Dominion Parliament.

Special to Telegraph and Journal. OTTAWA, May 30.

In the Senate after recess the Pacific Railway Bill was discussed, and at ten o'clock the second reading was adopted without division.

In the Commons, after recess, details of the Pacific Railway scheme were discussed in Committee to a late hour.

Efforts are being made to agree upon a resolution which will be substituted for Chauveau's amendment. It expresses the regret of the House that the Act recently passed by the New Brunswick Legislature is unsatisfactory to a portion of the people of that Province, and hopes that at the next meeting of the Local Legislature it may be so modified as to remove all just causes of complaint.

They moved the amendment, of which he had given notice before recess. Dorian opposed it on the ground that it could accomplish nothing.

Blake argued that the sixteenth clause deprived Catholics of denominational teaching, secured them by law at the time of the Confederation. He denied the right of the Parliament to ask the Imperial Government to amend the constitution without having first obtained the assent of the Province to be effected by the change. He concluded by suggesting that the opinion of the Law officers of the Crown should be obtained as to the power of this Parliament to act in the matter.

Gray said if Blake's argument was correct, there was no necessity for this Parliament to interfere in the matter, as the Supreme Court of New Brunswick could decide the constitutionality of the law. He deprecated seeking the opinion of the Law officers of the Crown on Canadian questions.

Wallace supported the amendment, which was carried. Yeas 117; nays 42. Dorian moved to add the following words:—"And this House regrets that, to ally such well grounded discontent, the Governor General has not been advised to dissolve the act."

The Premier thanked Dorian for such a straightforward manner of putting vote of want of confidence. Anglin accused the Government of making a party question of it. The vote being taken, the motion was lost, Mackenzie and Blake voting with the Government, amid loud cheers. Yeas 58; nays 117.

Mackenzie moved a further amendment, declaring it expedient that the opinion of the Law officers of the Crown, and, if possible, of the Judiciary Committee of the Privy Council in England, be obtained as to the right of the New Brunswick Legislature to make a change in the School Act to deprive Catholics of rights enjoyed at the time of Confederation.

Carried on Division. House adjourned till Friday.

**The Upper Provinces.** OTTAWA, May 30. To-morrow being "Corpus Christi" and a Saturday holiday, the Public Department will be closed.

Four GARRY, May 29. It is rumored here that Governor Archibald is to be retained for six months. The "Selkirk" arrived on the 25th with one hundred and ninety tons of freight and forty passengers.

Emigrants are arriving almost daily; others in trains and boat loads were passed by the "Selkirk."

Toronto, May 29. The "Globe" has evidently given up Toronto for the coming elections, and is trying to make capital in the country by proposing a grant for harbor improvements.

The more practical of the Grit party are becoming alarmed at the prospect of Brown re-entering political life, in case the passage of Collier's Dual Representation Bill should result in Blake and McKenzie retaining their seats here.

The proposition that McKenzie should resign the leadership of Ontario and continue to lead the Opposition in the Commons, leaving Blake as the standard bearer here, appears to meet the views of the party generally.

**British and Foreign.** [By Telegraph to Associated Press.] LONDON, May 29. Montague Bernard, one of the members of the Joint High Commission, delivered a lecture last night at Oxford on the Treaty of Washington.

In the course of his remarks, he said circumstances had prevented his replying to the accusations made of carelessness and to a implicit reliance upon understandings on the part of the British members of the Commission.

The Speaker gave highest praise to American Government and people for the good temper displayed throughout the negotiations.
