### PREAMBLE

Whereas, Victoria Lodge, No. 1085, was chartered by the Grand Lodge of England in the year 5859, and British Columbia Lodge, No. 1187, was chartered by the same supreme authority in the year 5867.

AND WHEREAS, these Lodges were granted Warrants of Constitution under the Grand Lodge of British Columbia at its formation in 5871 as Numbers 1 and 5 respectively;

AND WHEREAS, by mutual consent and by the authority of the Grand Lodge the Lodges aforesaid were amalgamated in the year 5878, under the title of Victoria-Columbia Lodge, No. 1, on the Grand Registry of B. C.

AND WHEREAS, it is incumbent on every Lodge in the jurisdiction to frame By-Laws for the guidance and good government of such Lodge, and to amend the same when necessary;

Therefore, BE IT RESOLVED, That the following By-Laws as amended be and are hereby adopted as the Kules and Laws of said Victoria-Columbia Lodge, No. 1. Colu Colu

### BY-LAWS.

### TITLE.

1. This Lodge shall be known as Victoria-Columbia Lodge, No. 1, A. F. & A. M., British Columbia Registry.

#### OFFICERS.

Worshipful Master, Immediate Past Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Treasurer, Secretary, Senior Peacon

2. Its Officers shall consist of:

And such other Officers as the Lodge may elect, or appoint.

#### MEETINGS.

3. The Regular Meetings of the Lodge shall be held on the first Thursday in every month in the Masonic Temple, Victoria, at such hours as shall from time to time be thought most convenient.

- 4. A Lodge of emergency may, at any time, be called by the authority of the Master, or in his absence, of the Senior Warden, or in their absence, of the Junior Warden, but on no pretence without such authority. The business to be transacted at such Lodge of emergency shall be expressed in the summons, recorded on the minutes, and no other business shall be entered upon.
- 5. All the business of the Lodge, except that of conferring the first and second Degrees, and the instruction thereof, shall be transacted in the Lodge of Master Masons.
- 6. At all meetings of the Lodge, whether regular or emergent, seven Master Masons shall form a quorum, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting unless at least five members are present.

### ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

7. The following Officers shall be elected by written ballot at the Regular Meeting in December of each year, a majority of members present being necessary to elect:

Worshipful Master, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Treasurer, Tyler, Two Auditors.

8. The Masonic year shall commence with the regular meeting in January, when the elected officers shall be duly installed; after which the Worshipful Master shall appoint and install the following officers:

and any other officer he may consider necessary.

### DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

9. No Master-elect shall assume the Master's chair until he shall have been regularly installed, though he may in the interim rule the Lodge. It shall be necessary, previous to the installation of the elective officers, that their elections be confirmed; after which the usual ceremonies of installation are to be performed. Should the election of any officer not be confirmed, then a summons must be issued for the following regular meeting of the Lodge setting forth that the Brethren are again to proceed to elect such officer; and if confirma-

be elected tanding, to s each, the tion of that election is made, at the following ordinary meeting of the Lodge, the installation of the officer-elect shall follow.

#### · MASTERS.

- 10. No member shall be eligible for the position of Master (except by special dispensation of the Grand Master) unless he has previously filled one of the Warden's chairs, or is a Past Master.
- 11. The Master shall have power to summon his Lodge when he deems it proper, or any officer or member thereof, for cause.
- 12. The Master is the custodian of the charter, records, furniture and jewels of the Lodge, and is responsible for the strict observance of the ancient landmarks, Laws, Regulations and By-laws of the Lodge.
- 13. The Master is responsible that a book or books be kept in which the Secretary shall enter the names of the members of the Lodge, and of all persons initiated or admitted therein, with the date of their proposal, affiliation, initiation, passing and raising; and also their ages as nearly as possible at that time, and their titles, professions or trades, together with such transactions of the Lodge as are proper to be written.
- 14. The Master shall see that all monies received or paid on account of the Lodge are entered in proper books by the Secretary and

### WARDENS.

15. If the Master die, be removed, or be absent from the jurisdiction, or be incapable of discharging the duties of his office, the Senior Warden, and in his absence the Junior Warden, shall act as Master in summoning the Lodge until the next election of officers.

16. If the Master be not present, then the Senior Warden, or in his absence the Junior Warden, shall rule the Lodge, but he shall not assume the Master's chair, nor confer degrees, unless he be a Past Master.

### TREASURER.

17. The Treasurer shall keep an exact account of all moneys received and paid on account of the Lodge, which shall be audited annually, and at the regular meeting in January, he shall present a clear and distinct statement of the financial condition of the Lodge, and pay to his successor in office, the balance appearing to be due to the Lodge immediately after the Installation and Investure of that officer. All monies received by the Treasurer shall be paid into such chartered bank as the Lodge may direct within forty-eight hours after receipt thereof. He shall also disburse the Lodge funds upon receipt of the Secretary's order, duly endorsed by the Finance Committee.

#### SECRETARY.

18. The Secretary shall keep a faithful record of all proceedings of the Lodge proper to be written. He shall keep a separate account for each member of the Lodge, and report at the regular meeting in December, the amount due by each; he shall collect all dues, and pay the same to the Treasurer. He shall also issue all summonses for regular and emergent meetings; he shall make a special report to the Grand Secretary with the Grand Lodge returns of all charity expended during the year, for the information of the Charity Committee of the Grand Lodge; he shall take charge of the Lodge Seal, and perform all other duties as may properly appertain to his office, and, at the regular meeting in January, present a written report of the year's business, general and particular. He shall receive such compensation as the Lodge may direct.

### DEACONS.

19. It shall be the duty of the Deacons to attend punctually at the opening of the Lodge, assist the Master and Wardens; and take such part in the ceremonies of the Lodge as the Master may direct.

### DIRECTOR OF CEREMONIES.

20. It shall be the duty of the Director of Ceremonies to see that the lodge room is properly prepared, that all brethren are in their proper clothing and regalia, and conduct such ceremonies of the Lodge as the Worshipful Master may direct.

### STEWARDS.

21. The Stewards, under the direction of the Senior Warden, shall see to the safe keeping and care of the jewels, furniture and other property of the Lodge; and under the direction of the Junior Warden, shall have the ordering and arrangement of refreshments.

### INNER GUARD.

22. It shall be the duty of the Inner Guard to attend to the inner door; to admit Masons on proof, receive candidates in due form, and obey the commands of the Junior Warden.

### TYLER.

23. It shall be the duty of the Tyler to guard the outer door; to report all applicants for admission, and see that those who enter are qualified and properly clothed, and that they have signed their names in the book kept for that purpose; to serve all summonses and perform such other duties as may be required, for which he shall receive such compensation as the Lodge may direct.

24. The Tyler may at any time be removed, for cause deemed sufficient, by a majority of the brethren present at a regular meeting of the Lodge, and another elected in his stead.

### INSTALLATION.

25. Officers shall be installed in person, and no installation of an officer by proxy shall be permitted. If the officer elected or appointed

Director of m is prope in their iduct such Vorshipful is not present, he shall be installed at the first regular meeting of the Lodge at which he is present; and if any officer shall neglect or refuse to attend for installation, for two regular meetings after his election or appointment, the Lodge may, by a majority vote, declare his election or appointment void and revoked, and another member shall be elected or appointed in his stead, who shall be installed into office in due form.

### MEMBERS.

26. None but Master Masons can be members of the Lodge, or vote upon any subject. Every brother whose application has been favorably received in the Lodge, and who receives the Master Mason's Degree and proves his proficiency therein, in open Lodge, becomes a member of the Lodge by signing its By-laws.

### PROPOSING MEMBERS.

27. No person shall be eligible for admission into this Lodge, who cannot read and write.

The Lodge shall not receive an application for the Degrees of Masonry, unless the applicant shall have been a resident within the Province during twelve consecutive months, and within the jurisdiction of the Lodge during the six months next preceding the date of his application, except in the case of a person belonging to the army, navy or mercantile marine, whose qualification of residence shall be three consecutive months, but his application, though he have not that qualification of residence, may be received and balloted for,

28. This Lodge shall not ballot upon any application for the Degrees (except by special dispensation from the Grand Master) until information has been received from the Grand Secretary that the applicant is free of the Black List, nor until notice of the name, age, profession and place of abode of the applicant shall have been sent to all the members of the Lodge in the summons for the meeting of the Lodge, nor until the application shall have been referred to a committee whose duty it shall be to make strict examination into the moral, mental, physical and other proper qualifications of the applicant and to report thereon at the next regular meeting, unless further time be granted. No applications shall be withdrawn after reference to a committee, except as hereinafter provided in this section. If the report of the committee or of any member thereof be unfavorable, no ballot shall be taken, but the Master shall, upon the reception of such report, declare the candidate rejected. If the report be favorable, the candidate shall be balloted for; and if for initiation it shall require an unanimous vote to elect. If but one black ball appear in the ballot box, the Master, without declaring the result, shall at once order a second ballot for the purpose of correcting a possible mistake, which ballot shall be final. After one ballot has been had, no discussion shall be permitted in the Lodge before the second ballot is taken, nor shall the second

ballot be postponed until another meeting of the Lodge. If the committee find the applicant disqualified in consequence of insufficient residence or physical disability, and find no other objection to him, they shall make a special report thereon; in which case the Master may direct the withdrawal of the application without further action, and such direction shall be entered upon the record.

29. This Lodge shall have but one ballot for the three Degrees, but though an applicant may be elected to receive them, if at any time before his initiation objection be made by any member, or if, after his initiation, but before being passed, or after passing, before being raised, objection to his advancement be made by any member, such objection shall be referred to a committee, with power to enquire into the cause thereof, who shall, at the next regular meeting (unless further time be given) report thereon; and upon the reception of such report, if no cause for the objection has been assigned, or if the cause assigned be, in the opinion of two-thirds of the members present, not a valid and Masonic one, the Lodge may confer the Degrees in the same manner as if no objection had been made. Should the charge be found valid before initiation, the applicant shall be rejected; if any Degree has been given, the Brother shall be proceeded against as provided for by the Constitution.

### AFFILIATIONS.

30. Every Brother seeking admission to this Lodge by affiliation, shall apply by petition in

the prescribed form, and he shall be recommended by at least two members of the Lodge. He shall deposit with the Secretary his Grand Lodge certificate; and, if he is not a subscribing member of any Lodge, his demit from the Lodge of which he was last a member, and he shall shew that he is in good Masonic standing. His name, occupation and place of abode, as well as the name, location and number of the Lodge of which he was last a member, shall be placed on the summons for the next regular meeting of the Lodge. The petition shall be referred to a committee, whose duty it shall be make strict examination into his moral, mental and other qualifications, and to report at the next regular meeting, unless further time begranted. If three members of the committee report unfavorably, the candidate shall be declared rejected, but if a majority report favorably; the Lodge shall proceed to ballot, and three black balls shall be required to reject the candidate.

31. When a candidate for initiation or affiliation is rejected, or a Brother reprimanded, suspended or excluded, no member or visitor shall reveal, either directly or indirectly, to such person, or any person, any transactions which may have occurred on the subject, nor shall any proceedings of the Lodge, not proper to be made public, be disclosed outside thereof, under the penalty of reprimand or suspension as the Lodge may determine, and the Worshipful Master shall direct this clause to be read immediately after any such rejection, reprimand or suspension.

### DEMITS.

32. Any member desiring to withdraw from the Lodge, shall signify such desire either personally or in open Lodge, or by letter addressed to the Secretary, to be read in open Lodge, and shall thereupon, provided he is in good standing and clear of all indebtedness to the Lodge, be entitled to his demit. It shall be the duty of the Worshipful Master to ascertain, before he signs the demit, that the Brother so withdrawing is in good Masonic standing. An application for a demit shall lie on the table for one month, unless the necessity of the case requires immediate action.

### ARREARS.

33. In case any member shall have refused or neglected to pay his regular dues, during a period of twelve months, he shall be notified by the Secretary, that unless, either at or before the next regular meeting his dues be paid, or it be shown that his non-compliance with this rule has been caused by sickness or other misfortune, he shall be declared by the Master, on a two-thirds vote of the members present to be suspended from the rights and privileges of his Lodge. But the Lodge may remit his dues or grant him further time for payment if it is expedient. Payment of arrears up to the time of suspension shall, if the interval between the date of suspension and application be not greater than two years, restore him to full membership without ballot. The name of every Brother suspended, together with the reason of his suspension, shall be recorded on

the minutes of the meeting at which it was decided, and the Grand Secretary shall be notified thereof, as well as the restoration to Masonic privileges, should it take place.

### PUNISHMENTS.

34. The Lodge has the power by a twothirds vote, of suspending excluding or recommending for expulsion member for Masonic, immoral, or infamous conduct; but no member shall be suspended or excluded without giving him at least one month's notice of the charge preferred, or complaint made against him, and of the time appointed for its consideration. He shall be at liberty to be present, and be offered every opportunity of defending himself. When the case has been investigated he shall withdraw, and the vote of the Brethren shall be given by ballot, subject to the right to appeal to the Grand Lodge. The name of every Brother suspended, excluded, or recommended for expulsion, and the cause of the penalty inflicted, shall be sent to the Grand Secretary.

### HONORARY MEMBERS.

35. A Brother who may have rendered any service to the Craft in general, or to any particular Lodge, have a vote of the Lodge, be elected any members in its returns to the Grand Lodge, and pay to the Grand Lodge similar dues for such honorary members as are payable for ordinary members.

36. Honorary membership shall not confer the right of voting in the Lodge; unless specially conferred by a vote of the Lodge at a regular meeting—previous notice of the intention to confer the right, and the name, residence and occupation of the Brother in whose case the vote is to be had, having been first stated in the usual summons.

### VISITORS.

37. Any Master Mason in good standing may be permitted to visit the Lodge, and any entered Apprentice or Fellow Craft may be permitted to visit the Lodge while working in any Degree which he has received.

38. If no Brother present can vouch for the visitor, the Master shall appoint a committee of Brethren skilled in the work to examine him.

39. If any member of the Lodge objects to sitting in the Lodge with the visitor, the Master shall refuse madmittance, or if he has been admitted, require him to withdraw.

40. Before any visitor can be examined as to his knowledge of Masonry, he must state the name and location of the Lodge of which he is then, or was lately, a member, or in which he received the Masonic Degrees, which shall be reported to the Master, or the Lodge, before a committee of examination can be appointed.

### FUNDS AND PROPERTY.

41. All funds and property of this Lodge shall be vested in the Master and Wardens for the time being, in trust for the use and benefit of the Lodge, to be paid, applied and disposed of as the majority of the members shall from time to time in due form direct, and an inventory of the jewels, furniture, etc., belonging to the Lodge shall be entered in the minute book and a copy be given to the Master at his installation, who shall pass it to the Treasurer for safe keeping.

### DUES AND FEES.

42. The annual subscription shall be six dollars, payable quarterly in advance, except in cases of non-resident brethren, who shall be charged half dues.

43. The fee for the three Degrees shall be fifty dollars, payable, viz.:

### THE AUDITORS.

46. The Auditors shall audit the Treasurer's and Secretary's accounts immediately after the close of the Masonic year, or at such time as the Lodge may determine. A written report of their proceedings, with a clear and ample statement of the funds of the Lodge, shall be laid before the Brethren at the regular meeting in January.

### FINANCE COMMITTEE.

47. The Worshipful Master, Senior and Junior Wardens shall be a Finance Committee, and shall examine all accounts presented to the Lodge, and order the same paid if correct.

### CHARITY.

- 48. The Worshipful Master and Senior and Junior Wardens shall constitute the Charity Committee of this Lodge, to whom all applications for relief must be made. They shall carefully consider the same, and if worthy, may grant relief as follows:
- 49. Any worthy distressed Brother of this Lodge in good standing, may be relieved to the extent of twenty dollars, on application to the Committee.

50. A transient Brother in good standing, or a Brother belonging to a sister Lodge of this jurisdiction, in good standing, may be relieved to the extent of ten dollars, on application to the Committee.

51. The Widow or Orphan of a deceased Brother of this Lodge, may be relieved to the extent of twenty-five dollars, on application to the Committee.

52. No second application in one month for relief from any Brother or the Widow or Orphans of any deceased Brother, shall be entertained by the Committee.

53. Any special application for a larger sum than provided for in these By-laws, must be voted on in the Lodge at a regular meeting.

54. Should the funds of the Lodge be inadequate to furnish the relief needed, special application shall be made to the Charity Committee of the Grand Lodge.

55. The Committee shall report to the Lodge through the Secretary, all cases where relief is granted during the preceding month, at each regular meeting of the Lodge.

56. A report of all relief granted shall be furnished to the Grand Secretary as required by the Constitution.

### REPEAL OF BY-LAWS, ETC.

57. No new law, or repeal, or alteration of an old one shall become valid, until it shall have received the sanction of a two-third vote of the Lodge at two successive meetings, and approved by the Grand Master. .

58. A copy of the By-laws shall be fully transcribed in a proper book and signed by every member of the Lodge as a pledge of his intention to keep and observe the same, and a printed copy shall be delivered to every candidate taking the Third Degree, and proving his proficiency therein.

### ORDER OF BUSINESS.

59. When the Lodge is opened, the following order of business shall be observed:

1. Reading the summons.

2. Reading the minutes.

3. Reading and referring petitions. 4. Receiving reports of committees.

5. Balloting for candidates.

6. Receiving and considering resolutions.

7. Unfinished business.

8. New business.

9. Conferring Degrees.
