







LOST ON THE PRAIRIE.

A Young English Girl Tormented by Mosquitoes and Poisonous Insects. (Saskatoon Times.) Last Friday Miss Lillie Manswell of Stony Creek, and lately from England, wandered away from her home in search of berries and became lost.

The principal entrance will be from Front-street, where the passenger will buy his ticket and have his baggage checked. The baggage will be carried by an elevated passage-way over Union-street, the waiting room and the station to the train-shed, where it will be loaded to the grove that by the elevators. In like manner the passenger will be taken to the waiting room, large, airy and well lighted, and will be received by the station staff.

Besides the front-street entrance, there will be ground entrances from York and Union-streets.

Mr. Strickland, the architect, expects the south building, a train-shed, will be completed by Christmas.

This latter building will be constructed entirely of steel and iron, and will be the best of its kind in America. The material to be used for building purposes is arriving rapidly, and it is expected that in a few days everything will be under way. A temporary track has just been laid out on the north side of the present station to bring in supplies.

It is estimated that the new building will cost not less than half a million dollars. It will be a massive structure and will contain many features of architectural beauty.
