

hamilton, Tuesday, 4th Jung 1850

The Synod of the United Presbyterian of the in Canada met, and after sermon by the Moderator, the Rev. David Caw, from Jer. xxIII. 5, was constituted.

It was reported by the Presbytery of London Reports of Lonthat they had ordained Mr. John Logie, Pastor don Presbytery. of the Congregation in Stanley, on the 2nd day of December last; and that on the 31st October last they had inducted the Rev. ANSWER TO THE FIRST REASON. Mr. Fisher has repeatedly declared that heres to the doctrines of the United President Church; and at the time of his withdraw member of the court had given any expression of his views upon "the atonement of our Lord Jesus Christ": and it was therefore impossible for Mr. Fisher to know that his opinions were different upon this doctrine from those of the "majority of this court."

ANSWER TO SECOND REASON.

Our answer to this reason is the same as to the foregoing. This Court has never given any specific declaration of its views on the duties of Ministers of religion, and it is therefore impossible for Mr. Fisher to know whether they are "defective and false" or the contrary.

ANSWER TO THIRD REASON.

No answer to this reason is deemed necessary; we leave it to the Church and the world to judge.
