A very serious difficulty in the affairs of the Cathedral has arisen. The mortgagees have given the Chapter a rather short notice to call in their money. The Archbishop has taken the matter in hand, and is endeavouring to meet the demand; and he has called upon a number of laymen of the Diocese to aid him in doing so. The amount, \$50,600, is easily within the resources of the people of the Church in the Diocese of Toronto, although under existing circumstances it is a rather formidable sum. Towards raising the amount, members of the Cathedral Congregation are under no greater responsibility than other members of the Church throughout the Diocese, but it is not unreasonable to hope that each one will do what he can, to such an extent as would be expected of him if he were one of the congregation of a Parish Church under similar circumstances.

The Altar Guild have now 22 members, and 36 subscribers. Their receipts for the year ending 30th November were \$59.69 and expenditures \$40.57. Receipts through the Offertory in November \$4.75.

A class of fourteen Scholars from the Cathedral Sunday School met in S. Alban's School House on Saturday evening, 30th ult., and wrote for the Inter-diocesan Sunday School Examination. Canon Macnab acted as local Examiner.

The Talent Exhibition held by the Cathedral League, Thursday Nov. 14th, was well attended and may be considered a great success.

As a result many members are at work filling the orders taken from the samples, the profit from which goes towards making up the \$5.00 obligation undertaken by each member.

From their Sale of Christmas Articles the children realized \$35.00 which will be added to their Pier Fund.

The very excellent tea served in the afternoon was supplied and made by the Red Rose Tea Company.

It might be well to add that a Talent Exhibition differs from a Sale, in that the money for the article sold goes to the exhibitor, so that the money does not come to the League until the members pay in their yearly obligation, some time before Easter.

Mrs. Macnab's "Kettledrum" at 120 Wells Street was as usual quite a brilliant success. Some two hundred people attended, and thoroughly appreciated the musical programme provided, as well as the dainty refreshments which were served upstairs in the library.

Mrs. Sweatman and several other ladies of the Cathedral Congregation kindly assisted in the entertainment of the guests.

Canon Macnab requests the members of the Congregation who are willing to assist in the decoration of the Cathedral for Christmas to meet in the library on Monday 23rd inst., at 2 o'clock.
