Future of South Africa. Ten Thousand Miles of Sea Traversed in 37 Days to Get to Colony. Story of one who took the trip.

Cape Town, Jan. 30.—(From Our Special Correspondent.)—If either Columbus or Drake could return for the marvelous developments that have taken place since their day, both on sea, as on land, in the way of transportation, they would be filled with wonder and amazement. Indeed, there are even in this our century thousands of our own countrymen who know next to nothing of the greatly improved facilities for traveling that obtain to-day.

The centenarian stands aghast when told that, in this our day, over 10,000 miles of sea can be traversed in comparatively easy and safe in less than a week. We can recall the time when, 37 days, the ocean was considered a most dangerous undertaking, but to-day, how many there are who go down to the sea in ships! Let us take as a typical instance the Atlantic steamer, Tunisian, which sailed from Halifax on Dec. 8. There were over an aggregation of nationalities found on any one vessel. There were German and Polish Jews, Swedish, Norwegian, Finns, French, Italian, Dutch, Spanish, Roumanians, all intermingled, to the extent of some 400 souls. These were all comfortably housed and fed with that regularity which always marks life on board ship.

That the energy and resources of the kitchen staff were taxed to the utmost is certain, and yet it is fair to say, never was a more contented crowd assembled together. The journey from Halifax to Liverpool was an uneventful one, save that the good ship was washed with the fury of the storm, and passengers and crew alike were on the alert, after leaving Mobile, especially in passing through the "Devil's Hole" on the Irish coast, indeed, the same night, a vessel out of Bristol was wrecked with a loss of 14 hands.

But the voyage of nine days was as nothing compared with the long journey from London to Cape Town. If the Tunisian carried a mixed crowd, what shall be said of the passenger list of the Cape Colony.

What has been said of the steamer goes to the truth of nearly every vessel leaving England since the conclusion of the war, and it certainly would seem time that those who, by mistaken philanthropy, are actively engaged in this wholesale transportation of almost destitute people, should recognize that not only are they doing positive harm to those they seek to benefit, but also that they are doing positive harm to those who are responsible for laying the foundations of a "United South Africa" on a sound and permanent basis more and more daily.


