NOTES.

The new 5c. British Honduras has 'Postage & Revenue' in side labels.

The Malta 1/2p. and 1p. surcharged 'Revenue' are probably the forerunners of a new 'Postage & Revenue' type.

The Orange River Colony 1/2p. green is found once in each sheet of 240 without period after 'Colony.' The 1st vertical row of 10 stamps in the right lower pane has the E of 'ORANGE' quite noticeably out of line (lower) with the other letters. The ½p. green was overprinted with same setting as was used in surcharging the 21/2p. blue Cape, and the latter shows the same varieties.

One stamp in each sheet of Perak 32. on 502, is without a period after 'cent.'

There seem to have been four settings

of the Orange River Colony V. R. I. overprint. The 1st setting has level periods, and was applied to the 1/2p., 1p., 2p., 21/2p. on 3p., 3p., 4p., 6p. rose, 6p. blue, 1s. and

5s. The 3rd stamp in the 10th row of each pane has no period after V.

Early printings of the 1st setting show several errors which were corrected at an early date.

Double surcharge, ½p., 3p. V. R. I. omitted, 1p., 6p. blue. I. omitted, ½p., 1p. No period after I, 1/2p. Value omitted, 1p. Wide space between 1 and s, 1s. Figure of value omitted, ½p., 1p.,

Broad figure 3, 3p. Letter d'omitted, 1p. Raised period after s, 1s.

Comma after s, 1s.

бр. rose, бр. blue, 1s.

The 2nd setting has raised periods, and was applied to all values except the 21/2p. and 6p. rose. It shows the following varieties in the periods:

V. R. I., 7th row, 4th stamp. V. R. I., 9th row, 4th stamp. V. R. I., 6th row, 5th stamp. V. R. I., 10th row, 4th stamp.

In the 3rd setting seven stamps in each pane have a thick V. We have not seen it stated what values this setting was applied to.

In the 4th setting SIX stamps in each pane have a thick V: 1st row, 2nd stamp; 3rd row, 2nd stamp; 4th row, 2nd stamp; 7th row, 4th stamp; 8th row, 1st and 4th stamps. The 6th stamp in the 10th row has one level period, V. R. I. This cetting was used for the 1/2p. and 1p., and probably for the 2p., 3p., 6p. and 1s.

The 4th setting was reversed when applied to the 5s., so that the order of the thick V's was changed as follows: 1st, 3rd and 4th rows, 5th stamp; 7th row, 3rd stamp; Sth row, 3rd and 6th stamps. Perhaps it would be clearer to call this the 5th setting, as it appears to have been used for the 6p. as well as the 5s.

There is another arrangement of thick V's, of which we have not seen a whole pune, and can locate only two of the six These are 5th in 9th row and 4th stamps. in 10th row. There is none in 1st row.

Of the later settings we have several varieties we have not seen in a pane:

No period after V, ip. No period after R, 1p. No period after I, 1/2p., 17.
