

The Demand for Positical Change—
A Maritime University.

Certain publicists seem to be unnecessarily anxious for a change in the status of the Maritime Provinces, their union into one being the panasees for all the real and imaginary ills they now endure. There is also a demand for a union of Provincial Colleges into a Maritime University. This demand springs partly from the natural itch for change, and is partly owing to the recently-develop
