MINUTES OF THE ELEVENTH SESSION  
OF THE  
SYNOD OF THE UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH  
IN CANADA, &c.

---

Hamilton, Tuesday, 4th June 1850.

I. SEDERUNT,—7 o'clock, p. m.

The Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after sermon by the Moderator, the Rev. David Caw, from Jer. xxiii. 5, was constituted.

The Roll was called and the Minutes of the last Session of Synod were read.

It was reported by the Presbytery of London Reports of Lon- that they had ordained Mr. John Logie, Pastor don Presbytery. of the Congregation in Stanley, on the 2nd day of December last; and that on the 31st October last they had inducted the Rev. Wm. Howden into the Pastoral charge of the Congregation in Adelaide. The Presbytery of Flamboro' reported, that on the 3rd October last, they had Flamboro', ordained Mr. William Christie, Pastor of the Congregation in Chippewa. The Presbytery of Toronto reported that they had inducted the Toronto. Rev. John Duff, to the Pastoral charge of the Congregations of Albion and Vaughan, on the 2nd and 3rd days of October last: that on the 23d day of last October they had ordained Mr. Wm. Ormiston, Pastor of the Congregation of Newton; and that they inducted the Rev. John Ewing into the Pastoral charge of the Congregation in Emily, on the 19th day of December last: Their names having been added to the Rolls of their respective Presbyteries, were thereupon added to the Roll of Synod.

On motion, the name of the Rev. Peter Muir of Messrs. Muir and the Presbytery of Canada East was added to the Henderson added, Roll, with intimation that his connexion with this Synod be dated from the time of his Ordination, viz.: the 19th October 1848. The name of the Rev. Alexander Henderson of the Presbytery

of Canada East, was also added to the Roll. The Presbytery of Flámboro' further reported that on the 7th day of May last the Rev. J. R. Dalrymple demitted the charge of the Congregation in Hamilton; and that his name had been taken from the Roll of Presbytery. It was then taken from the Roll of Synod.

The Rev. Alexander Kennedy of Port of Spain, Trinidad, and the Rev. Messrs. Andrew Kennedy, McCurdy and Scott, being present, were invited to correspond and take their seats in Synod.

The Rev. Alexander Ritchie, was now chosen Moderator.

Com. of Bills and Overtures.

Appointed Messrs. Dick, John Proudfoot, Muir, and Barrie, a Committee of Bills and Overtures, to meet here to-morrow morning at 8 o'clock; Mr. Barrie, Convener.

Committee on Accounts.

Appointed Messrs. Porteous and Coutts, a Committee to audit the accounts of the Treasurer.

Devotional Exercises.

Appointed Messrs. Duff and Muir, together with the Moderator, to conduct the devotional exercises of the Synod to-morrow forenoon.

Presbyteries' Minutes.

Appointed the following Committees to examine the Minutes of Presbyteries, viz., Messrs. John Proudfoot and Skinner, to examine the Minutes of the Presbytery of Flámboro',—Messrs. Coutts and Waddell, the Minutes of the Presbytery of London,—and Messrs. Henderson and Caw, the Minutes of the Presbytery of Toronto.

Distribution of Preachers.

Appointed Messrs. Barrie, Coutts, and John Proudfoot, a Committee for the distribution of Preachers; Mr. Barrie, Convener.

Adjourned to meet here to-morrow morning at 9 o'clock.

Closed with prayer.

The Synod met, and was constituted by the Rev. Alexander Ritchie, Moderator.

Devotional exercises were conducted by the Moderator, together with Messrs. Duff and Muir.

The Committee of Bills and Overtures reported the matters of business following, and recommended that the several subjects be taken up in the order in which they are stated:

1st. The business upon the Minutes.

2nd. Protest and Appeal against the decision of the Flamboro' Presbytery, by the Rev. George Fisher.

3rd. The Protest and Appeal by certain Members of the Congregation of Esquimaux against decision of said Presbytery.

4th. Overture on Statistics.

5th. Overture on Synodical Letter to Congregations.

6th. Overture on Correspondence between this Synod and the Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Scotland. The report was received and adopted.

Mr. Proudfoot reported from the Committee appointed at last meeting of Synod, to investigate into all matters regarding the Form of a Deed for Congregational Property. The Draft of a Deed for said purpose was read.

The report was adopted. Ordered that the Draft now read be forthwith printed under the direction of Mr. Dick; and that copies be sent down to Presbyteries and Sessions throughout our bounds for consideration, and that Sessions report their opinions to their Presbyteries, and that Presbyteries report the result, together with the opinions of Presbytery, to the next meeting of Synod.

The Committee appointed at the Seventh Serment of last Session of Synod "to consider the literary course to be pursued by Students previous to their being admitted to the Theological Institute"—stated that as yet they had not agreed upon a report: and gave reasons why the report was not ready.

The reasons were sustained, and the Committee enjoined to report during the present meeting of Synod.

Took up the Protest and Appeal of the Rev. Mr. Fisher's property of George Fisher against the decision of the Presbytery of Flamboro' in his case.

Read, the complaint of certain members of the Congregation of Esquesing against Mr. Fisher.—Also, the evidence in the case of Mr. Fisher taken before the Presbytery of Flamboro':—Also, a paper of adherence to the doctrines of our standards and agreement with the doctrinal sentiments of Mr. Fisher, from certain members and adherents of the Congregation of Esquesing.

Adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock.

Adjourned to meet at 6½ o'clock.

Mr. Coutts reported from the Committee to examine the minutes of the Presbytery of London that they had examined said minutes and found them accurately kept.

Minutes of Flam-  
boro' Presbytery.

Messrs. Skinner and John Proudfoot reported that having examined the Minutes of the Presbytery of Flamboro' recorded since last meeting of Synod, they found them kept in an accurate and orderly manner.

The Committee of Bills and Overtures reported an Overture (marked No. 16) on the distribution of Funds.

Plan of Supple-  
menting Stipend.

Messrs. Thos. Christie and Torrance, the Committee to draw up a plan as to the best mode of granting supplement to Congregations applying for aid from the Mission Fund, reported as follows, viz:

1. It is recommended that all applying Congregations make their applications through the Presbytery with which they are connected and that the Presbytery transmit the same to the Committee on Missions with their opinion and advice.
2. That the application be the result of a Congregational meeting regularly called, and that it be signed by the Chairman and Treasurer.
3. That the Treasurer of the Congregation be the person authorised to draw the supplement granted.
4. That the Committee of Missions have full power, in connexion with the Presbytery, to make any inquiries, which to them may appear necessary, into the statistics or State of the Congregation.
5. The Committee recommend that, so far as practicable, all applications be made in the months of June and January, so that the supplement may be paid on the first of July and February.

Mission Com'ittee

Agreed that the plans suggested in the Report of the Committee of Missions (see page 112, No. 2) regarding the constitution of said Committee is found impracticable owing to the distance of the Members, and should therefore be changed; and that in accordance with a previous motion, the committee be now composed of the following

persons, viz.: Messrs. Torrance, Porteous, Roy and Drummond, Ministers; Messrs. Thornton, Chisholm, and T. Sandilands, elders. Mr. Torrance, Convener.

Resumed the case of Mr. Fisher and the complainers of the Congregation of Esquimaux, appeal from the Presbytery of Flamboro'.

Heard the Presbytery of Flamboro' by Messrs. Porteous and Drummond, in reply to Mr. Fisher and in defence of their decision.

Appeals of Mr. Fisher and Presbytery of Flamboro'.

Heard the complainers, by their deputies Messrs. McNaughton & Stewart, in defence of their protest and appeal.

Heard the Presbytery of Flamboro' by Messrs. Barrie and Torrance, in reply.

Heard Mr. Fisher in explanation.

Heard the Complainers in explanation.

Parties were then removed and the Synod proceeded to give judgment.

The Roll was called and opinions of members heard until the hour of adjournment.

Adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock.

Closed with prayer.

#### VI. SEDERUNT.

*Same day and place, 2 o'clock, P. M.*

The Synod met and was constituted by the Rev. David Coutts, Moderator, *pro tem*.

Mr. Fisher's Dismission.

The Rev. George Fisher here laid on the table a paper announcing to Synod his retirement from this court and his withdrawal from all connexion with the United Presbyterian Church in Canada, of the following tenor:

"I hereby give up all connection with the United Presbyterian Church in Canada.

#### REASONS:

"1st. Because my views regarding doctrine, especially the atonement of the Lord Jesus, are essentially different from those entertained by the majority of the Ministers.

"2d. Because in my opinion their views regarding the duties of a Minister of religion are defective and false.

"3d. Because in my opinion the minds of the

majority of the Ministers are not well cultivated nor furnished.

G. FISHER."

Mr. Fletcher's Motion.

It was moved by Mr. Barrie, seconded by Mr. Roy, That Mr. Fisher's demission of connexion with our Church be received without the reasons given in to Synod.

Rev. Jno. Proudfoot's motion.

It was moved by Mr. Fletcher, seconded by Mr. Taylor, That Mr. Fisher's demission and the reasons accompanying it be received and that a Committee be appointed to answer the same.

Last Carried.

3. It was moved by Rev. John Proudfoot, seconded by David Christie, Esq., That the Synod do proceed with the case and take no notice whatsoever of Mr. Fisher's demission at present.

These several motions being put,—the last motion prevailed by a large majority.

Proceeded with the case and heard opinions to the end of the Roll.

Decision.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Fletcher it was Resolved, That the Synod dismiss the protests and appeals as ill-founded, and confirm the decision of the Flamboro' Presbytery.

Committee to answer Mr. Fisher's reasons of Demission.

It was resolved on motion of Mr. Thornton seconded by Mr. Barrie, That the decision of the Presbytery of Flamboro' being confirmed and Mr. Fisher having by his demission laid on our table while the case was pending, withdrawn himself from the discipline involved in the said decision, the Synod declare him no longer in connexion with the United Presbyterian Church; and appoint a Committee to answer Mr. Fisher's reasons of demission.

Dissent.

Messrs. Taylor and Ormiston were appointed a committee for the above purpose.

The Rev. Messrs. Roy and John Proudfoot and David Christie, Esq., craved that their dissent from the decision of Synod in the case be marked in the Minutes.

Minutes of Toronto to Presbytery.

The Committee to examine the Minutes of the Presbytery of Toronto reported that they had examined said Minutes and found them correctly kept.

Adjourned to meet at half-past 6 o'clock.  
Closed with prayer.

Same day and place, 6½ o'clock, P. M.

The Synod met and was constituted by the Rev. Alex. Ritchie, Moderator.

Took up an Overture from the Presbytery of Toronto respecting statistical reports, with a list of the necessary questions for such purpose. Overtures on Statistics.

After mature deliberation and some alterations made in those questions, the Schedule was adopted and ordered to be printed in the Appendix to the Minutes; and the necessary number of copies be furnished to congregations, to make up their report.

The Committee to answer Mr. Fisher's reasons of withdrawal from the United Presbyterian Church in Canada reported as follows: Answers to Mr. Fisher's reasons of Demission.

ANSWER TO THE FIRST REASON.

Mr. Fisher has repeatedly declared that he adheres to the doctrines of the United Presbyterian Church; and at the time of his withdrawing no member of the court had given any expression of his views upon "the atonement of our Lord Jesus Christ": and it was therefore impossible for Mr. Fisher to know that his opinions were different upon this doctrine from those of the "majority of this court."

ANSWER TO SECOND REASON.

Our answer to this reason is the same as to the foregoing. This Court has never given any specific declaration of its views on the duties of Ministers of religion, and it is therefore impossible for Mr. Fisher to know whether they are "defective and false" or the contrary.

ANSWER TO THIRD REASON.

No answer to this reason is deemed necessary; we leave it to the Church and the world to judge.

In reference to the minute of the third Sederunt of last meeting of Synod reflecting on the Presbytery of Canada East for not sending certain papers to the Synod;—having heard explanations from Mr. Taylor, it was now resolved that the said Presbytery was not to blame for such omissions. Presbytery C. East excused.

Took up an overture transmitted by the Presbytery of Toronto respecting Synodical Letter to congregations.

On motion of Mr. Jennings, seconded by Mr. Thornton, Messrs. Dick, and Duff were appointed a Committee to prepare, print, and circulate a letter in terms of the Overture.

Overture on Correspondence with the Home Synod.

Took up an Overture transmitted by the Presbytery of Toronto, regarding correspondence with the United Presbyterian Synod in Scotland.

In compliance with the recommendation of the Secretary of the Home Mission Committee, and in spirit of the above Overture; it was resolved that the Committee of Missions be enjoined to correspond as frequently as necessary with the Mission Board, in Scotland; and that said Committee be instructed to keep copies of their correspondence.

Treasurer's Salary.

On motion of Mr. Roy, it was unanimously agreed that Rev. Thomas Christie, have a salary as Treasurer of the Home Synod's Grant.

Messrs. Roy and Barrie were appointed a Committee to deliberate as to the amount of such salary, and to report to-morrow morning.

Adjourned to meet at 8½ o'clock.

On motion of Mr. Taylor, it was resolved that the Rev. Thomas Christie, the Treasurer of the Foreign Mission Fund, receive a salary of £10 per annum.

The thanks of the Synod were then given through the Moderator, to the Rev. Thomas Christie, for the zeal and diligence, and accuracy with which he has hitherto gratuitously performed the duty of Treasurer.

Thanks to Treasurer.

Took up the Overture anent the distribution of Preachers, of the following tenor:—

Overture on Distribution of Preachers.

That whereas, great inconvenience has resulted from the want of an authorized board for the distribution of preachers, during the intervals of Synod; and also from the present practice of taking a preacher off the list whenever he has received a call:—

It is hereby Overtured:

I. That there be appointed a Board, whose duty shall be,

(1.) To give appointments to any Preacher who may arrive in the country, or be received by any Presbytery, or be licensed during the interval of Synod.

(2.) To make a new distribution of Preachers on the Roll, whenever one of them shall have been appointed to a Pastorate, or in any way taken off the list.

II. It is also Overtured, that no Preacher shall be Ordained or Installed, till he have gone at least once, over all the Presbyteries.
