A Verdict For the Defendant\_A Suit That Arose From the Glengarry Election Party Have a Little Falling Out.

Preston, the plaintiff, sued for \$250 alleged
to have been loaned to Neil McCrimmon on heard before Judge Morgan at the old court to have been loaned to Neil McCrimmon on April 1, 1891, and which, the plaintiff claimed, McCrimmon had agreed to pay on demand after the election protest against R. R. Maclennan, M. P. for Glengarry. In McCrimmon's defence he stated that he had received no loan from Preston. He had been solicitor for the petitioner in the election protest and as such had incurred a large bill of costs, any moneys received by him from the plaintiff had come originally from the petitioners and had been intended to be paid over to McCrimmon as election expenses.

Mr. McCrimmon's Testimony.
Mr. McCrimmon was in the box under Mr. McCrimmon was in the box under examination by Frank Pedley, solicitor for the plaintiff, a good part of the afternoon. During the examination he said the total expenses of the party during the trial were about \$2200. It had been arranged that the court should be opened at Cornwall and then immediately adjourned, to meet at Alexandria where the trial was to go on. But before the case came on at Alexandria Mr. D'Alton McCarthy, counsel for Maclennan, submitted to McCrimmon a memorandum of settlement, which the latter signed. In this bill of settlement \$200 was allowed as counsel fees for the petitioner and \$100 for witnesses in spite of the restrictions mentioned in Sir John Thompson's amendment of the previous session. When asked why he did not have some provision made for solicitors' fees Mr. McCrimmon said he had no idea the amendment applied to election trials pending. To show that he had no more money than he ought to have Mr. McCrimmon submitted to the court his account of expenses and receipts. He admitted having received \$250 from Preston, \$100 from John Simpson, a friend of the party; \$1176 from Mr. Maclennan and the \$1000 deposit. He had paid out \$506 to Mr. S. H. Blake as fees for both trial and Supreme Court appeal, \$579 for witnesses, railway fares, etc., \$58.60 discount, \$118.40 hunting up evidence, \$125 for bailiffs serving witnesses. The deposit of \$1000, he claimed, had been returned. The only promise he had made to return the \$250 was in a telegram which he had sent on learning that the party needed funds and hoping that if the money were returned to Preston he would subscribe that amount for the party. However, Preston did not subscribe as expected and so McCrimmon and the party.
