There is no topic more repugnant to the writer who treats in a liberal and enlarged spirit upon the exigencies of the ecuntry, than the recurring appeals to nationality, which rise like fetid vapors from the stunted and stagnant intellect of Lafontaine; and we might despair of the future, were it not that a glimmer of light and hope beams through the mists of nationality, and French Canadian writers in the Moniteur Canadien, D.Avenir, and Sentinelle du Pcuple, spura the incentives to wrong, and proclaim a generous desire to fraternize and co-operate

upon broad and common principles with the British The contracted mind of Lafontaine fits him to shine the slave of ignoble instincts; it is his pride and his reproach, that in every act of legislation, within the circle of his influence, he has traced in sympathetic ink the words Canadian Nationality, awaiting time and opportunity to develope their purport. Such a policy is disastrous to any country, but it is positively destructive to Canada, with its balanced races and its fraudulent electoral circles. It requires neither intellect, education, experience, nor ability to legislate in such a spirit; and its practical application may at length rouse a feeling which can only be allayed by adopting the maxims of democracy, or merging the conflicting streams of Colonialism in the ocean of Republicanism. Quebec is threatened with one of those experiments by which Lafontaine tests the patience, and revenges his fancied wrongs upon the British. 
