REPORT SPECIAL COMMITTEE *RE* REGISTRY OFFICE.

To the Warden and Councillors of the County of Welland in Council assembled :

Your Special Committee appointed at the January Session of the present year, for the purpose of obtaining information relative to the purchasing of a site, and the erection thereon of a New Registry Office, beg leave to submit this their report.

Your Committee directly after the January Session, caused a notice to be inserted in the local papers, asking for tenders for lots for Registry Office, and the result of such notice was the receiving of the following tenders, viz:—

No. 1. S. W. Buchner, lot corner of Muir and Griffith streets,
Price \$1500.

" 2. Edward Henderson, lot 23 or lot 24, on South side of Division street, at \$200 each, or 70 feet square out of the 2 lots for \$250, or 70 feet running to rear of the lot, \$300.

" 3. David Tufts, part lot 18 South side of Division street 70x70 for \$500, or a part of lot 18, South side Division street corner lot 50x70 for \$450.

Your Committee would recommend that the lot of Mr. Asher be accepted at price offered him by resolution while in Committee of whole viz : \$1500—providing always that the lot be accepted by the Government, as the most suitable and convenient, being corner lots and nearest the County Buildings, which advantages are particularly mentioned in the Government Specifications under "selection of site."

Your Committee caused to be inserted in County papers, also in the Daily Globe and Mail, notice of receiving tenders for the erection of a Registry Office, according to Plans and Specifications furnished by the Government, and the result of such notice was the following tenders :

Your Committee, after receiving the above tenders according to notice up to the 1st April, inst., did on the 19th inst., receive from Nelson Carter, the lowest tenderer above mentioned, a communication stating that in making out his tender, he had overlooked some part of the work, which would make a difference in his tender of \$450, which sum added to the amount of his tender of \$3924 would equal \$4374, which sum he proposes to take the contract for and complete the same according to plans and specifications.

Your Committee would say that considering the position of the tenders at present, with Mr. Carter's increase, they do not consider, in justice to the other tenderers, that the tender of Mr. Carter should be considered,

And your Committee would therefore recommend the tender of Mr. Vanderburgh being accepted, providing the contract is let.

The sureties for Mr. Vanderburgh your Committee consider good—the names being James H. Price and A. Williams, both of Welland.

Your Committee would suggest that Prison labour be used when possible.

Your Committee have since the January Session had an opportunity to get full information in reference to the erection of a Registry Office, and in the interests of the County, have recommended that this present special session be held for the purpose of coming to a final conclusion in reference to a new Registry, also thinking that if built the time intervening between the June Session and the Fall, would be quite insufficient in the interests of the County, to complete the building.

Your Committee considered also the fluctuation in price of material to be used in building, and a month or so hence might make a very great difference to a contractor and in the interest of the County.

Your Committee also consider to have the building erected during the summer months would be of the very greatest importance to avoid any dampness in walls when occupied, as for the Records to become damp and mouldy would be a very serious matter.

Your Committee would suggest that every attention be paid to drainage; as if a lot is purchased, money expended in drainage is well invested and absolutely necessary in erecting a building for the purpose anticipated.

Your committee would further recommend if the building is gone on with, that a first class practical man be employed to oversee the work, and also the drainage, that every part may be done in a way that will give entire satisfaction for the large expenditure, and will not require continued repairing in which the County have had a very large experience.

Your Committee incurred expense in advertising "Notices for Tenders" in the Globe and Mail, amounting to \$16.50, which sum

plans and specifications in order that the whole matter may be submitted at the June Session.

WELLAND GAOL *RE* PROPOSED RECONSTRUCTION OF SOUTH WING.

OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR OF PRISONS
AND PUBLIC CHARITIES OF ONTARIO,

It is that portion which refers to the proposed reconstruction of the South Wing of the Gaol. Will you be good enough to bring to the notice of the Committee of the Council my recommendations and let me know what action is taken.

Extracts from minutes of Inspection of Welland Gaol, dated March 18th, 1880.

"Since the 1st October, the large number of 227 prisoners have been in custody in this Gaol, and on some occasions as many as 50 at one time."

"If this unusually large Gaol population is to continue, it is quite evident that more extended accommodation must be provided for the proper confinement and classification of the various kinds of prisoners."

"This increased accommodation apparently can only be obtained by the reconstruction of the South Wing of the Gaol, one of the corridors in this wing having been partially fitted up, is at present occupied by female prisoners, but an examination of the lower corridors and the foundation seems to prove that it is in a dangerously dilapidated condition, and that its continued occupation might result in a serious accident."

"Under these circumstances the wing will either have to be abandoned entirely, or reconstructed, as a proper place for the confinement of the female prisoners must be provided, and in view of the largely increased number of prisoners now committed to this Gaol, the undersigned thinks that beyond all doubt the wing must be reconstructed. He therefore makes the following recommendation for the consideration of the County Council, viz :

1st. That the female prisoners, now in the middle ward of the South Wing, be removed to the rooms in the Court House building, such rooms to be fitted up for their reception and bars placed upon the windows thereof "

2nd. "That a thorough examination be made by a competent architect of the external walls of the wing.

3rd. That if the architect reports favorably of the strength of the walls above referred to, that a gang of prisoners be placed at work to remove the interior cell structure and walls and to clean the old material ready for use in the work of reconstruction."

4th. That when the wing is thus prepared for reconstruction, ten-

ders be solicited for the work of rebuilding the interior in the same manner as the North Wing, with the following exceptions viz:

"The partition walls to be built of brick, but the jambs of the corridor and cell doors must be of cut stone, the windows looking into the gaol yard to be enlarged, the others to remain as they are. The cells need not be arched in brick but roofed with joists and oak plank covered with boiler plate."

"If these suggestions meet with the approval of the Council, sketch plans embodying them could be prepared and submitted to the Inspector for his further recommendations. The expense of carrying out proposed reconstruction, if the prison labour be properly utilized, would not be large, and it would be lessened to the County by the payment of the balance of the \$6000, for gaol repairs to which they would be entitled under the provision of the Inspection Act, when the work was completed.
