4. Provided always, that in the event of any one being elected to act in any capacity under this canon, who, by action of the Synod during the session, may be declared not a legal member of the same, his election shall be void, and the person who obtained the next highest number of votes shall be elected instead.

5. The lists shall be furnished to the members of the Synod by the Secretaries, on the first day of session, and they shall bring them completed the next morning, each member, who desires to vote, having put a cross opposite the names of the persons he votes for on the various lists.

6. The order of proceedings shall be varied on the second day of session, by the report of the Committee on Lay Delegates being presented and dealt with immediately after No. 6 of order of proceedings, and the calling of the roll postponed until after this report has been disposed of.

7. As each name is called, the person called shall deposit his voting papers in the ballot boxes to be provided for the purpose, one for each order for each set of papers.

8. On the whole of the number present, who wish to do so, having voted, the boxes shall be set aside, and the regular business proceeded with until the first adjournment, when the various scrutineers shall examine the lists which they are appointed so to do, and report the result to the Synod on its reassembling.

#### NUMBER OF DELEGATES TO PROVINCIAL SYNOD.

9. That in the ballot for Delegates, each Clergyman and Layman shall vote for not more than sixteen of their respective Orders, and that the Scrutineers be directed to report the names of the sixteen Clergymen and Laymen respectively who shall have received the highest number of votes; the first twelve of each Order to be considered as the Representatives of this Synod to the Provincial Synod, and the other names to be considered as substitutes, in case of sickness or other good cause why the Representatives appointed may not be able to attend the meeting of the Provincial Synod, and in case of their being required, they shall be taken in the order in which their names appear on the Scrutineers' Report, and the Secretary of the Provincial Synod shall be notified of the change at least one week before the meeting of the said Synod.

#### XXI.—On Synodical Rectories.

Every Parish which contributes not less than \$800 per annum towards the stipend of its clergyman and provides him with a suitable residence or its equivalent, shall be classed as a Rectory and its Clergyman entitled to be styled Rector.

#### XXII.—On Differences Between Clergymen and their Congregations.

In cases of difficulties existing between a Clergyman and his congregation, or any causes arising, owing to which the continuance of the connection between



pastor and people may become injurious to the church : 1st. Upon the request of the Clergyman, or of the congregation expressed by a resolution to that effect passed at a vestry meeting called for that purpose, or in the event of either party neglecting to act upon this Canon, then in the exercise of his own discretion, the Bishop shall appoint a commission, consisting of five members of the Committee of Discipline, to investigate and report upon the said matters of difficulty ; and the Bishop shall decide whether, in his judgment, the report of the Commissioners shall be acted upon and carried out. 2nd. In case the said Commissioners may not recommend a severance of the relation of pastor and people, but that some other course should be pursued by either the Clergyman or the congregation, then, on the Bishop approving of the same, if such Clergyman or congregation neglect or refuse to comply with such recommendation, the Bishop may proceed, according to the Canons of the Diocese, to suspend the Clergyman from the exercise of any ministerial duties within the Diocese, as for contumacy, unless he retract such refusal ; and in the case of a congregation refusing to comply with such recommendation, it shall be prohibited from being represented in the Synod of the Diocese ; and the Bishop shall withhold from such congregation all episcopal visits and the rite of confirmation, until they retract such refusal and submit to the terms of recommendation.

**XXIII.—On the Formation and Organization of Vestries, and Declaring and Defining the Duties and Powers of Such Vestries.**

(Passed June, 1877.)

Under the authority of the Act of Parliament of the Province of Ontario incorporating this Synod (38 vic., cap. 14) and with the sanction of the Bishop of the Diocese of Huron, be it enacted,

**WHO SHALL BE MEMBERS OF VESTRY.**

1. That, hereafter, each and every male member of any church of the United Church of England and Ireland in this Diocese, of the full age of twenty-one years, and holding a pew or sitting therein by purchase heretofore made or under lease from the churchwardens of such church, shall be a member of the vestry of such church, and such members shall form the vestry of such church. Provided always that, after any such church has been opened for service for one year, and pews or sittings held therein for that period under lease or conveyance from the churchwardens, no person shall be allowed to vote at any vestry meeting who shall not have held a pew or sitting in the church for six months previous to such meeting, or who shall not have paid all arrears of rent or dues on his pew or sitting.

And in any church of the said Diocese in which the seats are free the vestry shall consist of all those male members of the congregation of such church, of the full age of twenty-one years, as shall declare themselves in writing, in a book provided for the purpose by the congregation, to be members of the United Church of England and Ireland, and that they attend worship in such church, and contribute not less than \$2 per annum to its support, and do not belong to any other congregation. Provided always that, after such church has been opened for service one year, no person shall be allowed to vote at any vestry meeting who has not signed such declaration at least six months before.

And in any church in which a portion of the sittings are free such male members of the congregation, of the full age of twenty-one years, occupying said sittings as shall declare themselves in writing, in a book provided for the purpose by the congregation, to be members of the United Church of England

and Ireland, and shall have contributed to the support of such church not less than \$2 per annum shall have a right to vote at such vestry meetings. Provided always that, after such church has been opened for service one year, no person shall be allowed to vote at any vestry meeting who has not signed such declaration at least six months before.

#### ORGANIZATION OF VESTRIES IN NEW CHURCHES

2. In the case of a church just opened, or just about to be opened for service, the vestry shall be organized and constituted as follows:—The Incumbent for the time being of such church shall call a meeting of the congregation, by notice given during divine service on two preceding Sundays, naming the day, hour and object of such meeting; and at such meeting the Incumbent shall preside and shall first nominate as his churchwarden a member of such congregation, and, in case it is the opinion of the meeting, expressed by a resolution there passed, that the pews and sittings in the said church should be rented to those requiring the same, and that such resolution is not contrary to any conditions under which such church has been built, given, granted, devised or endowed, the said churchwarden so named shall, forthwith, in accordance with the terms of such resolution, proceed to offer the pews and sittings to rent (or such letting may, if the meeting prefer it, be postponed to an adjourned meeting, of which like notice as aforesaid shall be given), and, whenever and so soon as in the opinion of such meeting or adjourned meeting sufficient of the pews and sittings have been thus disposed of, the members of vestry thus created shall proceed to elect one of their number as and for a churchwarden. But in case the members of any such congregation, at such meeting as aforesaid, decide that the pews and sittings in such church shall be free, or in case the church has been built, given granted, devised or endowed, on such condition, then, and in such case, the churchwarden so named by the incumbent, as aforesaid, shall proceed to obtain the signatures of those present and willing to sign such a declaration of membership as aforesaid, and such members of vestry, thereby constituted, shall forthwith proceed to elect one of their members a churchwarden. Provided always that such election of churchwarden as aforesaid may be postponed to an adjourned vestry meeting of which due notice shall be given.

#### ANNUAL ELECTION OF CHURCHWARDENS.

3. A meeting of each vestry shall be holden on Monday or Tuesday in Easter week, in each and every year, after due notice thereof, given at any time during divine service on Easter Sunday, for the purpose of appointing churchwardens for the ensuing year, and for the transaction of other business; and at such meeting one churchwarden shall be nominated by the incumbent of the rectory, parish, or mission to which the said church belongs, and the other shall be elected by a majority of those present, and entitled to vote at such vestry meeting, as aforesaid. In case of the incumbent declining or neglecting at such vestry meeting to nominate a churchwarden, then both of the churchwardens for the current year shall be elected by the members of the vestry present; and in case the members of such vestry shall neglect at such vestry meeting to elect a churchwarden, then both such churchwardens for the current year shall be nominated by the incumbent.

#### QUALIFICATION OF CHURCHWARDENS.

4. No person shall be eligible to the office of churchwarden except a member of the United Church of England and Ireland, of the full age of twenty-one years, who is also a member of the vestry of the church.

## FILLING VACANCY IN OFFICE OF CHURCHWARDEN.

5. If from any cause a vestry meeting shall not have been held on Monday or Tuesday of Easter week, the nomination and election of churchwardens as aforesaid, may take place at any subsequent meeting, to be called in manner hereinafter provided; and in case of the death, resignation in writing to the incumbent, declining to accept office, or change of residence to ten or more miles from the church of which he was chosen churchwarden, of either of the said churchwardens, a vestry meeting shall be thereupon called, for the nomination by the incumbent, or for the election by the said vestry, as the case may be, of a new churchwarden, in place of the one deceased, or who may have resigned, or declined to act, or removed, as aforesaid.

## TERM OF OFFICE.

6. The churchwardens shall hold their office for one year from the time of their appointment, or until the nomination or election of their successors, except in case of a nomination or election to fill up the vacancy occasioned by death, resignation, declining to act, or removal as aforesaid, and in such case the person so nominated or elected shall hold the said office until the next annual vestry meeting, or until the appointment of his successor.

## CHURCHWARDENS TO BE A CORPORATION.

7. The churchwardens appointed as aforesaid, shall, during their term of office, be a corporation to represent the interests of such church, and of the members thereof, and shall and may sue and be sued, answer and be answered unto, in all manner of suits and actions whatsoever, and may prosecute indictments, presentments, and other criminal proceedings for and in respect of such churches and church-yards, and all matters and things appertaining thereto, and shall, in conjunction with the rector or incumbent, make and execute leases to pew-holders, at their charge, when by them requested; and such churchwardens shall grant certificates to those who shall have rented pews or sittings, and such churchwardens and their successors may as a corporation hold such real estate as may be given, granted, or devised to them for the use of their church, as a site for a church, a parsonage, or a school-house, and may from time to time, with the approval of their vestry, signified by a resolution passed at a meeting of such vestry, mortgage such real estate for the purpose of raising money to be expended in the erection thereon of a church, a parsonage, or a school-house, as the case may be.

## CHURCHWARDENS TO LEASE PEWS.

8. It shall be the duty of the churchwardens, except in free churches, from time to time, to lease and rent pews and sittings, upon such terms as may be settled and appointed at vestry meetings, to be holden for that purpose, as hereinafter provided; and such pews and sittings shall be subject to such annual rent or other dues as may from time to time be rated and assessed in respect thereof at such vestry meetings.

## FORMER SALE OF PEWS CONFIRMED.

9. In case of the absolute purchase of a pew in any church, as aforesaid, before the passing of these rules, the same shall be construed as a freehold of inheritance, not subject to forfeiture by change of residence, or by discontinuing to frequent the same, and the same be bargained, sold and assigned to any purchaser thereof, being a member of the United Church of England and Ireland; and such purchaser, provided the same shall have been duly assigned and conveyed to him, shall hold the same with the same rights, and subject to the same duties and charges, as the original purchaser thereof.



## PEW-HOLDERS SECURED IN QUIET POSSESSION.

10. Any pew-holder, whether by virtue of an original purchase completed before the passing of these rules, or by lease, and any person renting a pew or sitting, shall, during their rightful possession of such pew or sitting, have a right of action against any person injuring the same, or disturbing him or his family in the possession thereof.

## CHURCHWARDENS AND THEIR ACCOUNTS.

11. All churchwardens appointed as aforesaid shall keep, or cause to be kept, proper books of account, which, with all other books kept by them as churchwardens, shall be the property of the vestry, and shall be carefully preserved by the churchwardens, and shall be open for inspection by any member of the vestry at all reasonable times. In such books the churchwardens shall duly enter all monies received and paid by them on account of the church of which they are wardens. The churchwardens shall, every year, at the annual vestry meeting, or at an adjourned meeting to be held within a fortnight after the said annual meeting, render in writing a just, true, and perfect account, fairly entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, signed by the churchwardens, of all sums of money by them received, and of all sums rated or assessed by the vestry and remaining unpaid, or otherwise due and not received, and also of all goods, chattels, and other property of such church or parish in their possession as such churchwardens, and of all monies paid by such churchwardens so accounting and of all other things concerning their said office, which said account shall be verified by oath before a Justice of the Peace, who is authorized by the Church Temporalities Act (3 Vict., cap. 74, sec. 9) to administer the same; or the correctness of such account shall be certified to by two auditors, who may be appointed by the vestry at any annual meeting but not at an adjourned meeting. In case of the appointment of a new churchwarden or churchwardens, the churchwardens then retiring from office shall pay and deliver over unto such succeeding churchwardens all sums of money, goods, chattels, books and other things which shall be in their possession. In case any retiring churchwarden or churchwardens shall make default in rendering a correct account as aforesaid, or in delivering over such money, goods, books, or other things as aforesaid, it shall be in the power of the succeeding churchwardens to take proceedings at law or in equity for such default. Provided always that the same process may be enforced against any churchwarden or churchwardens removed or become incapable of acting, from any of the causes before mentioned in this Canon, or against the representatives of any deceased churchwarden. The churchwardens, or in their absence their substitutes for the time being, shall immediately after any service at which a collection has been made, proceed to the vestry room of such church, and there, in the presence of the incumbent or other officiating clergyman, carefully count the collection and enter the amount of the same with the date and their initials in the preacher's book.

## SPECIAL VESTRY MEETINGS MAY BE CALLED.

12. It shall be in the power of the incumbent of any such rectory, parish or mission as aforesaid, or of the churchwardens thereof, to call a vestry meeting whenever he or they shall think proper so to do; and it shall be his or their duty so to do upon application being made for that purpose in writing by at least six of the members of such vestry as aforesaid; and in case, upon such written application being made as aforesaid, such incumbent or churchwardens shall refuse or neglect to call such meeting, then one week after such demand made it shall be in the power of any six of such members of the vestry to call the same by notice to be affixed on the outer church door (or



church doors where more than one) at least one week previous to such intended meeting.

CHAIRMAN AND SECRETARY OF VESTRY MEETING.

13. At all vestry meetings the rector or incumbent of the church shall preside as chairman when present, and in his absence the curate or assistant minister, or in the absence of both the incumbent and the curate or assistant minister, such person as the majority present at such meeting shall name; and the vestry clerk, when there is one, and present, or in case there be no vestry clerk, or he be absent, then such person as the chairman shall name shall be secretary of such vestry meeting, and the proceedings of such vestry meeting shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and preserved in the custody of the churchwardens.

VESTRY TO REGULATE RENT-CHARGE AND PEW-RENTS.

14. The rent-charge to be paid upon pews holden in freehold, which shall have been acquired before the passing of these rules, and the rent to be paid for pews and sittings in pews leased or rented, shall be regulated from time to time by the majority of members present, at any such lawful vestry meeting as aforesaid, and no alteration shall be made therein except at the usual annual Easter vestry meeting, (of which intended alteration notice shall have been publicly given when calling such vestry meeting); or such alteration may be made at a special vestry meeting called for such purpose, of which two Sundays' notice shall be given, and so expressed in the notice calling the same; and further, the charges to be made for leases shall in like manner be regulated at such vestry meeting as aforesaid.

APPOINTMENT OF SUBORDINATES BY CHURCHWARDENS.

15. The appointment or dismissal of the clerk of the church, the organist, the vestry clerk, the sexton, and other subordinates, servants of the church, shall rest wholly with the incumbent and churchwardens for the time being, and their salary and wages shall be brought into the general account, to be rendered as aforesaid by such churchwardens, but the amount of salary or wages to be paid to any such officials shall be fixed from time to time by the vestry; but the ordering of all the services of the church shall be entirely under the direction of the incumbent.

16. The charges payable for burial plots, and on breaking the ground in cemeteries and churchyards, for the purpose of burying the dead, and all matters of like nature therewith connected, shall be regulated by the vestry of each church.

VESTRY MAY MAKE NECESSARY BY-LAWS.

17. It shall be in the power of the members of such vestry, at such vestry meetings as aforesaid, to make by-laws for the regulation of their proceedings, and for the management of the temporalities of the church, parish, or mission to which they belong, provided the same are not repugnant to these rules, the Act incorporating this Synod, or to the Canons of the United Church of England and Ireland, or of this Synod.

18. The churchwardens of any such church as aforesaid shall from time to time, out of the funds of the church, pay to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod, for the time being, the amount of any annual or other assessment charged; or which may hereafter at any time be charged or assessed by this Synod against such church or parish.

**XXIV.—On the Expenditure of the Mission Fund in the Diocese of Huron.**

(Passed June, 1877.)

In order to carry out more effectually the Mission work of this Diocese, it is desirable that the By-laws for the expenditure of the money of the Mission Fund should be repealed; and that in framing new ones, the following principles and objects should, as far as possible, be kept in view:—

- (1.) To apply the Mission Fund so as to elicit the greatest amount of local effort, and to render each Mission, as soon as practicable, self-supporting.
- (2.) To raise the stipends of our Missionaries.
- (3.) To render the payments of stipends to Missionaries as certain and as regular as possible, without wholly destroying that wholesome degree of stimulus necessarily implied in the voluntary system.
- (4.) To relieve the Missionary from the unpleasant, invidious, and derogatory task of pleading before his people for his own stipend; and yet to make it his duty and his interest to urge the claims of the Mission Fund upon them.

SCALE PROPOSED.

1. The grants to be made from this Fund to raise the stipend from all sources for a Deacon to at least \$500 per annum.  
     Priest of 3 years' standing and under to at least 600 "  
     " 3 to 5 years' standing " 700 "  
 and, in the discretion of the Standing Committee, for a Priest over 5 years' standing; to at least \$800 per annum, if the funds of the Synod will admit of it.

CASES EXCLUDED.

2. (1.) No congregation enjoying the exclusive services of a Clergyman shall be entitled to receive any grant from the Mission Fund towards the support of such Clergyman, except upon the special recommendation of the Standing Committee.
- (2.) No parish, which is considered by the Standing Committee as able to pay its Clergyman the sum of \$800 per annum, and to provide him with a suitable residence or its equivalent, shall receive any grant from the Standing Committee.

ANNUAL REVISION OF GRANTS.

3. The Mission Fund Grants shall be only in force until March 31st of each year, and shall be revised annually.

It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee, at their meeting in September, to revise the Mission Fund Pay List, and to decide what grants shall be made therefrom for the year commencing April 1st following.

QUARTERLY PAYMENT OF GRANTS.

4. It shall be the duty of the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod to pay quarterly to the Missionaries, out of the Mission Fund of the Diocese, such grants as have been voted by the Standing Committee.

## COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS FOR EACH RURAL DEANERY.

5. To carry out the above plans and objects there shall be appointed annually by the Bishop, during the session of the Synod, for each Rural Deanery, two Clergymen and two Laymen, being Communicants, who, with the Archdeacon and Rural Dean of the locality, shall constitute a *Committee on Missions for that Rural Deanery*, of which Committee, the Archdeacon or Rural Dean and any two appointed members shall form a quorum. The Rural Dean shall be the Convener; and the Archdeacon, or in his absence the Rural Dean, the Chairman.

6. Before a grant is made by the Standing Committee in aid of any Mission, it shall be the duty of said Missions Committee, if required by the Standing Committee, to visit such Mission in order to confer with the several congregations thereof, for the purpose of ascertaining their resources and liabilities, and of arranging with them as to the amounts which they might fairly be expected to raise towards the stipend of their Missionary; unless in the case of any remote Missions where such a visit may be deemed inexpedient by his Lordship the Bishop and three-fourths of the members present at a regular meeting of the Standing Committee; and said Committee shall report to the Lord Bishop within one week of their visit the result of their enquiries, the arrangements which they have made with the several congregations, and the action they would recommend.

7. This report, with such remarks thereon as the Lord Bishop may deem fit, shall be laid before the Standing Committee at its next ensuing meeting; when the Standing Committee shall decide as to the amount which it is able and willing to grant towards the support of a Missionary in said Mission.

8. When the several congregations of any Mission shall have agreed with the Standing Committee upon the amounts which they will severally contribute towards the stipend of their Missionary, and upon the services to be maintained by him, and have recorded such engagement by resolution passed in Vestry (a certified copy of which shall be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer); then it shall be the duty of the Churchwardens to remit such contributed amount in quarterly payments to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod. And upon the regular payment of the contribution stipulated, the Standing Committee hold themselves bound to maintain the ministrations of the Church in the places and at the times agreed upon, so long as such regular payment shall continue to be made.

9. In case any Congregation of any Mission fail to make up its quota of a Missionary's stipend, as stipulated by them with the Standing Committee; then, on the requisition of the Standing Committee, the said Committee on Missions for the Rural Deanery shall revisit the defaulting congregation of said Mission, and endeavour to induce the people to raise the proportion payable by them to the stipend of their Missionary to the amount required, and report within one week of the time of their visit, to the Lord Bishop, the result of their labours; which report the Lord Bishop shall lay before the Standing Committee, with his recommendations in regard thereto, at its next ensuing meeting.

10. It shall be the duty of the Missionary in charge of the defaulting congregation, and the Churchwardens thereof, to appear before this Committee on Missions, when notified by the Chairman thereof of the time and place of their meeting, which place shall be in the Mission.

11. A full written report of all the evidence taken by the Committee, with their opinion on the merits of the case, shall be forwarded to the Lord



Bishop within one week after the completion of their enquiry, by the Arch-deacon or Rural Dean presiding and authenticated by his signature; and on receiving this report, the Lord Bishop shall lay it before the Standing Committee at its next ensuing meeting, with any remarks appended thereto that he may deem proper.

12. In case the congregation shall continue in arrears in regard to their engagements, after having been reported in fault, and shall still refuse or neglect to pay up such arrears, then the Lord Bishop shall refer the case to the Standing Committee to be dealt with by them at their discretion; and in case it shall be considered desirable to remove the Missionary from such Mission, the Secretary-Treasurer shall not pay any moneys to a new Missionary in said Mission until all arrears and advances shall have been paid to the Synod.

13. No Clergyman or Layman shall serve on the Committee on Missions when his own Mission forms the subject of enquiry; but the Missionary in charge shall have the right of objecting to any appointed member of the Committee, on showing cause for so doing to the satisfaction of the Lord Bishop, who shall then appoint another in the room of the one objected to, as far as this case is concerned.

14. The actual necessary expenses of the Committee on Missions in each Rural Deanery, incurred in carrying out the provisions of this By-law, shall be paid by the Secretary-Treasurer out of the general Mission Fund of the Diocese to the Chairman of the Committee, who shall pay the expenses of the several members of the said Committee,

#### OUTFITS.

15. Only such Missionaries as are ordained by the Bishop of the Diocese or, having come from another Diocese, have been ordained not more than 3 years, are not more than 30 years of age and have not received an outfit therein, and are appointed to a charge consisting of more than one station, necessitating the keeping of a horse, shall receive the sum of \$100 as an outfit. And this sum shall be given upon the condition that at least 3 years' service be given in this Diocese by the Clergyman receiving the grant; otherwise, the grant shall be charged pro rata against his stipend from the Mission Fund.

16. The By-laws of the late Church Society for the management of the funds of the Mission Board are hereby repealed.

#### XXV.—On Superannuation.

1. Every clergyman who from age or infirmity desires to be superannuated must forward to the Sec. Treas. of the Synod an application in writing setting forth the full particulars of his case. He must also procure a physician's certificate (said physician to be named by the Standing Committee) stating the causes which render him unfit for duty. If placed on the superannuation list, such certificate shall be renewed annually if required by the Standing Committee.

2. Whenever it shall appear to the Bishop or the Standing Committee that the interest of the Church requires that any clergyman of the Diocese should from any cause be superannuated, a committee to be appointed as hereinafter provided shall have full power to enquire into such case, and if it shall appear to them that such clergyman ought to be superannuated, they shall report the case to the Standing Committee and recommend what annual grant should in their opinion be paid to such clergyman; provided, that no case shall be entertained by the Standing Committee unless it shall have been first

3. The Committee of Enquiry shall consist of five clergymen of the Diocese of not less than ten years' standing in priest's orders, two of whom may be named by the clergyman in question within one month after written notice, and three shall be balloted for by the Standing Committee, unless the clergyman shall refuse to name the two, when the five shall be balloted for. Such inquiry shall be held privately, but a record of the proceedings shall be made in writing for the use, if required, of the Standing Committee, and on application in writing by the said clergyman a copy of the proceedings shall be furnished to him.

4. A Presbyterian of less than twenty-five years' active service in the Diocese, or being under 65 years of age, shall if able be subject to perform occasional clerical duties at the call of the Bishop. Service in the Diocese of Toronto previous to the establishment of the Diocese of Huron to count.

5. Whenever it shall appear to the Bishop and the Standing Committee that a clergyman who has been superannuated ought to return to active duty, he shall cease to be on the superannuation list, save and except in case of those referred to in clause 4.

6. In case any clergyman who has been placed on or withdrawn from the superannuation list is dissatisfied with the action of the Standing Committee in his case, he shall have the right of appeal against such decision to the Synod.

The above collections to be sent direct to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod, and the Clergy are requested to see that they are sent without delay.

In Churches where Service is not held every Sunday, the collections should be made as near the above date as can be.

Where Churches are free [i.e., where the pews are not rented] and the Clergymen's stipend is dependent upon the Offertory, it is understood that such arrangements as are practical will be made; in all other cases, the whole of the collections should be devoted to the object named.

The attention of Clergymen is specially called to the following extract from the Widows' and Orphans' Canon:—"III. That in order to entitle widow and orphans of any Clergyman to enjoy the annuity hereafter provided, he must, from his ordination or entrance into the Diocese, have become and continued to be an annual subscriber of at least five dollars to the funds of the Synod, or have become a life member of the former Church Society of the said Diocese, and *have made all the collections and subscriptions called for*, for the Synod, unless excused therefrom by a written dispensation from the Lord Bishop."

**PAROCHIAL ASSOCIATION COLLECTIONS.**

Collections should be made, as far as possible, FROM EVERY MEMBER OF THE CHURCH.

All Collections and Subscriptions for each financial year, and the lists of the names of subscribers in each Parish, should be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer by the 31st of March, otherwise they will lie over until the next year's report.
