THIRTIETH REPORT
OF
THE INDUSTRIAL REFUGE
(LATE MAGDALEN ASYLUM),
AND AGED WOMAN'S HOME.

It has been the custom, in this charity, for the Lady Managers to conduct the Annual Meeting, and in consequence (*though it is a public one*) to ask for the presence of ladies only. In 1874, at the opening of our new and commodious building, we departed from this custom, and again last year, when we had extended our work by adding to it a Home for Aged Women. In both cases the meetings were large and presided over by the Mayor; and addresses delivered by prominent clergymen and laymen, and were the means of making our work better known and creating a greater interest in its favor. But this year which closes the thirty-first of its existence, we return to our usual quiet and undemonstrative plan, that being, as we think, more in unison with the class of women to be admitted, and the kind of work to be accomplished by this charity.

Our last report mentioned that we intended applying to the Provincial Legislature for power to change our corporate name from the "Toronto Magdalen Asylum and Industrial House of Refuge" to the "Toronto Industrial Refuge and Aged Woman's Home." That power has been given us, and we shall henceforth be known by the latter name. This change, we know, will please many of our friends.

In reviewing the work of the past year, we have again abundant reason for thankfulness to our God and Father for all His manifold and continued mercies towards us. May we be stirred up to renewed earnestness and devotion in this part of His vineyard.

In our last report, we gave such a detailed account of the objects for which the Refuge exists, viz.: "To give to every woman, without reference to creed or country, an opportunity of reforming," and "the

method pursued," that we think it unnecessary to repeat what we hope is now fully understood as to the work the Refuge has been trying to do all these years. It is one that does not admit of much variety of incident, as a general thing. It is the old story. In many young girls a determination to submit to no restraint on the part of either parents or friends, a giving way to extravagance in dress and amusements, and indulgence in stimulants. Then follows a yielding to questionable methods in order to furnish the means necessary to pay for all this. Then comes the decided false and sinful step downwards, and the woman is galled and wounded by slighting remarks on all sides, particularly from her own sex; while some, pretending to help and comfort, only send her further down. She then becomes hardened, and concludes, there is no help for her, and she may as well get as much pleasure and excitement out of her life as possible, and if occasionally a thought of the sorrow she is bringing on faithful and loving parents or kind friends,—or it may be the meeting with one of those, who, following in the Master's footsteps, is trying to bring back some poor wanderer to His fold—and a hope of a better life comes to her, it is quickly drowned by the conversation of her companions or the feeling "*that it is too late.*" Oh! it is a sad, sad life these poor women lead, sometimes for many years, until at last, completely broken down in health, life becomes really a painful burden, and she makes up her mind to enter the Refuge in order to recover herself. Is it any wonder under such circumstances, and after such a life, that a large proportion of those who seek its shelter do not remain the desired time. In two or three months, under its restraining influence, with healthy food and surroundings, and a fair amount of work to do, they find themselves so much strengthened in mind and body that they think they are strong enough to resist temptation and to earn a living for themselves. Resisting the pleadings of the managers, who try to make them see the danger that awaits them outside, they leave the shelter only to prove they were mistaken as to their power, and after a few months return to try once more. Does any one say, "You should not take them back, you are only giving them a chance to recruit, in order the better to indulge their depraved habits?" We think not. If a woman says, "I want to leave the life I am leading and do better," we feel we *must* give her a chance to do so; and trust that by prayer and the influences with which we surround her, that the Holy Spirit will so effectually strive with her as to lead her to her loving Saviour. Can we tell, that because she resisted the Spirit's influences when last in the Refuge, that

she will this time? No! It is our duty to work trusting our God, and leaving results in His hands.

On the 30th September, 1883, there were 34 in the Refuge, and 57 have been admitted since, making 90. Of these, 3 were transferred to the "Aged Woman's Home," 18 sent to services—many of whom, we are happy to say, are doing well—I was taken home by her mother, 3 died, 3 sent to lunatic asylum, 3 to the hospital, and 26 left of their own accord, leaving 30.

Two of those who died had been long in the Refuge, and had given proof of a decided change of heart and life, and died trusting alone in their Saviour. The other had only been with us a few days. Lunacy is getting to be very common in the class that come to the Refuge, and we were obliged to have these three committed to the jail first, as a preliminary step to their admittance to the asylum, but not till we had tried all other means, and they themselves had become dangerous.

We would draw attention to the large amount received from work done by the inmates—\$1,532.31—rather less than last year, but the inmates were fewer. This is in excess of the work necessary for the household, a list of which will be given further on.

One of the inmates who died had earned by occasional services during a number of years, a small sum, of which \$40 was given to the Refuge; and another who is still able to earn a small monthly wage, gave \$20, and with it a letter expressive of her gratitude for all the kindness received and the comfortable home provided for her. She still continues to give the half of what she earns. Other instances of gratitude we could mention, though not given in the shape of money; but nevertheless it is most gratifying to find that several of the inmates have the interests of the institution very much at heart, and in their department work very faithfully, often doing so long after hours in order to get the work put through.

Mrs. Spence, the Matron of the Refuge, continues to carry on the work entrusted to her to the satisfaction of the Managers, exerting a decided influence for good over the inmates, and securing their respect and confidence. We would also draw attention to the work done in the work-room under the sub-matron, Mrs. Smith, being over and above the *paid work*. 52 dresses, 46 chemises, 28 petticoats, 57 aprons, 40 pairs cotton stockings knitted, 21 pairs cotton stockings footed, 30 pairs woollen ditto, besides a very considerable amount of mending of sheets, bed ticks, etc. Then 131 pairs stockings for the "Girls' Home," 405 sheets, 121 pillow cases, 12 table cloths, 85 bed

ticks, 55 bolster ticks, 53 pillow ticks, 46 towels, 82 flannel shirts for "Boy's Home," at half price, and 55 chemises for "Infants Home," free.

Of our new department, the "Aged Woman's Home," which has been in operation since the 6th November, we think we can decidedly say it has, to a certain degree, met a much needed want. Of the 7 inmates now there, 5 are very aged widows needing much care and attention. The other two are elderly, but still able and willing to help with the work of the Home. *Our aim is to make it a comfortable and quiet Home for such*, and we are therefore particular as to those we admit. The Matron, Miss Lee, we consider well fitted for her position, being careful, sympathetic, and unsparing in her attention to the sick and feeble, as well as to all matters connected with the Home. Work done: 9 pairs knitted stockings, 13 night-dresses, 22 chemises, 12 pairs drawers, 24 sheets, 12 pillow-cases, 1 dress shirt, 6 yards lace, 4 dresses, 4 corset covers, 5 child's skirts, 4 caps; beside repairs.

We acknowledge with much thankfulness, the receipt of \$2,000 left to the Institution by the late James Michie, Esq., \$1,400 of which was used in the additions and improvements made to the building, and the balance \$600, is being invested.

We desire to thank very warmly all those ladies and gentlemen who so kindly and perseveringly attend to the religious services and instruction of the inmates on week days, as well as on Sabbath, and for the very pleasant and enjoyable entertainment they gave the inmates on Xmas Eve. Also to Dr. Brittain for his very kind attention in all cases of sickness. And also to Dr. Clapp, who has lately most willingly consented to attend on those in the Aged Woman's Home.

Many thanks are also tendered for liberal donations at Xmas, and since then, and to Dudley & Burns for printing Annual Report at greatly reduced rates.

We close this report confidently looking to our friends and the public for a continuance of that generous support which has for thirty-one years been extended to this Institution. "Freely ye have received, freely give."
