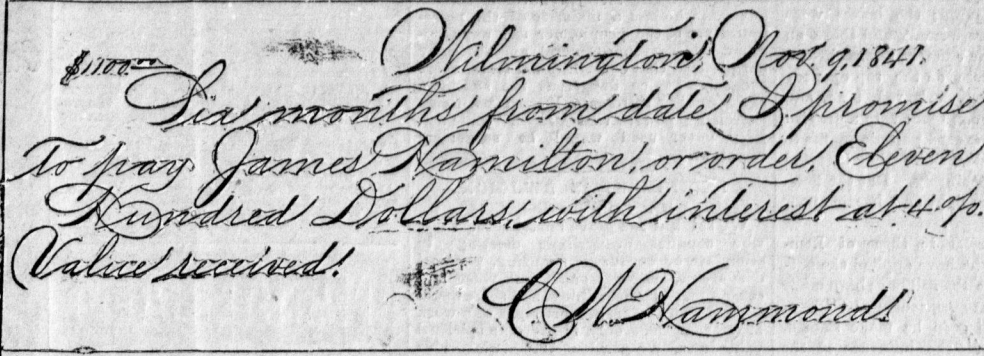

of the lamp died soon after they came out of the soil. Radishes under six feet were nearly dead at the end of six weeks. Our readers may remember that by applying the electric current to the seeds and afterwards to the soil, Specknell caused radishes to grow 17 inches long and 5½ inches in diameter. Entire crops in the normal half of the Cornell forcing house were about twice as great as those in the half exposed to the electric light. When the light was included in a globe of white "opal" glass, the effect of the plants was softened, but was still injurious, except with respect to lettuce, the condition of which was improved.

Experiments with flowers showed that the colors of tulips were made deeper and richer for a few days, although afterward this exceptional intensity was lost. Verbena flowers in growing under electric light were uniformly injured; the leaves were small, the flowers were small, and those on the lower part of the clusters turned brown and died before those on the top opened. The color of scarlet, dark red, blue, and pink flowers was soon turned to a grayish white. The light caused petunia plants to grow tall and slender, while they bloomed earlier and more profusely. THE ROYAL PREROGATIVE.

EXCITEMENT IN RELIGION.

We think it is a grave mistake for those who conduct evangelistic meetings to stimulate or encourage shouting, physical demonstrations or promiscuous noise and confusion, as if these things had some moral and religious value, or were signs of a work of grace. Not only is there no spiritual value in noisy confusion—it is unfavorable to serious thought and solid religious experience. We must not forget that conversion is a mental and spiritual process, which in its very nature requires serious thought. It is necessary that the sinner should consider his ways, fully resolve to turn away from his sin, and exercise an intelligent self-control, before he can be converted. This process may take place under a variety of outward circumstances. But it will hardly be accomplished by applying the electric current at first to the seeds and afterward to the soil and the air just above the surface of the ground, and that a majority of the plants which have been used in the experiments are not injured by such treatment, is also shown that the rapid growth of flowering plants induced by the electric light, as it is commonly used, is exhaustive and unhealthy. Perhaps careful tests may yet demonstrate that, under modifying conditions, this light can be used to accelerate the growth of such plants and of some vegetables without causing exhaustion or impairing vitality. We have seen it argued that plants, like animals, require a full period of rest, and cannot be forced in growth without injury. It must be remembered, however, that in some countries the climate is so forcing that two crops of vegetables, fruits and grain are gathered in a year. The question to be settled is whether by the artificial agency of the electric light somewhat similar results may not be successfully brought about.

THE INTERNATIONAL TUG-OF-WAR. New York, Dec. 24.—The international tug-of-war tournament was continued tonight with the following result: Canada defeated England in 25 minutes and put England out of the race. Scotland defeated Italy in 10 minutes 30 seconds.

America succumbed to Denmark in 40 minutes. Norway beat Germany in 8 minutes. Ireland won Sweden in twenty minutes. When Canada and England came together it was noticed that the latter's end of the rope had been freely covered with soap. The incident created great indignation among the spectators, and came near breaking up the evening's entertainment.

New York, Dec. 25.—The international tug-of-war contest at New York was concluded last night. Canada defeated Italy in 1 minute and 50 seconds; Scotland put England out of the race in 1 hour, 7 minutes and 5 seconds; Norway outplayed America in 19 minutes and 27 seconds. The Danes won from the Irish in 28 minutes and 37 seconds.

After a secret session of four hours in New York the Board of Control announced that it had at last determined to strike an effective blow at the "big tracks," if they continue to ignore the rules of the association.

Resolved, that owners, trainers, jockeys, and drivers, who violate the rules of the association, shall be fined, or, if they fail to pay, shall be suspended for a period of not less than 30 days in a calendar year, shall not be qualified to enter, start, ride or have license for the races of the association represented in the Board of Control; but this resolution shall not take effect until Jan. 1, 1902.

A largely represented meeting of the members of the Canada was held in Belleville, Ont., on Tuesday, at which it was unanimously decided to make a determined effort to prevent so-called "fixes" entering horses in their wrong classes.

A number of owners and trainers held a meeting after the races at Guelphburg yesterday to take some action on the recent decision issued by the Board of Control which prevents them from running their horses on the "big tracks," if they continue to ignore the rules of the association.

FOOTBALL. Princeton and Harvard have arranged for a series of football and baseball matches.

A HORSE'S MEMORY.

He Boils at a Crossing Where His Former Master Was Killed.

EAST GRANGE, Dec. 24.—The horse which Samuel Campbell, jun., of South Orange drove on Thanksgiving night when he met with his fatal accident at the Halsted street crossing in East Orange, proved this afternoon that horses have good memories. He is now in the possession of William E. Bloodgood, of Llewellyn Park, who hit him to a buggy and went out driving with a friend. A few minutes before 4 o'clock they turned into Halsted street, in the opposite direction from that in which Mr. Campbell had driven.

The horse approached the crossing in a hesitating way, and the moment that he reached the tracks he boiled, although there was no visible cause of fright. The buggy was overturned and the horse thrown to the ground. The men were pitched out and severely cut and bruised. The horse was also badly cut. It was the first time the horse had been driven through the streets since the fatal accident.

ADDING TO THE FLEET. The Canadian Pacific Road Building a Line of Monster Whalebacks.

WEST SUPERIOR, Wis., Dec. 24.—The keels were laid yesterday for the American Steel Barge Company for two of a fleet of six mammoth whalebacks under contract for the Canadian Pacific Railway. These vessels will be of improved design, 320 feet long; 42 feet beam, 25 feet deep, and will be of greater capacity and much swifter than other whalebacks so far constructed. The construction of the Minneapolis and Saint Ste. Marie road, which is now operated by the Canadian Pacific, its expectation in the future to handle the bulk of the northwestern wheat and flour has not been realized, as a great portion of it still continues to go east via Chicago. In the whaleback fleet the road believes it has found the necessary adjunct for a monopoly in flour transportation, and with the opening of navigation the line of whalebacks to run in connection with Soo Road from their terminus at Gladstone to lower lake ports.

MARRIED AGAINST HIS WILL. Mr. Bowers Says He Was Forced to Wed at the Point of a Revolver.

BALTIMORE, Md., Dec. 24.—Divorce proceedings out of the usual line were instituted in the Circuit Court yesterday by Andrew J. Bowers. Mr. Bowers is a native of Richmond, Va. He asks the court to annul a marriage ceremony performed between him and Emma A. Bigelow on the ground that at the time he was already married. He claims in his bill of complaint that he had to marry Miss Bigelow or be murdered, and that the fact that his wife at the time was known to Miss Bigelow and her family.

The bill alleges that on Tuesday last, while standing at Calvert and Lombard streets, Mr. Bowers was approached by the father and brother of Miss Bigelow, who compelled him at the point of a pistol to enter a carriage with them. They were driven to the home of the Bigelows, where Mr. Bowers was placed in a room. The elder Bigelow kept guard with a pistol, it is claimed, while his son procured a marriage license for Mr. Bowers and Miss Bigelow and a minister to perform the ceremony.

The record of the Court of Common Pleas shows that on June 2 last a license was issued for the marriage of Andrew J. Bowers, aged 24, and Miss Bertha Roop, aged 25. Last Tuesday a license was issued for the marriage of Andrew J. Bowers, aged 25, and Miss Emma A. Bigelow, aged 19. No return to either license has been made by the minister.

The space will permit me only to say that it is to the interest of the farmers to support this most laudable cause to the utmost, not only in this county but throughout Ontario, and I am sure that through the exertions of Mr. Budd this county will become a unit in this most important movement, which aims at the universal benefit of the farmers, who are undoubtedly the wealth producers of the country, and it should be the wish of everyone to see this movement more widely extended.

I would in conclusion like to say a few words about the Municipal Insurance Bill. We owe the introduction of this bill into the Local Legislature last session to the untiring efforts of that energetic lady, Mrs. Budd; and if it becomes law it will be a great boon to the citizens of this country. It behooves every man throughout the Dominion to support this most popular movement in every possible way."
