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Shipping Notes.

A Large Ship and Cargo—The ship Three Brothers, loading wheat at San Francisco on the 20th ult., had on board some 3,000 tons, and would require another thousand to complete her cargo.

Marshall, master, at New York on the 8th inst., from Bremen, reports having on the 20th ult., in lat. 47, lon. 42, met with a hurricane from S. to E., lasting 15 hours; which carried away masts and rigging, and in lat. 44, lon. 56, passed a vessel of about 1,000 tons waterlogged and abandoned; she had nothing standing except the stump of her foremast, which was painted white with black bands, and to which was attached a yard, painted black and cock-billed.

The bark Blanche Thomas—The hull and materials of the bark Blanche Thomas were sold at auction at Shelburne, N. S., by Messrs. Wm. Law & Co., on the 8th inst. I. E. Barker, Esq., and others were the purchasers for \$6,100. They are now making strenuous exertions to get the vessel off with the aid of a tug.

The bark G. G. Blyden, 565 tons, built at Digby, N. S., in 1868, has been sold at Dublin, private terms.

The brig Tropic Bird, 201 tons, was sold at auction at New York on the 7th inst., for \$5,150 cash.

Cabbage 80 cents to \$1.00 per dozen. A good show of beef was been scarce. Some nice pig received this week quickly brought 8 to 94 cents. The market was very lively and produce rapidly changed hands. The supply of roots is limited yet, and housekeepers have not commenced to lay in their winter stock.

SPECIAL to the Tribune. The Light Fantastic Too Tripped in the Exhibition Building—The Two-Forty Seven Race—A Deliberate Swindle—St. John Sports in Trouble.

FREDERICTON, Oct. 11.—The Exhibition Palace floor and galleries, were full last night with the youth, beauty, old age and tightness of Fredericton and other places. The music was good. There was rather too much dust for comfort. The dancing was kept up until midnight. The affair was so very successful that it was determined to try another hop to-night.

After careful inquiry into the secret history of the two-forty-seven race, and from the talk of the men who gave and the men who got the money, I am fully satisfied that the rolling and depraved Nellie Young of a heat, and gave the race to Golding's Queen, was an unmitigated and previously arranged fraud. There is not the slightest doubt the whole management of the race is as rotten as a carrion carcass under a tropical sun. I know that Queen would have got first money and Gipsy Queen second, no matter which horse trotted fastest. Disgrace is no name for the general feeling. The horses that were to have trotted with Andy in the thirty-two race went home this morning. Bunting was urged to put Lady Sussex in the two-forty race, but he said he was afraid to have anything more to do with the cut-throat gang.

Last night was the first night since the exhibition opened. The corruption of the race course seemed to have got into the people and demoralized them. Almost the whole night there were crowds at the street corners, and noises in all quarters. At eleven a party of St. John boys came out of Mag. Davis's, and still further showed their contempt for virtue by striking John Virtue in the mouth. They went down street making considerable noise, and were interfered with by Grave Digger Craig—special policeman—and they took his cane and beat him severely. Philip Mulligan and several assistants were soon on the war-path, and found three of the men in Magdalen's school. They bolted through the back door, across lots and over fences, and the policeman after them. They were caught on one of the fences, handcuffed and led away. A great crowd gathered, and an attempt at rescue was made. Mulligan and his men were firm as Wellington's Infantry, and guarded their men. One of the prisoners shouted for a revolver, and a man who is said to have been given a pistol by one of the party who had escaped arrested rushed in. THE GERMAN EMPEROR with a suite of fifty persons is expected at Vienna the 16th. The visit is intended to be quiet and there will be little or no festivities.
