

#### Report of the Session for 1893.

DEAR BRETHREN:—The Session in presenting their annual report would express their deep sense of the goodness of God and his abiding mercies continued to them through the many changes incident to

the year.

The removal to another sphere of labor of a much loved, energetic, and gifted pastor, and the vacancy following with its ever changing supply, were not calculated to develop the spiritual life of the Congregation. Yet the Lord has not been unmindful of His people, and after several months of a vacancy another pastor was sent to us and before the year closed the regular work of the pastorate was again begun and we sincerely hope that it may be abundantly blessed.

The public services have been well attended despite the vacancy; but the Bible Class, Sabbath School and Prayer Meeting have all suffered during the interval between pastor and pastor, and the attention of the Congregation is specially directed to them so that these services, so essential for the building up and maintenance of the spiritual life of the Congregation, may be

not only sustained but largely increased.

The Communion has been observed as formerly, three times during the year, with fairly satisfactory attendances. During the year 8 have been added by certificate and 1 by profession. We have lost by remeval beyond the bounds 7, who have not yet applied for certificates, 16 have been duly certified to other congregations, and 7 have been removed by death,

leaving an actual membership still of 275.

We would express our deep sense of the losses sustained by death during the year, not only of the aged saints who have joyfully accepted their release, but of those still in the prime of their life and usefulness, and especially of Mrs. J. Featherstone, who was such an energetic, willing worker in every department of Church life.

In conclusion we would express our appreciation of the services rendered by the Choir in leading the praises of the Congregation.

During the three years our society has been in existance the attendance at our weekly meetings has steadily increased. The membership roll at present has forty names; last year we had thirty-eight members. The apparent small increase is due to the fact that a number of our members have removed from the village and hence their names have been struck off the roll, but we rejoice to state that many new members have been enrolled during the past year, and that the interest in our meetings has been most gratifying. With God's blessing we hope to see this interest sustained and the membership greatly increased. On June 16th the County Convention was held here and the occasion was a profitable one to all. There were read by visiting delegates a number of valuable papers, which were full of suggestions to our members, and which have, no doubt, proven exceedingly beneficial to all the societies represented.

A tea was served at the close of the convention when a very sociable hour was spent with the delegates.

In our last report we stated that the society had adopted a plan of systematic giving to missions. The amount so far contributed has not yet been distributed to ony of the missionary schemes of the church.

On January 5th the Society gave a Benefit Social for the deserving poor of the village. The support accorded by the members of this and other congregations was very encouraging. The total proceeds amounted to thirty-two dollars. This sum has been suitably expended.

We enter on the coming year with the hope that our society will be found increasing in usefulness, and we would earnestly request all the younger members of the congregation to enroll themselves as members of the Y. P. S. C. E. and thus we may better attain our object, "To promote an earnest Christian life among our members, to increase their mutual acquaintance and to make them more useful in the service of the Lord."
