

When the Borden Administration came into power it was decided that a broad policy for the betterment of agriculture in Canada through co-operation with the Provincial Governments should be adopted. It was felt that nothing in this direction could be properly accomplished until a general survey of the agricultural conditions in Canada had been made. To make this survey and to report on a general policy, Mr. C. C. James, Bormerly Deputy Minister of Agriculture for Ontario, a man with deep knowledge and experience which peculiarly fits him for such work, was appointed commissioner. He is at present engaged in preparing his report, and it will be ready by the opening of Parliament.

As Mr. James' report could not be ready last sessin, it was decided to give immediate assistance to agriculture by voting the sum of \$500,000 to this cause by way of a grant to the Provincial Governments on a population basis. The grant was to be expended for the cause of agriculture according to a plan approved by the Minister of Agriculture. It is worth noting that New Brunswick was the first Province to fall in line. All the other Provinces have followed and taken up the plan with enthusi-




