RALLY TODAY AT LEGISLATURE

Today is an important day in the history this university.

Today a rally is to be held protesting the ovincial government's proposal to impleent a two-tier system of "differential" ition fees.

Today students will show the governent how much they care about the fate of eir university.

After the Board of Governors, a body insisting of a majority of government-pointed personnel, twice voted to reject ifferential fees, the government has remaindadamant on their proposal. This is a clear fringement on university autonomy—here education ideals are thrown aside for a sake of political inanities.

Despite the fact that the government ought up the question of differential fees without having done any research on the preign student issue in Alberta, despite the at that the government has ignored all ertinent information brought before it with gards to differential fees, the most crucial sue in the differential fees debate is the porality of such a system.

Studies show differential fees will disiminate against students from Third World ountries, those who need an advanced ducation the most. (It is no coincidence, any people surmise, that these Third World udents denied entrance are usually of a on-Caucasian origin.)

Studies show foreign students already ontribute substantially to the economy, espite government protestations to the ontrary. Each student must bring \$3,000 a ear into the country, which is put directly to the Alberta economy. Likewise, foreign tudents may *not* take jobs while in Canada, espite the popular misconception that they take jobs away from Canadians."


Canada, as an incredibly rich nation, has nobligation to the other members of the lobal community. Our commitment to our ss fortunate neighbours should be a strong ne — based on access to education and cess to our western technology.

It is not enough for the government to pout platitudes as it ignores the moral addresses of every academic institution not all in Alberta but in the whole of Canada.

It is not enough for the government to aim it has "public" support if that public upport is based on misconceptions and cism.

It is not enough for the government to mand a "reasonable" attitude from its ectorate without being reasonable in its wn dealings.

We have been shunted aside. Our rotests, our research, our carefully-easoned moral arguments...have been igored. Our attempt to reason with the provincial government has failed.



It is now time to show the government our discontent.

It is time to show the government we protest its running roughshod over our university's autonomy.

It is time to show the government that we do not like discrimination no matter how popular, that we do not want our university to become as narrow and parochial as some might wish, that we do not want the educational standards in the province to be set by the whims of political animals.

Protest today at the rally in Quad at 1 p.m. and the rally in front of the Legislature at 2:30 p.m. Show the university — and the government — that you care.

Oppose differentials

THEGOVERNMENT

is attempting to raise tuition for foreign students by \$300 per term. While not denying the harmful effects of this increase, they maintain that the "silent majority" of Albertans are demanding it.

THEPUBLIC

is not demanding it. Chambers of Commerce, labour organizations, church and community groups, educators and students have all opposed it.

THEUOFA

Board of Governors has refused to implement it. They have been supported by the Senate and GFC. The government has threatened to change the Universities Act to force the U of A to charge the fee.

THE STUDENTS

must show that there is strong opposition. The "silent majority" does not exist! We must show ourselves publicly. Contingents are coming from other universities and colleges in Alberta.

THERALLY

will be held in Quad on Monday at 1 p.m., followed by a march to the Provincial Legislature. We have invited the Premier and Dr. Hohol to speak to us. Other speakers will represent opposition parties, students, labour and the churches. The University of Calgary Street Theatre will perform "Dr. Ho-Hum's Racist Proposal" A meaningful time is guaranteed to all.
