THE MONTREAL OUTRAGE

Judge Dugas and the other Montreal authorities which were connected with the gross outrage involved in the arrest of Miss Tibbitts of Fredericton, remained true to their character to the last.

There was a consistency of maintenance in their conduct which points them out as admirably adapted to the police service of Canada, but which rather impairs their usefulness in a country over which the British flag waves.

It is possible more culpable than any one else concerned in this infamous business made an attempt to conduct the inquiry in private, and it was only on the strong remonstrances of the press of Montreal that its representatives were admitted to this British court of justice, which like all other British courts should be open.

This attempt to dispose of the case in secret was quite in keeping with the other proceedings of this letter on the case of Justice Dugas. He has been excused his indignity in a vain effort to justify his conduct in issuing such a warrant as that under which Miss Tibbitts was arrested, but without any sort of success.

The fact is that quite independently of the badness of the warrant in other respects, there was no proof whatever that the imaginary woman against whom the warrant was issued had committed any crime.

It is Miss Tibbitts who has been in Montreal on the 25th of March last, and if she had seen to take the arm of Henson, senior, and walk away with him, there was nothing whatever in these facts to justify the issuing of a warrant against her.

The whole case of the Malachy family over which Judge Dugas grows so pathetic, is either a mere delusion or is being used by them to cover up something of which they are ashamed.

Time, no doubt, will disclose the cause of all this commotion in the Malachy family, in whose proceedings Judge Dugas takes such a remarkable and unusual degree of interest.

When Miss Tibbitts was arrested every effort was made to conceal the fact from the press. Although the arrest was effected early on Saturday morning, no Montreal newspaper knew anything about it until Monday morning, when a telegram was sent from the Gazette office to Montreal.

It was then with the utmost difficulty that the facts in regard to the arrest were obtained. We have already commented on the infancy of the conduct of the police authorities in attempting to extort a confession from the young lady, and her refusal to permit the friends of Miss Tibbitts or herself to see her.

The only thing apparently wanting to bring the Montreal police court in line with the worst models of the dark ages is the introduction of the thumb screw and the rack.

The Malachys persisted to the last in defiance of light and reason, in their efforts to prove that Miss Tibbitts was the young woman for whom they were looking, and they engaged a criminal lawyer who exchanged his ingenuity in efforts to entangle her into contradictions when she gave her testimony on the stand.

These disreputable tactics were worthy of the people who employ them, and of the cases in which they were employed.
