Then they had asked the Assesment Commissioner the value of the property included in the agreement and proposed to be handed over to the railway companies. A reply was received placing the total amount at \$292,350.

The proposition to construct a bridge across John street met with considerable opposition from Chairman Boustead. The idea is to build the bridge across the labyrinth of rails and thence to the waterworks by means of a ramp. The schemic was opposed by Ald. Boustead mainly on the ground that it would be necessary to extend the structure 400 feet south in order to give it the required level.


