TAOU KWANG, PRESENT EMPEROR OF CHINA.—
Taou Kwang was born in 1781 during the life time of his grandfat her, Keen Lung, at whose court Lord'. LONDON, June 3, 1840.

In the early part of this week there was considerable pressure for money here, but it has been partially relieved by the Bank of England issuing their customary notice to advance on the deposit of Exchange until after the dividends are paid in July next. It was generally supposed that the rate of interest would have been reduced to 44 per cent., but when the case was considerad over in the bank parlour the majority were in favour of continuing the rate at 5 per cent. The discount houses are doing their business on easier terms, and first rate bills are freely cashed at the rate of from 4½ to 4½ per cent.,—and five per cent, is generally charged to rbills of on inferior class. The demand for discounts is, however exceedingly limited, particularly from the manufacturing districts, the tate of profit being so low where any exists that it will not afford to pay 5 per cent, and drawing, in consequence, is avoided as much as possible. The accounts hold out no immediate prospect of an improved demand for our manufactures, and as a large portion of the goods made for your markets are thrown back, the accounts from Lancashier are exceedingly gloomy and desponding. The improvement which took pincabout a month back, which encouraged hopes of a progressive amendment in the general trade of the country, has entirely subsided, and every thing is as flat as during the winter months. Business is therefore transacted in proportion to the consumption, and to that it is strictly limited in every department, as there is neither inducements nor inclination to anticipate.
