British Capture Whole of Pozieres Village; Dominate Plateau Which Germans Occupy

In Desperate Fight, Foot by Foot They Tyne Slides Off Drive Enemy Out

London, July 26-The village of Pozieres has been completely captured by the British, according to an official announcement made today by the war office. The text of the statement follows:

"The whole village of Pozieres is now in our hands. West of the village our territorial troops made a further advance and captured two strong trenches and a number of prisoners, including five officers. Elsewhere on the battlefront there is no change."
