## NEW SCHEDULE BEING PREPARED

I C R Trainmen Will Short-  
ly ask Increase  
of Pay  
**CHANGE NEEDED**

With a view of asking for an increase of pay, the Board of Adjustment, representing the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen on the I. C. R., are preparing a newschedule which will be held before the I. C. R. Board of Management in the near future. The members of the Board of Adjustment will probably be in session here the greater part of this week. It is not the intention to meet the I. C. R. Board of Management, but a conference will likely take place in the very near future after the new schedule has been finally agreed upon by the B. of R. T. The old schedule regulating the wages of the I. C. R. trainmen has been in force some years, and the men believe that they are now entitled to another advance especially in view of the increase in the cost of living since the former schedule came into effect.

## PROPOSED CHANGE CORONATION OATH

The Declaration as Amend-  
ed Submitted to Parlia-  
ment by Premier  
**SLIGHT OPPOSITION**

London, June 25.—In the commons yesterday Mr. Asquith said he hoped the declaration bill would be regarded as uncontroversial. The present declaration could not fairly be offensive, not only to Catholics, but also to the Sovereign. They were opposing a substitute declaration which, instead of singling out for repudiation a cherished doctrine of the Roman Catholic church, affirmed that the sovereign was faithful. Lord Chesham moved the first reading which carried 385 to 42, of the declaration bill last evening. Premier Asquith introduced the bill in a crisp, lucid style, briefly surveying the history of the declaration.

## CANADA-NEW ZEALAND LINER WRECKED.

Montreal, June 25.—Another vessel went ashore this evening on the lower St. Lawrence river when the Aetoli, of the new Canada-New Zealand line, ran aground at Martin River, 250 miles below Quebec.

It was the first voyage of the Aetoli to Montreal, this being the opening season of the new line.

## MARITIME THEATRE

**CIRCUIT FORMED.**  
All Attractions Booked Will go the Round of the House-Managers From All Sections Present at Montreal Meeting.

A number of maritime theatre managers held a meeting at the Brunswick Hotel in Montreal Tuesday evening for the purpose of organizing a maritime circuit, with a view to securing better bookings and putting the different theatres on a better basis. Those attending the meeting were: Managers McAdam, Sydney (N. B.); McConnell, Academy of Music, Halifax; Anderson, St. John Opera House; Simpson, Amherst Auditorium; Dunlop, Campbellton; Russell, Newcastle; Skidd, Chatham, and Torry, Winter, Davidson, and Perry, the four local theatre managers.

Mr. McAdam has just returned from New York, where he was interviewing the theatre managers and booking houses with a view to securing high class attractions for provincial theatres. It was decided by those present at tonight's meeting to form a circuit, which means that all attractions booked in the province will go the round of the houses in the association. The visiting theatre managers were entertained by the local managers tonight.

We are pleased that the local manager is taking an interest in this matter and hope to see some high class attractions come to this circuit.

## ATTEMPTED TO WRECK TRAIN

Two Obstructions Placed  
on I C R Track Near  
Dorchester  
**NARROW ESCAPE**

Dorchester, June 25.—Two persistent and dastardly attempts were made here yesterday near Palmer's Pond crossing at train wrecking. The accommodation No. 83 which was running at its usual speed struck a gate and some boards that had been placed in a way to seriously obstruct the railway traffic. The pilot of the engine, however, easily cleared the obstruction. A train following No. 83 ran against a more serious obstruction in almost the same spot. This time two large three-inch deals were placed in a braced position. The driver slowed down and the run-off was narrowly averted. I. C. R. officers (Sgt. Macdonald and Mr. J. J. Murphy) were in town and at least one party is under the eye of the police and an arrest is likely to soon follow. The affair has created quite a sensation in Dorchester.

## COUPLE NABBED ON MURDER CHARGE.

New York, June 25.—J. B. McCosh, Chief of Police at Middletown, Conn., today sent to police headquarters a telegram announcing the arrest in Middletown of a man supposed to be John J. Murphy, charged with the murder in New York and the woman, who accompanied him. A detective was sent at once to Middletown. Murphy is charged with complicity in the shooting and killing of Frederick Devlin, of Oakland, Cal., in a Bowery hotel on Feb. 18, Wm. J. Duffy is now in the Tombs waiting trial in connection with the crime.

Two men and two women entered the hotel early in the morning and demanded money of Devlin. When he handed over the cash he was shot down, and then a clerk, James Desmond, was beaten with revolver butts and robbed. Duffy was arrested on June 20, charged with being one of the men who killed Devlin, and a general alarm was sent out for Murphy and the women.
