WEST DIVISION COURT.

A Large Doctee and Some Long Cases.

A Lot of Judgments Delivered.

Court opened this (Tuesday) morning. His Honor Judge Reynolds presiding.

The case which occupied the most time was that of Ruth Riley v. Wm. Hillis - W. A. Everts for plif.; A. A. Fisher for def.

A jury was empanelled, composed of Thos. Berry, S. Scriver, Niblock, Adol. Brown, and Stearns Rowson. This case was a sequel of a suit tried at last court, in which the plif. sued def. for violations of the terms on which he leased a farm from the Hillis. Hillis set up a counter claim, and the result of it all was a verdict of \$15 for plif. Def. being dissatisfied with the finding of the court, sought and obtained permission for a rehearing of the case. Mrs. Riley appeared at the rehearing, but she did not asked for enough on the former occasion and had entered a new suit against def. The court decided to merge the two cases together.

Plif. Mrs. Riley, was sworn and deposed that she never gave def. permission to remove straw. Lease was surrendered by mutual consent. Def., in violation of lease, removed five loads of straw before the trial and six loads since. He also cut, stacked, fencd posts, and scaffold posts, and damaged a maple grove. He had brought back six loads of manure. Plif.'s evidence was lengthy and similar to that given at former trial. Mahlon Wilite, Henry Davis, Wm. Kelly, Ira M. Kelly, Wm. Mott, Irwin Wilite, Albert Wilite and Arvin Judson were also called by plif. The evidence given by these witnesses was in the main corroborative of that given by plif.

Wm. Hillis, def., deposed that he had conversations with plif. about leaving the farm, in the presence of H. Davis at one time, and Phillip Roberts at another time. He deposed that he told him that he had purchased a farm and that witness could take the straw. When he was moving plif. forbade him taking the straw. The manure he had drawn to Mrs. Riley's were good loads and good stock. Fence posts, wood, was cut on plif. one load and kept one himself. The posts were also cut on shares, and Mrs. Riley's share was left on the farm. Of the two ash trees felled, he thought of one, but that was still on the farm. Did not think the three maple trees cut made half a cord of wood, value, \$1 a cord. The milk and cook house were not finished by plif. according to agreement.

John Wilite, Jas. Wilite, Phillip Roberts, Morton Wilite and Sheldon Y. Brown testified as to the value of the wood, etc., removed by def.

Mahlon Wilite, Albert Wilite and Henry Davis were called in rebuttal, and will be called by plif. by their evidence that Hillis was allowed \$5 for finishing milk house, that Mrs. Hillis had remarked that it was a good place in which to keep milk, and that the loads of manure drawn by def. were very good.

The jury after a long deliberation, returned a verdict for \$8.75, being \$6.25 less than the amount awarded at the former trial.

Sterns Ramsom and Chas. Rowson v. S. Jackson - The plaintiffs in this case purchased 80 lambs and 1 ram from def., paying thereon the sum of \$5. They were to take the lambs away before snowfall. On Oct. 20, plif. went for the lambs but def. would not allow them to take them. They paid \$5 for keeping them after the time def. claimed they were to be removed, which he swore was to be within three weeks after the purchase was made. Verdict for plif. for \$13.10, damages and costs.

Ross and Wilite v. Fred Rockwood - Judgment summons. Ordered to be committed for fifteen days.

Massey Manf. Co. v. Jos. Moulton - Judgment summons. Ordered to pay \$1 per month.

Geo. W. Beach v. Arch. Wilite - Judgment summons. Committed to jail for 10 days.

H. H. Arnold v. O. L. Mott - Judgment summons. Committed to jail for 15 days.
